Rotary was initiated in Nepal on November 20, 1958, when some visionary leaders met Dr. Shital Prasad Sinha of Rotary club of Darbhanga to form the Rotary Club of Kathmandu. The club was chartered on April 13, 1959 under R.I. District 325.

After five decades, Rotary International District 3292 was inaugurated in Nepal on July 1, 2008, following a formal presentation to RI President Gleen Estesse in New Delhi on August 6, 2004, persuation by Rotarian Ambassador to USA HE Kedar Bhakta Shrestha with the RI President



and the successful hoisting of Rotary flag atop Mount Everest on May 30, 2005 by three Nepali Rotaractors as a centennial gift to Rotary.

In 1995 visiting RI President Herbert Brown had promised His Majesty the King Birendra to grant Nepal a separate Rotary District after fulfilling certain conditions. Since then it took over a decade's time and efforts to materialize the dream of a separate Rotary District in Nepal by July 1, 2008.

Knowing more about the glorious past helps to take right decisions for a promising future; and remembering the visionary leaders who contributed greatly to shape Rotary will inspire the present and future leaders to contribute for the greater success of Rotary movement in Nepal.

This is the fifth edition of RI District 3292- At A Glance published since 2015 and in 2018, 2020 and 2022 for bringing in record the facts and figures about Rotary activities in Nepal. #### WHAT IS ROTARY?

"Rotary is an organization of business and professional persons united worldwide, who provide humanitarian service, encourage high ethical standards in all vocations and help build goodwill and peace in the world" (33 words 1976 definition)

Rotary is a grassroot organization with most of its service efforts being carried out at local club level. The District and the international structure is designed to support the clubs and help them to provide effective services in their local communities and aboard.

**Clubs:** Rotarians are members of Rotary Clubs, which belong to the global association of Rotary International (RI). Each club elects its own officers and enjoys considerable autonomy within the framework of Rotary's constitution and bylaws.

**Districts:** Rotary Clubs are grouped into 540 RI Districts, each led by a District Governor, who is an officer of RI. The District administration including assistant governors and various committees quide and support the clubs.

**Rotary International Board:** The 19-member RI Board of Directors, which includes the RI President and president-elect, meets quarterly to establish policies. Traditionally, the RI President, who is elected annually develops a theme and service emphasis for the year

**The Secretariat:** Rotary International is headquartered in the Chicago suburb of Evanston, Illinois, USA and has seven international offices in Argentina, Australia, Brazil, India, Japan, Korea and Switzerland. The office for RI in Great Britain and Ireland (RIBI) serves clubs and districts in that region. The secretariat's chief operating officer is the RI General Secretary, who heads a 740 members staff working to serve the Rotarians.

#### **Object of Rotary**

The object of Rotary, formulated in 1910, is to encourage and foster the ideal of service as a basis of worthy enterprise and in particular to encourage and foster:

First: The development of acquaintance as an opportunity for service

**Second:** High ethical standards in business and professions, recognize the worthiness of all useful occupations, and the dignifying of each Rotarian's occupation as an opportunity to serve society;

**Third:** The application of the ideal of service in each Rotarian's personal, business, and community life:

**Fourth:** The advancement of international understanding, goodwill, and peace through a world fellowship of business and professional persons united in the ideal of service.

#### **Avenues of Service**

Based on the Object of Rotary, Rotary has five avenues of service:

- Club Service focuses on strengthening fellowship and ensuring the effective functioning of the club.
- 2. Vocational Service encourages Rotarians to serve others through their vocations and practice high ethical standards.
- Community Service covers the projects and activities the club undertakes to improve life in its community.
- 4. International Service encompasses actions taken to expand Rotary's humanitarian reach around the globe and promote world understanding and peace.
- 5. New Generations Service recognizes the positive change implemented by youth and young adults through leadership development activities such as RYLA, Rotaract and Interact club service projects, and creating international understanding with Rotary Youth Exchange.

#### Rotary provides services in **Seven Area of Focus**:

- 1. Peace and Conflict Prevention resoultion.
- 2. Diesase Prevention and Treatment
- 3. Water and Sanitation
- 4. Maternal and Child Care
- 5. Basic Education and Literacy
- 6. Economic and Community Development
- 7. Supporting the Environment



# Rotary International A BRIEF HISTORY

The Rotary movement first started in 1905 in Chicago, USA. Rotary came to Asia in 1918 with the formation of the Rotary Club of Manila. Rotary was born in India with the formation of Rotary Club of Calcutta in 1919. Rotary Districts were established in 1912, but India, Burma, Ceylone, Malaysia, Java and Siam did not come into any District. It was, in fact, known as the IBCMJS area or the Middle Asia area and was governed by an Honorary Commissioner appointed by the Rotary International.

In 1931, India, Ceylone and Burma were formed into a provisional District – District A and FE James became the first District Governor, The first conference of this District was held in Calcutta in 1932 with a total registration of 39 delegates.

In 1936, the provisional District became a regular constituted District and was designated as District 89. The first Governor of District 89 was Sir Feroze Sethna of Rotary Club of Bombay. In 1939, District 89 was divided into two and the clubs in West Bengal were then in District 88 with Rtn. BT Thakur as the District Governor.

More clubs were born, more Districts were established. In 1959, they were renumbered with three digits. This District became District 325. Pakistan and Bangladesh continued to be a part of this District along with Burma and the North Eastern States of India. Nepal joined this District later in April 1959.

1984 saw a major reorganization of District. Bangladesh and Pakistan were made separate Districts. New districts were formed and District 325 became 329. In 1991, District numbers were changed to four digits and thus, District 329 became District 3290, comprising parts of West Bengal, Andaman & Nicobar Islands of India and the Himalayan Kingdom of Nepal.

#### **ROTARY MOVEMENT IN NEPAL**

#### THE BEGINNING

The idea of Rotary in Nepal germinated in mid-1958, when few visionaries including Dr. Jaya Narayan Giri (student of Dr. Shital Prasad Sinha), Mr. Gulab Harjani, Mr. Gopal Raj Bhandari, Mr. Manindra Raj Shrestha, Mr. Bishwa Nath Jajodia and few others met for the first time at Tripureswor residence of Dr. D. B. Dasgupta, the then royal physician and discussed the possibility of forming a Rotary club in Nepal. After about a month, a second meeting, again at Dr. Dasgupta's residence, on

November 3, 1958, was attended also by Dr. Shital Prasad Sinha, the then President of the Rotary Club of Darbhanga (India) and his friend from Burmah Shell Durbhanga, proposed other members including General Kiran Shumshere Rana as the Charter President, Mr. Jagadish Shumshere Rana as Charter Secretary and members including Mr. Himalaya Shumshere Rana as Vice President, Shiba Prasad Rauniyar, Mr. Indramani Rajbhandari, Mani Harsha Jyoti etc. Consequently, the Rotary Club of Kathmandu was formally inaugurated by the then King Mahendra Bir Bikram Shah as Patronin-Chief of the Club on November 20, 1958 at Royal Hotel, Kantipath while queen mother Ratna lighted 54 candles to mark 54th year of Rotary International.

The Rotary Club of Kathmandu was sponsored by the Rotary Club of Darbhanga (India) under Rotary International District 325 covering "the State of Bihar, Nepal, Pakistan - that portion including the province of East Bengal and Sikkim". http://www.rotaryfirst100.org/districts/districts/3290.htm

Dr. Shital Prasad Sinha (Classification: "Medicinal Education") was the Sponsoring Club's President and Rtn. Surendra N. Varma (Classification: Mineral Oil Industry, Oil Product Distributing) was the Governor's Special Representative (GSR) of Governor Rtn. Behram H. Engineer (RID 325) of Rotary Club of Dhanbad, India. The then Rotary International President Rtn. Clifford A Randall from Milwaukee, WI, USA had signed the Charter Certificate of the RC Kathmandu along with the then RI Secretary Rtn. George R. Means from Greenwood IN, USA signed and admitted to Rotary International on April 13, 1959. Past Governor of RID 325 Justice Raj Kishore Prasad brought the Charter and was presented to the Club in its 32nd Regular Weekly Meeting on June 28, 1959 at Nepal Army Headquarters in the presence of late King Mahendra BB Shah and 25 out of the 34 Charter members of the Club. In the meeting, PDG Raj Kishore said "Your Majesty, today's meeting is a historic meeting, which will be recorded in the golden letters in the annals of this District, nay, of the Rotary itself. It is the first time in the history of Rotary that the charter presentation meeting is being attended by the King of a country. It is, therefore, a matter of great pride and joy to us that Your Majesty should have taken the trouble to honor this occasion and being gracefully pleased to present the Charter to the Kathmandu Club." Thus, Nepal became the 111th country to have the presence of Rotary International.

Other members, who joined the Club later were: Rtn. Ranjit Kumar Ghosh, Rtn. Hulas Chand Golchha, Rtn. Dr. Jogendra Jha, Rtn. Mani Harsha Jyoti, Rtn. Indramani Rajbhandari, Rtn.Dr. Jaya Narayan Giri, Rtn. Arjun SJB Rana etc. in December 1960.

Retired General Kiran SJB Rana was the Charter President of the Club, serving for 4 years as club president. Rtn. Jagdish SJB Rana served as Charter Secretary and Rtn. Gopal Raj Bhandari as Charter Treasurer.

Nepal, thus, became the 111th nation to join Rotary, after 54 years since the inception of Rotary in February 23, 1905 in Chicago. USA. Rotary Club of Kathmandu was the first international service organization in this Himalayan country and 1620th Club to join Rotary International. It was in this meeting of Charter presentation on June 28,1959 that the Rotary Club of Kathmandu proposed a

school for the blinds, and with the permission of His Majesty, the then Prime Minister announced the establishment of a school for the blind in Nepal. Rtn. Dr. D.B. Dasgupta prepared a fund raising plan for the school to put a drama show with the troupe from Tagore's Sure Mandir Institute of Dance and Drama. The troupe performed two dramas "Shyama" and Chittarangada" during November 25 to 29, 1959 in Janasewa Cinema hall, Kathmandu.

The Club had no fixed venue for meetings. So, the King Mahendra granted 10 ropanis of land at Thapathali and some fund for Rotary building. On May 11, 1969 the existing Rotary building at Thapathali was inaugurated by the King Mahendra. Rotary International theme of the year "Help Shape the future" aptly shaped the future of Rotary in Nepal.

Rotary Club of Kathmandu sponsored four of the earliest Clubs in Nepal:

- Rotary Club of Biratnagar in August 1977 with PP Hulas Chandra Golchha as Governor's Spewcial Representative (GSR)
- 2) Rotary Club of Patan in 1985 with Rtn. Kamal Mani Dixit as GSR
- 3) Rotary Club of Kathmandu Midtown in 1989 with PDG Tehmas Manekshaw as GSR, and
- 4) Rotary Club of Kathmandu North in 1993 with PDG Tehmas Manekshaw as GSR

The first service project of the Rotary Club of Kathmandu a school for the blind at Kirtipur established in 1959. Later, the Club organized several Rotary projects focusing primarily on Health, Hunger and Humanity. A mega eye camp was organized on March 19, 1966, in the two huge tents erected at Tundikhel, Kathmandu, where 7,000 patients were examined and 600 operations were done. King Mahendra also visited the camp. A second eye camp was held in Thapathali in 1967 with the help of Ophthalmologists from Bir Hospital and Sitapur Eye Hospital, India and treated 5,218 patients, and 520 operations were done. Rotary Nepal's initiative for the "Gift of Sight" is still a much awaited annual activity, thus culminating to the establishment of an eye hospital in Hetauda. A children's park in Bhrikutimandap was initiated in 1981.

The Club worked in the eradication of Polio, first radio therapy unit established in Bhaktapur Hospital, first Cathlab in Bir Hospital and Saheed Gangalal hospital, establishment of Eastern Hospital at Biratnagar, first Maxillofacial center at National Dental Hospital, supplies of medial equipment, several ambulances at various areas.

Charter Treasurer Rtn. Gopal Raj Bhandari of RC Kathmandu was later honored by the Rotary International as the first recipient of Rotary's highest award "Service Above Self" in 2001 in recognition of his unparalleled contribution in the Rotary movement in Nepal. Rtn. Gopal Raj Bhandari dedicated himself for the establishment of a separate Rotary District for Nepal and died on February 17, 2008 at the age of 87 years only after hearing the Rotary International's decision to award a separate District 3292 for Nepal effective from July 1, 2008.

PP Tehmas R. Manekshaw of RC Kathmandu became the first District Governor of RI District 3290 from Nepal in 1996/97. He also became the highest contributor to the Rotary Foundation from Nepal till he died on 31st December 2010 at the age of 74 years.

#### HISTORY OF ROTARY DISTRICTS

Rotary Club of Kathmandu was sponsored by Rotary Club of Darvanga (India) of Rotary International District 325, which covered Bhutan, Burma, India - the States of Bombay, that portion east of longitude 80, (including the district of Jabalpur) and south the southern boundaries of the Districts of Panna, Satna, Shadol and Sidhi; Orissa, Bihar, West Bengal and Assam; and Manipur and Tripura, Nepal, Pakistan - that portion including East Pakistan; and Sikkim during 1959 –1976. RC Kathmandu was chartered with RI on April 13,1959 and Nepal became the 111th nation to join Rotary International.

In 1977, the District was renumbered as District 329, consisting of India (West Bengal, Assam, and the adjacent areas), Bangladesh and Nepal. In 1984, the District was reorganized and Bangaldesh and Pakistan were given separate District, and District 329 consisted of parts of India (Andaman and Nicobar Islands, Arunachal, Assam, Manipur, Meghalaya, Mizoram, Nagaland, Sikkim, Tripura, West Bengal) and Nepal.

In 1990 Rotary International District 329 became District 3290, covering parts of West Bengal (viz., Kolkata, 24-Parganas North, South, Bankura, Hooghly, Howrah, Murshidabad, Nadia, Paschim Medinipur, Purba Medinipur and Purulia); Andaman & Nicobar Islands and the Himalayan Kingdom of Nepal.



RC Kathmandu remained the only club in Nepal until 1977 when Rotary Club of Biratnagar was chartered after 18 years. Eight more clubs were established during 1978 to 1993 and in 1995 there were 12 Rotary clubs:

#### **A NEW ROTARY DISTRICT 3292**

In 1995 Rotarians of Nepal felt that Nepal should have a separate District for its further development. The visit of Rotary International President (RIP) Herbert Brown to Nepal in 1995 became a historic moment for the Nepalese Rotarians to aspire and try for a separate District. RIP Herbert met His Majesty King Birendra, who expressed Nepal's aspiration for a separate Rotary District. The RI President expressed his willingness to make concession for Nepal and agreed to allow a separate District, if Nepal could manage 25 Clubs instead of 40 as required at that time. This concession inspired the Rotarians and movement gained momentum.

Inspired by the positive response of RIP Herbert Brown, the Rotary Club Presidents of Nepal formed a Task Force in 1996, coordinated by Rtn. Yogendra Man Pradhan of RC Kathmandu Midtown to increase the number of Clubs and membership to meet the requirements for a separate District (45 clubs and 2,700 members then). The initial challenge was to increase the number of Rotary clubs from 13 to 45 and the number of members from 480 to 2700. The Rotary movement gained momentum during 2000 to 2004, when 46 new Rotary Clubs were chartered to a total of 66 Clubs, with 1,386 new Rotarians recruited to add up to 2,045 members by 2004. 20 new Clubs were chartered only in the year 2003.

Many Rotarians of Nepal and India have contributed to the formation of RI District 3292 in 2008, after 13 years long efforts. Rotarian Gopal Raj Bhandari, charter treasurer of Rotary Club of Kathmandu, the first club in Nepal devoted much of his life working hard to strengthen Rotary in order to establish Nepal District before he died peacefully on 17 February 2008 after the decision of RI Board to bifurcate RI District 3290 into RID 3292 for Nepal from July 1, 2008.



Three young Rotaractors of Rotaract club of New Road City (Moni Mulepati, Pema Dorje and Kami Sherpa) climbed Mount Everest to place Rotary flag on Top of the World on May 30, 2005 at 10:30 am and from there they conveyed the message to RI President Gleen Estesse in USA. The Rotary Centennial flag that was hoisted on top of the Mt. Everest was later handed over to him at Chicago Convention on June 25, 2008 as a centennial gift. Rotarian Ambassador of Nepal to USA HE Kedar Bhakta Shrestha had earlier met with RI President Gleen Estesse at Evanston, USA in January 2005 to convience him for a separate District for Nepal. It all impressed RI President Glenn Estess and helped the Rotary International to decide in its March 2005 Board meeting to grant a separate District 3292 for Nepal from July 1, 2008.



Rotary District 3290 India-Nepal was bifurcated into two Districts, District 3291 for West Bengal and Andaman Nicobar Island and District 3292 for the Rotary Clubs in Nepal with effect from July 1, 2008. The new District was inaugurated by the then Prime Minister of Nepal Mr. Girija Prasad Koirala in the presence of Past Rotary International President Rtn. Raja Saboo from India. Later in the year 2011-2012 Rotary Club of Jawalakhel sponsored Rotary Club of Thimpu, in Bhutan. In RI Convention held in

Bangkok during May 6-9, 2012 the RI District 3292 was declared as one of the top 15 Districts in the world. RI District 3292 now has 156 clubs, including the one in Bhutan. having involved in various community service projects.

#### **GROWTH OF ROTARY CLUBS & MEMBERS**

When the new Rotary District 3292 was started on July 1, 2008, the District had 67 clubs with 1,902 members. The Rotary International had required the District to increase the number of clubs to 75 or the number of members to 2,700 within a few years. So, the tempo for establishing new clubs and recruiting new members gained momentum. In the first Rotary year of the new District, 3 new members were chartered and achieved a net gain of 226 members. Within 3 years, by June 30, 2011, the number of clubs reached 76 and members reached 2,261. In subsequent years, the growth was gradual and steady until 2015/16, when 12 new clubs were added and a substantial 1,160 net growth in members to 4,164.




By July 1, 2023, the number of Rotary clubs has reached 154 active clubs with 5,492 members. This is a net decline in Rotary membership by 291 members over the previous year.

On February 23, 2024, a new Rotary club, names Kathmandu Heritage has been chartered with 23 ncharter members and by February 29, 2024 the number of Rotary clubs has thus reached 155 with 5,501 club members.

The highest number of Rotary clubs were chartered during Rotary year 2020/21 with 23 clubs, followed by 14 clubs in 2015/16 and 12 clubs in 2016/17



Rotary District 3292 Nepal- Bhutan has become one of the strong Districts in Rotary world with over 5,531 members in February 2024. The efforts to recruit new members were remarkable in 2015/16 (+1060 members), 655 in 2020/21 and so on.

Since the establishment of the new District 3292 on July 1, 2008, there has been substantial growth in the number of Rotary clubs, and the number of Rotarians. The number of female Rotarians has exceeded 1015 within the decade. Similarly, the growth of Rotaract Club, Interact Club and RCC in Nepal have been substantial during this period. So far, 12 Rotary clubs have been de-chartered for several reasons.

Membership in Rotary Clubs of Nepal has grown by leaps and bounds from 395 in 1995 to a hoofing 2129 in 2005 when Rotary International decided to bifurcate RI District 3290 into District 3291 for India and District 3292 for Nepal effective from 1st July 2008. Rotary membership has reached to 5,783 as of July 1, 2022 and to 5492 as of July 1, 2023.

#### **RECOGNIZED AS TOP 15 DISTRICTS OF ROTARY**

Rotary International District 3292 Nepal-Bhutan was been recognized as one of the Top 15 District of Rotary world in RI Convention held in Bangkok during May 6-9, 2012. At that time, there were over 530 Districts spread around 202 countries and territories in the world. This is one of the greatest honors Nepal has received from Rotary for the following reasons:

- Highest contribution to the Rotary Foundation of US \$ 333,988 from Nepal in Rotary year 2011-12
- 100% Clubs of the District contributed to the Rotary Foundation,
- High membership growth.

Later, in 2015/16 Public Relations activity in RI District 3292 was judged as Second Best in the South Asian region.

#### "SERVICE ABOVE SELF" AWARD

It is matter of great honor and pride that six Rotary Leaders of Nepal have so far been recognized by Rotary International with the Rotary's highest award "Service Above Self".

The first recipient of this highest Rotary award in Nepal is none other than the highly honored founder Rotarian late Gopal Raj Bhandari, the Charter Member of first Rotary Club of Kathmandu, in 2001. The second Rotarian receiving this award is PDG Dilendra Raj Shrestha of Rotary Club of Yala in 2008. The third recipient of the award is PP Ambica Shrestha of Rotary Club of Kathmandu Midtown in 2013. The fourth recipient of the "Service Above self" Award is the first District Governor of RID 3292 Dr. Tika Man Vaidya of Rotary Club of Patan West in 2015. The fifth receipant of the award is Rtn. Tirtha Man Sakya of Rotary club of Patan in 2017 and the sixth receipient is PDG Keshav Kunwar of Rotary club of Dhulikhel in 2020.

#### **WOMEN IN ROTARY**

Rotary was initially a all men's club and women were allowed to join the Rotary clubs after the Council of Legislation voted in 1989 to admit women into Rotary Clubs worldwide. This was the consequence of US Supreme Court ruling on May 4, 1987 that Rotary Clubs should not exclude women from membership on the basis of gender.

Rotary Club of Marin Sunrise in California, USA was the first Club chartered with lady members, and Rotary Club of Duarte,

California produced the first lady Rotary Club President. In 1995, eight women were elected to be the District Governors. PDG Carolyne E Jones from the USA was the first lady Trustee in the Rotary Foundation during 2005-09, and PDG Catherine Noyer-Riveau from France joined the Rotary International Board as the first lady RI Director during 2008-10. Rtn. Dean Rohrs from Vancouver, Canada was the first lady Vice President of Rotary International.

In Nepal some 1,072 women have taken Rotary membership in RI District 3292 Nepal-Bhutan by July 2022. The number declines to 1,015 in 2022-2023. In the past 18 years since July 2005, some 166 women Rotary members have served Rotary as Clubs, including 48 ladies served as Assistant Governors during the period.

Rtn. Dr. Suniti Acharya, presently at RC Jawalakhel, is the first woman Rotarian in Nepal since 1989 (in RC Kathmandu then). Similarly, Dr. Kanti Giri of the same Club is the first lady Charter President of a Rotary Club in Nepal in June 2003. Rtn. Jaya RL Shah of the same Club has become the first lady District Governor in the year 2016/17.

Women have added value in Rotary as members and have led progress focused on maternity health, women literacy, gender friendly school infrastructure and women sanitation (toilet) etc. "More Women, Better Rotary" is the slogan.

Women in Rotary are a great force in Nepal as anywhere else to achieve the lofty goal of Service Above Self and reaching out to the humanity in need of Rotary service. Nepal Rotarians already includes four lady Major Donors so far, contributing over US \$ 10,000 each to the Rotary Foundation, namely PP Ambica Shrestha of RC Kathmandu Midtown, PDG Jaya R.L. Shah of RC Jawalakhel, Rtn. Rajlaxmi Golchha of RC Biratnagar and PP Nabinita Rijal of RC Biratnagar Downtown. PDG Jaya R.L. Shah has also become Arch C Klump Society member in December 2016 by contributing \$250,000 to the Rotary Foundation.

#### **ASSISTANT GOVERNORS (AGs)**

Rtn. Jogendra Jha was the first Assistant Governor (AG) for Nepal in 1998/99 appointed by District Governor Rtn. Prabhat Kumar Rohatgi in Rotary year 1998/99.

In 2001/02 District Governor Siddhartha S. Bose divided the Rotary Clubs in Nepal into 4 zones and appointed 4 AGs. DG Amitava Mookharjee in 2002/03 appointed 10 Assistant Governors.

The number of Assistant Governor kept increasing to 12 in 2004-05, 17 AGs in 2010-11, 19 during 2012-13, 22 in 2014-15 and 26 in 2019-20. As the number of clubs increased to 150 and more in the last 4 yearst, the number of zones and Assistant Governors also increased to 40 in RY 2022-23 and 44 in 2023-24 to serve the 155 clubs in the District.

Geographic distance between clubs in the east and the western Nepal is so great that more number of AGs are required to serve the clubs at distant locations.

#### Contributors to the Rotary Foundation

In the past sixteen years since July 2008 till February 2024, Rotarians of RI D 3292 have contributed a total of US\$ 9.56 million to the Rotary Foundation. At present there are five AKS members in the District: Dr. Roop Jyoti, Charter President of RC Kathmandu Midtown, Dr. Harish Chandra Neupane of RC Chitwan, PDG Jaya R L Shah of RC Jawalakhel, Guru Pandita Anand (Rtn Lee Lam of RC Pokhara). and Rtn. Sashi Raj Pandey of RC Pashupati Kathmandu.

Rtn. Mithilesh Kumar Jha of RC Rajdhani has established a 100% Major Donor club: RC Central Butawal with 27 members. As DRFC, he has mobilized the highest contribution to the Rotary Foundation in 2019-20 of US\$ 2.1 million. This is the second highest level of contribution by a Rotary District in South Asia Zone 6 and 6th highest in the Rotary world.

The contributions to the Rotary Foundation are made in Annual Fund, Polio Plus fund, Endowment fund and Restricted and other fund. The data available since 2014-2015 indicates that the highest contribution in annual fund was made in 2016/17 (Rs. 360,167) and in restricted fund in 2019-2020 (Rs. 1,774,862). Half of the amount contributed in the annual fund is returned to the District after 3 years as District Designated Fund (DDF) and the other half goes to world fund for Global grants. Restricted funds are meant for a specific purpose specified by the donor.

The Rotary Clubs in the District are involved in various community and vocational service projects to serve the needy people of communities in Nepal and Bhutan. In this initiative, the Rotary Foundation has funded 678 global grant projects involving US \$ 27 million in the past twelve years. The District 3292 has thus received 3 times more fund than its contributions.

Rotary clubs of RID 3292 have served as international partner in 83 RI global grant projects worth US\$ 7,462,333 during RY 2019-20. Most of these projects are done in India, some related to Covid-19. The Rotary Foundation has approved 4 Covid-19 global grant projects worth US\$1.1 million in April and May 2020 to 3 clubs in Nepal and one in Bhutan. These projects will provide ventilators and incinerators to medical colleges and hospitals to fight the corona virus.

# Status of Grants in RI District 3292

(Reported by PP Siba Bhakta Rajbhandary, Grant Sub-committee Chair in January 2022)

The Rotary Foundation provides funds to Rotary clubs around the world to do service projects in communities through two types of grants: District Grant and Global Grant.

District grant funds small-scale, short term activities that address immediate needs in the community. Funding is from District Designated Fund (DDF). The Districts may apply for up to 50% of DDF for District Grants. RI District 3292 has been receiving district grant since 2014-15 and 85 clubs have done 183 projects for a total of \$ 248,223.

Maximum number of projects are in the area of basic education, followed by Water/sanitation, disease prevention, and community economic development. Global grant (GG) supports large international activities with sustainable, measurable outcomes in Rotary's seven areas of focus

In the last 8 years, RI District 3292 has done 213 GG projects for a total of \$ 18,788,372 (equivalent to Rs.2,254.6 million at the January 2022). This includes 11 COVID 19 related projects for \$ 1,642,148. In the order of fund allocation, priority

projects are in the focus areas of Disease Prevention and Treatment ,Water Sanitation and Hygiene, Basic education and literacy, Community Economic Development, Maternal Child and Health and Conflict Prevention and Peace building.

A New Development: Rotaract clubs can now receive district grant funds or global grant to support their service efforts in their own communities or abroad. Districts that are applying for their district grants can include Rotaract club activities in their spending plans. TRF suggests that Rotaract clubs start with district grants and then, when they have some experience managing such a project and applying for and reporting on grants, consider applying for a global grant. In this connection, we are happy to share that RID 3292 has already moved in this direction; a few district grant projects have active Rotaract involvement and a Rotaractor also serves as a member in District Grant Subcommittee.



Rotary Peace Fellowship scholarship is a prestigious program and it is a full time scholarship which involves a cost of more than \$80,000 for a Master's program and \$15,000 for Professional Development Certificate. Nepal has been awarded Rotary Peace Fellowship regularly.

Rotary Peace Fellowship 2024 has been awarded to one Nepali candidate, Mr. Nischal Kharal at Duke University, North Carolina , USA for Masters program.

After review and selection from nearly 600 eligible applications worldwide the Rotary Foundation has awarded 90 fellowships this year on November 1, 2023. Nepal had recommended six highly qualified candidates from diverse field and experiences. The District 3292 has been successful in receiving one to two scholarships each year.

# **POLIO CASE IN NEPAL**

Eradicating polio is Rotary's top priority since 1985. Rotarians have raised funds in excess of 1.2 billion in support by the time the world is certified polio-free and have provided hundreds of thousands of world is certified polio-free and have provided hundreds of thousands of volunteer hours. Partnering with the World Health Organization, UNICEF and US Centers for Disease Control and Prevention in this initiative, over two billion children under age five have received the polio vaccine, five million people who might otherwise be paralyzed are walking today, 500,000 new cases of polio are prevented each year, and the number of polio cases had declined by 99 percent world wide. Rotary International initiated a global Polio eradication drive since 1985, working jointly with the World Health Organization (WHO) and Center for Disease Control (CDC), USA.

Polio case in Nepal was first recorded in 1976 when 1 case was reported, as also in 1977. Two new cases were reported in 1999 and 4 new cases in 2000 and 2005, five cases in 2006 and 2007 and six cases in 2008 and 2010. No polio case was reported in 1998, 2001-2004, and 2009. Since 30 August 2010 no polio case is reported, and so Nepal is declared a Polio Free country by WHO in March 2014. World Polio Day is observed on October 24.

Polio Eradication and Endgame Strategic Plan 2013-2018 call for an important transition in the

vaccine used to eradicate polio and requires the removal of all oral polio vaccines in the long run. According to WHO, the world's success in eradicating polio depends on Afghanistan and Pakistan where 12 cases were reported in 2016, means the virus could spread across borders again and all countries should continue the drive.



# **FAMILY OF ROTARY**

(INTERACT, ROTARACT & RCC)

Due to the fast peace of Rotary movement in Nepal, especially since July, 2008, when the new District 3292 was started, the family of Rotary has also flourished in terms of the number of Clubs and members in Rotaract, Interact and RCCs in Nepal.

### INTERACT CLUB


Interact is Rotary International's service club for young people aged 12 to 18. Interact clubs are sponsored by individual Rotary club, which provide support and guidance, but they are self-governing and self-supporting. Clubs can be single gender or mixed, large or small. They can draw from the student body of a single school or from two or more schools in the same community.



Each year, Interact clubs complete at least two community service projects, one of which furthers international understanding and goodwill. Through these efforts, Interactors develop a network of friendships with local and overseas clubs and learn the importance of:

- Developing leadership skills and personal integrity,
- · Demonstrating helpfulness and respect for others,
- Understanding the value of individual responsibility and hard work,
- · Advancing international understanding and goodwill

As one of the most significant and fastest-growing programs of Rotary service, with more than 14,799 Interact clubs in 109 countries and geographical areas, Interact has become a worldwide phenomenon with more than 340,377 young people involved in it. World Interact Week is celebrated every year during the week of November 5 to mark the first Interact club founded in 1962. As of July 2023, there are 144 active Interact Clubs, 174 Rotaract Clubs and 127 RCCs in RI District 3292 Nepal-Bhutan.




Interactors of Nepal have organized the first international conference Act Asia in December 2017 with participants from countries including India, Bangladesh, Germany. The highest number of 28 new Rotaract clubs were registered in 2010/11, followed by 16 new clubs in 2011/12 and 22 each in 2018/19 amd 2019/20, thus reaching 176 Interact clubs registered in Nepal.

### **ROTARACT CLUB**

Rotaract is a service club sponsored by a Rotary club for young men and women aged 18 to 30 years. Rotaract literally means "Rotary in Action" are "Partners in Service" and a key member of the family of Rotary. They are either community or university based. Rotaract is thus Rotary's most significant and fast growing youth service programs, with over 175,735 members in 10,602 clubs in around 170 countries and geographic areas on June 16, 2020. The Rotaract movement was started on March 13, 1968.



In Nepal, Rotaract Club of Birgunj chartered on March 4, 1991, was the first Club with 31 members. Chitwan and Kathmandu Clubs were the second and third, established on May 11, 1994 and November 15, 1996 respectively. Rotaract movement became more active from 1997, when 4 new Clubs were chartered (namely: Yala, Dharan, Patan and Kathmandu Midtown). Since 2005 Rtr. Avash Piya led the Rotaract movement under RID 3290 as Associate District Rotaract Representative (ADRR). The first DRR was Rtr. Anil Shrestha in 2007-08, just before Nepal got a separate Rotary District 3292 in July 2008, when there were already 50 Rotaract clubs with 3,140 members under the leadershi of DRR Rtr. Rajan Piya. Highest number of 19 new Rotaract Clubs were chartered in 2016/17, 13 new clubs in 2011/12 and 2019/20, 9 clubs in 2006/07, 8 each in 2007/08, 2010/11 and 2102/13, 7 in 2015/16 and 6 each in 2002/03 and 2009/10. Consequently, by June 2017 Nepal Rotary had 120 Rotaract Clubs, which increased to 130 clubs spread between Kakarvitta in the east to Dhangadi in the west by June 30, 2017 with 4,694 members. Some 641 new Rotaractors were inducted in 2017/18. As of July 2021 the number of Rotaract clubs in Nepal increased to 169 (some of the clubs are not active). There are over 5,000 Rotaractors in the District with an average



age of under 25 years. Rotaract clubs of Nepal have completed some 1,307 service projects in the past 26 years. The number of Rotaractors has raised 5,339 by feb 2024.

On May 30 2005 three Rotaractors of RC New Road City (Moni Mulepati, Pema Dorje and Kami Sherpa) climbed Mount Everest under the Rotary Centennial Everest Expedition and hoisted Rotary International flag on top of the world as Nepal's gift to celebrate 100 years of Rotary since 1905. The flag was later presented to RI President Gleen E, Estesse on June 25, 2005.

The first DRR Anil Shrestha, who later joined a Rotary club, says that the spirit of Rotaractors is prospering high as 9 Rotaractors have already participated in Rotary's Group Study Exchange abroad, participated in various international RYLA (Rotary Youth Leadership Award) and also attended international conference as guest speaker. Equally significant is the hosting of an international conference ROTASIA 2014 for the 600 Rotaract participants from South Asia, and a regional conference SEARIC Summit in 2015-16 during the tenure of DRR Samir Nepal.

Rotaractors of Nepal organized Mr. and Miss Rotaract program in 2017, which was hugely successful in encouraging young Rotaracts for leadership role and in propagating Rotary in the society. Selcted Mis Rotaract Shristi Shakya of Rotaract club of Himalaya Patan and Mr. Rotaract Dr. Suyash Timilsina of Rotaract club of Kathmandu Medical College shared Rotaract as a platform to explore their potentials.

Rotaractors as young members in the family of Rotary, have started joining Rotary clubs as they age. The first Rotary E-Club in the District was chartered on May 31, 2013 with all past Rotaractors. Now, the new rule of the Council on Legislation (COL) allows all Rotaractors to join Rotary irrespective of their age and dual membership.

By February December 2024 the number of Rotaractors in the District has increased to 5,339.

### **ROTARY COMMUNITY CORPS**

(RCC): Rotary Clubs organize and sponsor group of non-Rotarians interested to work to improve their communities within the guidelines of Rotary service. Dallu village near Swoyambhu was the first village adopted by Rotary Club of Kathmandu on October 4, 1966. The Club planted 400 fruit trees there. Later the Club adopted Salyansthan, Kirtipur, previously known as Rotary Village Corps (RVC) in 1985/86. A health clinic was later set up there, inaugurated by Rotary Club of Kathmandu president Rtn. Kazuo Kaneko in 1986.



RCC has gained momentum in the District and as in July 2023, there were 127 Rotary Community Corps, most of them active in providing various community services in their locality.

Globally, there were 11,096 RCC as on June 16, 2020.

# Rotary Response to Covid-19 Pandemic and Natural Disasters

Corona virus has caused unprecedented human tragedy worldwide in the past two years. World Health Organization confirms the virus has affected 444 million people with recorded global death toll of 6 million from Covid-19 in the first two years. A recent research by Washington University in USA has indicated that the actual death toll of Covid-19 is three times of the WHO figures: indicating that globally 18.2 million people died of Covid-19 during the beginning of 2020 till the end of 2021.

Europe and USA have been the most affected regions, with 181 million and 147 million people infected by Covid during the period respectively. Countrywise, USA, India and Brazil have become the most affected 3 countries. Death rates worldwide is highest among people unvaccinated against the virus, said Professor Tikki Pang of Singapore National University. "This is the disease of the unvaccinated, as the largest majority of the deaths and severe causes are the unvaccinated volnurable segment of the population".

WHO reports, It took the world seven months to record its first million deaths from the virus after the pandemic began in early 2020. Four months later another million people had died and one million have died every three months since, until the death toll hit 5 million at the end of October 2021.

Corona virus Covid-19 pandemic hit Nepal early in April 2020, and affected all sectors of the economy, especially the wage earners in their income-generating activities. As of March 11, 2022, the Nepal witnessed 977,848 confirmed cases of Covid-19 infection out of the 5.47 million PCR tests done. Unfortunately, 11,950 lives were lost during the 2 years period due to Covid-19 despite gigantic efforts of the government, the civil society and organizations including the Rotary International. Many of the 156 Rotary clubs in Nepal and Bhutan under RI District 3292 have responded expediously to help the victims of this pandemic with local as well as international resources through global grants from the Rotary Foundation and from many friendly Rotary clubs and Districts from around the world.

Rotary's response to Covid-19 pandemic in Nepal took the form of establishing Food Bank to feed the hungry people, providing food and medicine supplies during the lockdown, hand washing sanitizers, masks and gloves, Face Shield, PPEs and medical equipment including oxygen/cylinders & concentrators, RT PCR and Covid Kits, High Flow Nasal Cannula machines (HFNC) and one BIPAP machines, fever clinics, antigen tests and RT- PCR tests, Blood & Plasma donations, Thermo Guns, Homeopathy Immunity Booster Medicine, ECG machine, Liquid Soap Dispenser etc. to the communities and the hospitals around the country. Rotary took great initiative in response to COVID19 to serve the poor and deprived people, especially the daily wage workers who lost their livelihood due to continues lockdown and were in an extremely critical situation due to deprivation of food and money to take care of their family.

Rotary response to Covid Pandemic and club activities were mostly in Food Bank, Sanitizers, Gloves and Face Masks; PPEs, Medical supplies (oxygen cylenders & concentrators); RT PCR Kits, and Covid Awareness programs.

# Rotary Support to Flood & Landslide Victims 2020-21

The devastating landslides and flood that struck Sindhupalchowk district (30 kms east of Kathmandu) and other areas on 23rd September 2020 had caused colossal loss of lives and properties. Some 35 houses were wiped off leaving many homeless in Sindhupalchowk and many houses were vulnerable to landslide. Rotary rushed to the site for immediate response with relief materials (food & vegetables, cooking gas cylinders, utensils, chairs etc.). Rotary Club of Patan supplied food to 95 households affected by the landslide costing NRS 80,000 in September 2020. The club mobilized further relief support in association with a voluntary organization ROBON. Many other clubs gathered funds and arranged to supply utensils, food items, shelters for the flood/landslide victims also through local and government agencies. The flooding was repeated again in June 2021.

RC Bhadgaon handed over 66 quintal of food relief items to the flood and landslides victims of Tajakot village in Humla district on October 12, 2020. Rotary Club of Kathmandu Metro also supplemented the relief effort. Rotaract Club of Dharan supplied food to the homeless and disabled people on 1st June 2021. Rtn Praveen Yogal of RC Lalitpur new member delivered NRs 25,000 plus 1,250 pieces of masks and 50 pcs children's clothes to Melamchi flood victims in Sindhupalchowk District on June 15, 2021.

Rotary Club of Greenland Kathmandu raised Rs. 50,000 and supplied staple food and medicine (rice, pulse, Salt, cooking oil, turmeric/ spice powders, medicines, temporary shelter equipment like tarpaulin sheet and sanitizers, and sanitary pads etc.) to 50 families of flood victims of Helambu in Sindhupalchowk district on June 19, 2021. On July 5, 2021 RC Narayangarh distributed relief materials (Rice, Dal, Gram, Potato, Salt, Bhuja, Beaten Rice, Dalmoth, Soybean, Clothes, Utensils, Blankets and some Medicines) to 30 flood-affected families of ward no. 10 and 11 of Kalika Municipality at a cost of Rs. 150,000 donated by the club members. On July 15, 2021, the club distributed relief materials to 38 flood victims of Ward No.1 at Maadi at accost of Rs. 275,000/-.

On July 07, 2021 Rotarians of RC Bharatpur distributed relief materials (cooking utensils and food materials) to 49 families/ flood victims of Siddhi Village, Chitwan, which was badly affected by the massive flood and landslide.

Rotary and Innerwheel Clubs of Kantipur supplied blankets, cooking utensils (dekchi, karai, dadu & paneu, steel plates, bucket, mug, potable water filter), corrugated metal sheets, personal hygiene packet consisting of soap, tooth brush/paste, sanitary pads, detergent powder. The relief materials worth Rs. 655,000 were sent to 100 families of Shera Village Chanaute, Helambu on July 6 and were distributed only on July 8, 2021 due to road damage after the heavy rain.

On July 17, 2021, RC Narayani Mid Town distributed food materials worth Rs. 125,000 to 90 flood victims of Bankatta, Seruwa, Bhangara and Gardi of Maadi Ward No. 1. Chitwan. RC Biratnagar Downtown distributed 100 dry food packets to 100 flood victims of RCC Bakhari village, benefitting some 1,500 people at a cost of Rs 379,754. The club, along with Rotaract Club of Nobel Medical College Teaching hospital handed over Ration (rice, dal, ghee, sugar, chiura, bhuja) 78 women sufficient for a month in Manavsewa Ashram, Biratnagar on September 8, 2021.

Solar Lamp for Flood Victims of Bheriganga Dhanubas Surkhet at Chhinchu on August 22, 2021. The supplies worth Rs. 335,000/- benefited the children of 56 deprived families. The students of Dhanubas could continue their studies and get an opportunity to improve their academic standards after the implementation of this support project.

On September 8, 2021 the Rotarians of RC Biratnagar Downtown along with Rotaractors jointly served hot meal including Boodiya (sweet) with a budget of Rs. 50,000 to the flood victims on October 8, 2021.

Rotary Club of Biratnagar Fusion organized "Hunger No Longer" program with unlimited food to more than 100 people on regular basis. On October 22, 2021 RC Biratnagar Downtown helped 100 flood victims of RCC Bakhari village, Simrahi with dry food items (200 packets of biscuits, 100 packets each of noodles, chiwra and bhuja) at a cost of Rs 98,700.

# **Rotary Award for Vocational Excellence Since 2011**

"Gopal-Kamala Rajbhandari Rotary Award for Vocational Excellence" was initiated on October 29, 2010 after signing an agreement with the Rajbhandari family to contribute the prize money of Rupees one million to be given away once every two years to a selected Vocational Leader or Institution of Nepal nominated by a Selection Committee appointed by the District. The award fund of Rs.1 million, perhaps the highest award in Nepal, is donated by the family of past Rotarian Gopal Raj Bhandari (June 25,1921 to February 17, 2008), who was one of the founder members of Rotary movements in Nepal since 1957 with significant contributions till the approval of a separate District for Nepal from July 1, 2008.

In recognition of his special contributions in Rotary, he was honored with Rotary's highest award "Service Above Self" in 2001. Late Gopal Raj Bhandari was the source of inspiration and guardian of the Rotarians of Nepal, as he led the campaign for establishing a separate Rotary District in Nepal and also contributed significantly in health, education and other service projects through Rotary, dedicating himself to social services till the last moment of his life.

First such Gopal-Kamala Rajbhandari Rotary Award for Vocational Excellence of rupees one million was handed over by the President of Nepal Rt. Honorable Dr. Ram Baran Yadav to Dr. Ram Katha Makaju Shrestha, Chairman of Dhulikhel Hospital on April 20, 2011 in a special function at Rastrapati Bhawan in the gracious presence of Rotary International President Elect Rotarian Kalyan Banarjee and Governor Rtn. Tirtha Man Sakya. The award was given in recognition of Dr. Ram's significant contribution in the Health sector. Dr. Ram has dedicated himself to provide quality health services to the poorest of the poor to deserve the Rotary award. Rt. Honorable Dr. Ram Baran Yadav praised this noble initiative of Rotary in enhancing the vocational ethics in Nepal and for encouraging such creative works. RIPE Kalyan Banerjee congratulated Rotary leaders of Nepal for the good works they are doing to uphold the image of Rotary.

The second recipient of this prestigious award was Dr. Suresh Raj Sharma, former Vice Chancellor of Kathmandu University, from the hands of Rt. Honorable Dr. Ram Baran Yadav on November 22, 2012 in a special function at Rastrapati Bhawan in the gracious presence of Rotary International President Rtn. Sakuji Tanaka and Governor Rtn. Yogendra Man Pradhan. Dr. Suresh Raj Sharma

was the charter president of Rotary club of Dhulikhel and had contributed significantly infield of Education, including the establishment of Kathmandu University in Dhulikhel as a world class Center of Excellence.

The third recipient of GKR Rotary Award for Vocational Excellence was culture expert Dr. Satya Mohan Joshi, Chancellor of Nepal Bhasa Academy on February 5, 2015 for his excellence in Nepalese Culture. The award was handed over by the President of Nepal Rt. Honorable Dr. Ram Baran Yadav in the presence of Rotary International President Gary CK Huang and Governor Rtn. Rabindra Piya.

The fourth recipient of this prestigious award was Ms. Indira Rana Magar, Chairperson of Prisoners Assistance Nepal in recognition of her Social Services. The award was handed over to Ms. Indira during Rotary's District Conference on February 17, 2017, observing the 9th anniversary day of donor Rotarian late Gopal Raj Bhandari at hotel Soaltee Crown Plaza. Ms. Indira had been speaker on several world forums on social justice, garnering numerous accolades including the Top Social Entrepreneur in Nepal.

In 2019, the GKR Vocational Award on IT and Innocation sector was given to two persons, namely Mr. Biswas Dhakal of E-Sewa and Rtn. Dr. Birendra Raj Pokhrel of Rotary Club of Jawalakhel.

Past Rotarian Gopal Raj Bhandari (June 25, 1921 to February 17, 2008) was one of the founder members of Rotary movement in Nepal since 1957. Recognizing his unparalleled contribution to the Rotary services in Nepal, Rotary International honoured him with the Rotary's highest award "Service Above Self" in 2001. He is the first such award receipent in Nepal. The untiring effort of late Gopal Raj Bhandari to establish a separate Rotary District in Nepal by July 2008 has earned him great respect as the Patron of Nepal's Rotary District.

# Rotary Journo Award since 2012

As a means to Enhance Public Image of Rotary

Rotary's new District 3292 since 2008 has initiated various measures to enhance public image of Rotary in Nepal. One of the effective means of promoting public image is through Public Relations. The relation between the Rotary and the public at large is effectively carried out through various media like print media (newspaper/ magazines), electronic media (TV, Radio/ FM), display boards, social media (Facebook etc.) and others.

In our exercise to promote public image of Rotary, Nepalese journalists working at different media play an important role to carry and disseminate positive message in the society. "Sewa ma Rotary" was a daily radio FM program initiated in December 2011 with great success in partnership with Forum of Environment Journalists to disseminate news about Rotary service. Other FM, radio, TV channels and print media were also mobilized to achieve the PR objectives

"Rotary Journo Award" was initiated in 2012 as a means to enhance public image of Rotary in Nepal by encouraging active journalist to disseminate positive communication in the society. Similar to Rotary's focus six areas of service, Nepalese journalists have five distinct groups like Education Journalist group, Swastha Patrakar Samuha, Forum for Environment Journalist, Sancharika

Samuha (Women's group) and economic development. So, the Rotary Journo Award is given to the best performing journalist working these groups at different media plus one in the mainstream journalism. In this endeavor, Rotary is partnering with five journalist groups under the Federation of Nepali Journalist, namely:

- 1. Education Journalist's Group (EJG)
- 2. Swastha Patrakar Samuha/ Health Journalist Group (HEJAN)
- 3. Nepalese Forum for Environment Journalists (NEFEJ)
- 4. Sancharika Samuha (SS), and
- 5. Nepal Arthik Patrakar Samai/ Society of Economic Journalists Nepal (SEJAN)

The District recognizes and encourage individual journalists and institutions, who have communicated encouraging and exemplary news to help generate positive thoughts in the Nepalese society. The award is given in six focus areas, like Education, Health, Environment, Economic & Community Development, Women Development and Mainstream journalism.

Rotary Journo Award for six persons carry a cash prize and a Token of Appreciation given in a special ceremony every year. This Award program is funded by all the Rotary members of the District.

The Rotary Journo Award program had awarded 65 journalists so far (listed below) and they are Rotary's ambassadors in the Nepalese journalism to spread positive vibes about Rotary's services in the society. Rotary clubs can and should try to contact them, and invite them in Rotary's service activities/ programs to keep them informed of Rotary's good works so that they can carry positive messages in the society.

Rotary Nepal greatly values the partnership and cooperation with the Nepalese journalist and media partners to serve the people of Nepal with unbiased information that would inspire and make aware the pertinent issues in the society through professional media services. This annual Rotary Journo Award is a small effort to strengthen the cordial relationship existing between Rotary and the media world through recognizing few deserving journalists who are dedicated to serve the common goals of Rotary and the media world and thus deserve recognition.

# **District Disaster Relief Fund**

District Disaster Relief Fund of Rs.10 million has been established to offer humanitarian services and to minimize damages caused by natural disasters like accident, fire, earthquake, flood, landslide etc. as per section 14 of the Rotary District Bylaws. The bylaw provides for automatic transfer of any surplus budget of any District event every year. To raise the fund upto Rs.10 million, District Assebbly 2012 has decided to raise Rs.1,000/- from each Rotary members of District 3292. A committee has been formed, consisting of the following, to magnage this endowment fund and to use the annual interest income for disaster relief activities:

- 1. District Governor
- 2. Immediate Past District Governor
- 3. District Governor Flect
- 4. District Governor Nominee
- 5. Rotarian nominated by District Governor Member Secretary

# **Rotary Nepal Literacy Mission Committee (RNLM)**

Literacy means far more than learning how to read and write. Illiteracy is probably the root causes of poverty, unemployment and lack of hygiene. Countries in South Asia are faced with increasing population, particularly amongst the lower economic sections and seriously require a social commitment by NGO participation for creating a new world for future generations to live.

Corporate and Financial institutions are partnering to create proper CSR commitments. A Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) has been signed between RI District 3292 and the Ministry of Education (MoE), Government of Nepal on September 25, 2013.

The Steering Committee will coordinate the functions/activities of the Sub Committee in accordance to the norms and values of Rotary International.

### T-F-A-C-H Model

ROTARY SOUTH ASIA has initiated Total Literacy Program based on T-E-A-C-H model and RID 3292 has now adopted this model. Where, 'T' stands for "Teachers Training", 'E' stands for "E-learning", 'A' for "Adult learning", 'C' for "Childhood Development" and 'H' for "Happy School".

There will be 5 Coordinators, one for each program under T-E-A-C-H model.

The Water and Sanitation Working Committee in accordance with the MOU signed with Water Aid, a bank account has been even opened where funds are being collected to initiate projects. Designs of effective toilets are prepared. Individual Rotarians and friends have come forward to participate in various ways to work with the Committees.

Clubs are encouraged to participate identifying projects that could be implemented and sent to the Steering Committee for needful.

# Dr Suniti and Gopal Acharya Fund for Recognition and Encouragement of Professional Women

A Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) was signed between Immediate Past District Governor Rtn. Jitendra Bahadur Rajbhandary and Past President of Rotary Club of Jawalakhel Rtn. Dr. Suniti Acharya to establish a trust fund entitled (Dr Suniti and Gopal Acharya Fund for Recognition and Encouragement of Professional Women) under District 3292. For this purpose, Dr. Suniti Acharya has donated Rs. 25,00,000 (in words twenty-five lacs only) to Rotary District 3292. This fund has been kept in a fixed deposit (Akshyaya kosh) in a separate bank account under RI District 3292 in the name of the Trust. The annual income generated from the Trust will be mobilized to encourage two women professionals for their excellent contribution to the society in the field of Women Empowerment specifically towards Economic and Community Development. The awards will be as mentioned below.

- Rs. 100,000 will be awarded to one Rotarian women selected from among the Rotary clubs of Nepal for her contribution to her own profession, to the society and community through her own Rotary club.
- Another Rs. 100,000 will be awarded to a Non Rotarian women professional, who has contributed to her profession, to the society and to the community.

These cash prizes will be given during the second day of the District Conference (March 16, 2024) along with a Memento and a framed certificate. Each Rotary club will recommend two women candidates, one woman professional Rotarian and one Non- Rotarian woman professional, who has made significant contributions to the society through their own profession in the field of women empowerment. Clubs will send the names along with their CVs. A clear evidences of their contribution to the society has to be mentioned in the CVs.

The criteria for selection of the candidates are as follows:

- Professional women below 60 years, who have a formal Master's degree or equivalent from an university.
- Active and working personnel in the field of women empowerment
- Has shown significant impact of her work in the community .
- · Has benefitted number of beneficiaries from their works
- Self-made person or family run sustainable business
- She should be able to come to Butwal to attend the district conference and receive the prize if selected.

The selected awardees have to send a 2-minute video clip, which shows their work and contributions to the society and community. The video to reach to the District office well in advance of the District Conference, latest by March 01 2024. Thus, the names and their CVs will be sent to the District office latest by Feb 27,2024. After the District receives the names with CVs, a preliminary selection will be done by the Committee and a short list will be prepared and the final selection will be done by the District Rotary Vocational Excellency Award Committee.

# **District Blood Bank**

Blood is an essential element in treatment and saving lives of the patients. However, a lot is desired in this area. Blood supply, in times of need, is always scarce and there are several reports of deaths, due to blood shortage. Several initiatives have been taken within Rotary and Rotary District 3292 in June 2014 has been successful in establishing a Blood Bank in Lalipur namely "Nepal Rotary-Heart Foundation-Red Cross-Lalitpur Blood Transfusion Centre" in partnership with Nepal Red-Cross Society, Lalitpur District Chapter and Nepal Heart Foundation, Lalitpur. The Blood Bank was established through Global Grant (Project cost US\$ 192,838) with all 17 Korean Districts as International Partners.

# **District Community Heart Hospital, Lalitpur**

Rotary International District 3292, Rotary Club of Himalayan Patan (RCHP) as a lead Club, Nepal Heart Foundation Lalitipur (NHFL) and Manidol Tole Sudhar Samiti (MTSS) are the main implementing organizations of the District Community Heart Hospital project in Manidole, Lalitpur in December

2017. MTSS, a local organization established for overall improvement and development of the community, has generously provided the land (9,000 sq.ft.) in Sankhamul, Lalitpur for the construction of hospital facilities. NHFL has agreed to take responsibility of operational part of the hospital and RID 3292 also with the support from different Rotary Clus in other countries and The Rotary Foundation, will be responsible for providing equipments necessary for the hospital.



The proposed Rotary Community Heart Hospital (RCHH), a 25-bed community hospital will be registered as a non-profit community hospital. It will operate on subsidized service charges on a self-sustaining basis.

District 3292 Lalitpur Community Heart Care Center is operational prior to the construction of the hospital. Rotary has exontributed US\$ 240,000/- for the hospital equipment, now used in the Center.

# **Sustainable Immunization Support Fund Program**

Fully immunizing every child with routine and newer vaccines (pneumococcal, rotavirus) can contribute up to 25% of the needed child mortality reduction. Immunization to children against vaccine preventable diseases is one of the most cost-effective health intervention and key to achieving the Millennium Development Goal (MDG) to reduce mortality among under 5 children and mothers.

To ensure that the funding gap for immunization is met in the current context of global financial crisis, this was an initiative by the Rotary Club of Kathmandu North to ensure that no child and mothers are deprived of its right to be immunized and to have the latest available vaccines.

With the initiation of Rotary Club of Kathmandu North, Rotary Dist. 3292 has been working with UNICEF Nepal, Sabin Vaccine Institute and Government of Nepal to advocate for sustainable

immunization financing. In this context, Rotary District 3292 has endorsed Sustainable Immunization Support Fund (SISF) in its By-laws on June, 2014.

As part of social responsibility, every year \$1 by every Rotarians can help to contribute globally.

Rotary District 3292 will work closely with stakeholders to use the funds appropriately. The fund is aimed to be used to increase the quality of the immunization program, to conduct various social mobilization activities to improve coverage, to strengthen cold chain system and to procure vaccines. According to the By-Laws of RI District 3292, each Rotary year a "SISF Committee" will be constituted with the following Rotarians as its members:

- 1. District Governor Chair
- 2. Immediate Past District Governor
- 3. District Governor Elect
- 4. District Governor Nominee
- 5. Rotarian nominated by District Governor Member Secretary

# Earthquake Reliefs, Rehabilitation and Reconstruction Program (ERRRP) since 2015

In the wake of the devastating Nepal earthquake of April 25, 2015 causing the loss of 8959 lives, 22,322 casualties, a full damage of 602,591 private houses and partial damage of more than 284,482 private houses, Rotary District 3292 has taken an immediate action to shoulder the responsibility to join other humanitarian actors to address the immediate life surviving needs of people in destitute. Among many losses, 7,923 schools have been affected and about 32,000 classrooms have been destroyed by the quake. Many children were deprived of their rights to continue their education or they have to still continue studying in Temporary Learning Centers made of tents and bamboos and corrugated zinc iron sheets that do not provide proper conditions to study.

Following the Rotary spirit of providing humanitarian service to people most in needs, building goodwill and peace in the world, the Council of Governors, RID 3292 decided on July 2015, to form a Steering Committee for Earthquake Relief, Rehabilitation and Reconstruction Program. The program has set a plan to construct 1000 permanent low-cost houses and 140 primary schools to address the immense humanitarian needs of the quake-affected population in the 14 worst affected districts in Nepal.

The ERRRP took immediate action to extend humanitarian assistance to the affected communities to cater their immediate survival needs with emergency relief supplies such as shelter box, tents, shelter kits, tarpaulins, corrugated galvanized sheets (CGI Sheets) for temporary shelter, Aqua box, food items, cooking utensils, medicines etc

After the initial emergency phase ERRRP extended humanitarian and rehabilitation assistance to the quake affected families to construct temporary transitional shelters, water and sanitation systems and other facilities of basic survival needs. Accordingly, about 3,800 Temporary Shelters and few Temporary Learning Shelters were constructed with the help of various Clubs

ERRRP formulated a 5-year Program Framework and Plan of Action plan in August 2015 to support construction of 1,000 permanent low cost houses to be built in a cluster of 50 or more households on a "Model Village" approach to integrate other community needs gradually for the settlement of displaced people. The program also includes construction of community hall, water and sanitation schemes, and reconstruction of 140 primary schools with school software support such as furniture, library, water supply and sanitation, toilets and other essential logistics in 10 schools each in the 14 highly affected districts. Already 115 houses have been constructed and handed over to communities in two villages- (i) Majhi Gaon, Sindhupalchok (46 house) and (ii) Chaurbesi-Rayobari, Kavre (69 houses) with construction of additional 50 houses nearing completion in Burunchuli, Lalitpur.

The Rotary Foundation Trustee's decision in September 2016, allowed to apply for Global Grant for the Construction of Low Cost Shelters and Simple Schools in Nepal. Club Presidents have been given a guideline to apply for ERRRP funding mainly through Global Grant for the reconstruction of schools affected by earthquake. Some 43 school have been reconstructed under ERRRP funding till June 2022, involving Rs.106.4 million from ERRP fund out of total reconstruction project cost of Rs.292.4 million in 199 schools, as listed below and some are in progress:

# **Traffic Awareness and Road Safety Project**

RI District 3292 besides their involvement in many humanitarian service projects is also regularly undertaking Traffic Awareness, Road Safety program, Road Accident Rescue Training and Disaster Relief in the country through its network of Rotary Clubs. It has also established a "District Disaster Relief Fund" of NPR 10 million for humanitarian services in disaster relief and management in the country.

The objective of "Road Safety Project" as a District Signature Project is to support the growing need under "Urban Concern", enhance civic responsibilities and elevate Rotary Image as well. RI District 3292 shall act as a Catalyst Stakeholder in promoting and supporting Road Safety through partnership approach:

- 1. RI District 3292 through Rotary Clubs and Stakeholders shall promote and support traffic awareness and road safety initiatives in major cities throughout the country.
- RI District 3292 through partnership shall initiate and support the establishment and operation
  of "Road Safety Demo Park and Training center". And shall gradually through its domestic and
  international networking provide tools, logistics and trainings to promote and support "Road
  Safety Demo Park and Training center".
- RI District 3292 shall coordinate and encourage its Rotarians, Rotaractors, Interactors and Rotary Community Corps for regular visit in "Road Safety Demo Park and Training center" of students from their schools to promote traffic awareness and road safety.
- RI District 3292 shall encourage its Rotaractors, Interactors, Rotary Community Corps and Rotarians to establish Public Image as a Responsible Driver. This itself will enable elevate Rotary Image.

# **Supporting the Environment**

### **Environment Initiatives in Rotary**

Rotary International President (RIP) Paulo V. Costa (1990-91) from Brazil, introduced the Preserve Planet in Rotary. In July 1990, the Rotary International board of directors resolved to celebrate November 1st as Rotary Ecology Day. Observing Rotary Ecology Day was a small part of Rotary International President (RIP) Paulo Costa's Preserve Planet Earth (PPE) Program. The ceremony of planting a tree in every visit made by Paulo to a community represented his personal commitment with the environment and with the quality of life. Only in 199091 Rotary year, 35 million trees were planted around the world. Similarly, RI President Ian Riseley (2017- 18) from Australia set the target of planting 1.2 million trees, one per Rotarian, and the final total for the year was somewhere between 3.5 and 4 million trees planted, which is great. The UN Climate Change Conference in Glasgow (COP26) in 2021 was the first time Rotary International had an official delegation. RI President Shekhar Mehta (2021-2022) from India spoke at COP26 where his focus was on saving the planet with mangrove trees. He declared that mangrove restoration will become one of the key threads of Rotary's environmental focus. Similarly, RI President Jennifer Jones (2022-23) has set supporting the Environment as most pressing issue in her vision and goals. RI President Gordon MacInally this year has focused on peace and environment.

In June 2020 The Rotary Foundation Trustees and Rotary International Board of Directors have both unanimously approved adding a new area of focus: Supporting the Environment. In January 2021, they finalized the Global Grant Policy guidelines detailing projects that are eligible for Global Grants on environment. Such projects started from July 2021. Over the past five years more than \$18 million global grant funding has been allocated by the Rotary Foundation to environment-related projects.

### Rotary's Role in Supporting the Environment

Rotary has a big role in addressing the environmental problems and finding solutions. Since the approval of the new area of focus 'Supporting Environment" in June 2020, Rotary has been continuing on various projects related with environment and in coordination with UN and other development agencies.

The box shows some of the environmental actions that Rotary is being involved and scale up and replicate in a longer term.

# Major Highlights of Rotary Activities during 2023-2024

The Rotary Foundation Trustee Chair PRIP Barry Rassin and Trustee Vice Chair PRID Dr. Bharat Pandya together with RI Director Anirudha Roy Choudhury visited Nepal to attend Rotary Foundation Symposium & Recognition Program of Multi District of Zone 6 on March 6, 2024 at Kathmandu, cohosted by four other RI Districts 3100, 3110, 3120 and 3261.





Focus on Mental Health: As emphasized by Rotary International President Gordon R. McInally, there have been a series of talk programs by various Rotary clubs in the District since July 2023 focused on Mental Health at colleges, schools and with parents and teachers for greater awareness on this burning issue.

Some important District Goals this year.

- Carry out 35 Global Grants,
- Encourage Rotaract clubs to do Global and District Grants,
- Toilet projects up to 1.000 to 1.500 units
- Empower girls by teaching self- defense techniques
- Tree Plantation, Eye screening, Oral health etc. and
- Earthquake Relief works.

Progress so far since July 2023 to February 2024 have been:

- Oral Dental checkup: target of 3 lacs, 1 lac completed in around Kathmandu and Butwal,
- Eye screening 30 thousands target: RC Rajdhani has completed 5,625 and other clubs are supplementing,
- Tree plantation 1 lac target: More than 50,000 reported but many unreported,
- Cancer screening of 30,000 completed,
- World Peace Day celebrated on October 10 with a Peace Seminar in Kathmandu in coordination with the Government of Nepal,

- Jajarkot Earthquake relief works: Immediate relief materials from various clubs including toilets and Aqua boxes. Planning to build 25-50 model houses for marginalized community in Jajarkot in coordination with local bodies and provincial government. Building Rotary Village in progress, \$25,000 already received from the Rotary Foundation and Rs.30 lacs collected through local clubs.
- Post-Earthquake Assistance: Rotary Club of Dillibazar-Kathmandu issued an SOS to friends and donors, seeking immediate assistance for those in need. The club members contributed cash. Generous donations were received from Nepal and abroad: Rotary Club of Mitcham in Australia, Friends of Nepal South Australia, Friends of Nepal Munich in Germany, Oli Society Nepal, GMP Timilsina Pratishthan, Krishna Panta Smriti Prathisthan, Maitidevi Mahila Bachat, Swornimpath Sahakari, and Krishna Panta Smriti Pratisthan for earthquake relief support in Jajarkot. Total collection for the assistance project was Rs. 512,605. After need assessment of local requirements, 300 households in Nalgad Municipality and Barkot Rural Municipality of Jajarkot were supplied with relief materials, including 276 tarpaulins for temporary shelters, 80 blankets for families and 260 sweaters. 30 skirts, and 51 shirts for school children.

## Some Rotary Services in Seven Areas of Focus in 2023-24:

#### 1. Peace & Conflict Prevention Resolution

Panel Discussion: Peace Building and Conflict Resolution: The Rotary Club of Kathmandu Height, in collaboration with the Rotaract Club of Baneshwor Royal organized a Panel Discussion on Peace Building and Conflict Resolution on January 20, 2024 with an aim to unite individuals dedicated to positive community change and deepen their understanding of peace-building strategies. Rajani Thapa, DSP of Armed Police Force, shared practical insights and advice for future peace professionals. Shobha B.C., General Secretary of Nispakshya, highlighted the reality of conflict victims and advocated for harmony in conflict resolution.

Advocate Rajin Rayamajhi motivated youths to engage in peace-building, providing legal insights on a national and global scale. With 40 diverse attendees, the event fostered active participation in open floor discussions. The program was also live-streamed on social media, attracting over 300 online participants. It was a resounding success, providing a meaningful platform for insightful discussions. The audience's active engagement showcased a shared commitment to positive community change. The project's cost was Rs. 32.000.

Promoting Peace & Literacy through Art, Literature and Culture: Rotary Club of Surunga, has completed a three-day art, culture, and literature festival in Surunga, in the Kankai municipality of Jhapa. Senior artist Neer Shah inaugurated the festival on February 26, 2024, with a grand ceremony. The program was followed by the display of costumes from various ethnic groups residing in Kankai town and a marching rally in the market, circulating the message of unity and peace with a vow for peace.

District Governor and Assistant Governor encouraged the literature, culture, and art sector, along with the concept of peace. Given the current situation, this program, connected with the community, will bring people together and promote peace and harmony.

During this three-day festival, teachers and students from schools will engage in writing, learning, and testing poetry, collecting books for a library, listening to the thoughts and works of famous writers at the national and local levels, promoting literary conferences, cultures, costumes,

identities, and featuring performances by renowned artists such as Rachana Rimal and Manoj Gaujel at the national level. This is the first such festival hosted by Rotary at the regional level.

#### 2. Disease Prevention & Treatment

Blood Donation Camp: On December 23, 2023, RC Central Lumbini organized a Blood Donation Camp at Hotel Maurya, with the technical assistance of Red Cross Blood Bank Bhairahwa, and resulted in the collection of 30 units of fresh blood. Rotarians and their families actively participated in the program, alongside employees of Hotel Maurya. This initiative falls in line with RC Central Lumbini's practice of engaging in social activities to celebrate member birthdays. Other meaningful projects have included wheelchair distribution, stationary distribution, providing wall fans for an orphanage home, and tree planting, all conducted on various members' birthdays.

Free General Health Camp: Rotary Club Mahabouddha, in collaboration with Lalitpur Ward No. 5, held a Grand General Health Camp at the Mahalaxmisthan temple compound on January 6, 2024. The camp offered comprehensive health services, including ENT, eyes, orthopedics, gynecology, pediatrics, and senior citizen checkups, along with ECG and blood sugar tests, all completely free of charge. A total of 513 patients benefited from the camp, receiving necessary medical attention and prescribed medications free of charge. The dedicated team comprised 4 participating ward members, 11 Rotarians/ Assistant Governors, 6 Rotractors, and 18 doctors and health volunteers.

Free Health Camp and Blood Donation: Rotary Club of Mount Everest, Lalitpur in collaboration with Nepal Red Cross Society, Khokana Sub Committee Lalitpur organized Free Health Camp and Blood Donation Program on Saturday, January 20, 2024 at Shree Rudrayani Secondary School, Khokana, Lalitpur. 236 patients underwent a comprehensive general physical health checkup, including screenings for blood pressure, weight, and blood sugar, conducted by the medical team from KIST Hospital. Additionally, 100 patients received dental health services from Kantipur Dental Hospital. Gynaecology health services were provided to 39 women by Dr. Bimala Malla and Subarna Baidya. Vision tests were conducted for 136 patients, overseen by Dr. Sagar Rajkarnikar, with support from OA Raju Khatri of Birendra Hospital, Chauni. 21 blood donors participated in a blood donation program organized by the Nepal Red Cross Society.

Free health Camp: "Sewa ma Samarpit 3rd Phase" Sagar Rajkarnikar, with support from OA Raju Khatri of Birendra Hospital, Chauni. Furthermore, 21 blood donors participated in a blood donation program organized by the Nepal Red Cross Society.

Free Health Camp "Sewa ma Samarpit 3rd Phase" Rotary Club of Patan Durbar Square, in collaboration with the Cerebral Palsy Clinic and Care Center, organized a two-day Free Health Camp titled 'Sewa ma Samarpit 3rd Phase' on January 21, 2024. Another camp for the children with Cerebral Palsy and related neurological disorders at Laxmipur Health-Post, Laxmipur, ward -6, with the support of Haripur Nagarpalika and Karmacharya Arcade on January 20th and 21st, 2024. The camp provided quality treatment to needy children. A multidisciplinary team, including physiotherapist Anuja Karki and EEG Technician Abha Dhungana, served the children.Of the 124 children, 50% suffered from neurological disorders while the others suffered from seizure disorders, seasonal common cold, and other ailments. 9 children with seizure disorders benefited from EEG, and 50% of children with neurological disorders received physiotherapy. Awareness about Cerebral Palsy was raised by Rtn. Dr. Pragya Karmacharya Rajbhandari. Free Dental Camp for Students

Dental Camp: The Rotary Club of Hetauda and Rotaract Club of Hetauda organizing a free dental camp for students at Bhutandevi Secondary School in Hetauda on January 31, 2024. Dedicated dental professionals volunteered in the camp, led by Dr. Manoj Kumar Upadhyay. They offered services including dental check-ups, basic treatments, and tooth extractions to 1,044 students from early grades to grade 10. Some 300 students received an awareness talk about oral health and dental care from the doctors. The camp received technical support from Everest Dental Clinic and Puja Dental Clinic in Hetauda. The objective of the event was to make a significant and positive impact on the overall oral health and wellbeing of the students.

Blood Donation Program: On December 30, 2023, Rotary Club of Mahabouddha conducted a joint program with Regent School in Dhapakhel, Lalitpur. A total of 85 individuals attended, with 76 persons able to donate blood. The club members and the Regent School management teams actively communicated with the public and school parents. The collected blood through blood bank through blood collection, contributed to the uplifting of Rotary's image in life-saving activities.

Free Health Camp at CP Clinic: On 23rd December 2023, Rotary Club of Patan Durbar Square organized a free health Camp at Cerebral Palsy Clinic and Care Center in collaboration with different organizations (Siddhartha Bank, Divyanta, MedExpress Nepal, Sutra Diagnostic Pvt.Ltd., Yetichem and Nepal Reiyukai) for children with Cerebral Palsy, other neurological disorders and the local community to serve a great cause. The camp served the basic medical needs of the children with Cerebral Palsy, and neurological disorders, and the local community.

Reputed Pediatrician Rtn. Dr. Pragya Karmacharya Rajbhandari, ENT Surgeon Dr. Rishi Bhatt, Orthopedic Surgeon Dr. Prashant Adhikari, General Physician Dr. Ruby Maharjan, Dental Surgeon Dr. Pushpa Jha, Physiotherapist Anuja Karki and Physiotherapist Manoj Shah from Cerebral Palsy Clinic and Care Center actively participated in serving and treating this great cause wholeheartedly during this camp. Some 83 locals benefited from the Health Checkup camp and benefited from this medical camp.

Rheumatic Heart Disease Screening Program: The Rotary Club of Devdaha conducted Rheumatic Heart Disease screening program as a signature project on February 20 and screened all school-going children, both from private and government schools, within Devdaha municipality.

So far, the program screened more than 10,000 students. Among them, 184 students have been diagnosed with cardiac illness, 84 have had Rheumatic Heart Disease, who commenced treatment, while 13 have been diagnosed with Congenital Heart Disease requiring surgical correction.

Three-days Cataract Surgery camp: RC Pokhara Fishtail concluded its 3rd "Eye Screening and Cataract Surgery Camp" at Huwas Parbat during January 8-10, 2024 collaborating with Himalaya Eye Hospital, Pokhara and ICO Foundation, Canada. 1,200 patients from the local community benefitted from free services at the camp. Among the attendees, 500 individuals with visual impairments received reading glasses., 40 individuals diagnosed with cataracts received surgery in their local communities. Patients who underwent surgery expressed their immense gratitude for the opportunity to regain their vision close to home. They acknowledged Rotary's life- changing gift – "Back to light from the dark world!"

One particularly moving story involved a man nearly blind for 14 years, could feel his daughter's

presence nearby and hear her voice, but couldn't see her. After surgery, he was overwhelmed with joy upon seeing his daughter's face for the first time in years. He also connected with his sons and son-in-law working in Qatar by looking at their faces through a smartphone – a moment of immense gratification for himself and a testament to the impact of Rotary's work.

Global Grant on Burnt Cases: The Rotary Club of Sankhu is committed to enhancing healthcare services for burn victims. This transformative project, valued at \$109,216 has provided vital medical equipment and extensive training to healthcare professionals, offering the best care to those in need. Rotary Club of Sankhu, in collaboration with the Rotary Club of Lyon Nord, France, hosted their Global Grant handover program at Sushma Koirala Hospital on November 8, 2023.

Artificial Hand and Limb Project: On February 10, 2024, the Rotary Clubs of Birgunj, Narayani Mid Town, Bharatpur, Narayangarh, Purbi Chitwan, and Gaindakot jointly inaugurated a 14-day project to provide free artificial hands and limbs to 80 individuals in need at Chetana Village, Bharatpur-7, Chitwan. The ceremony was graced by the Health Minister of Bagmati Province, as the Chief Guest. and PDG Rabindra Piya as Special Guest, along with the President of the Chitwan Chamber of Commerce, representatives from industry associations, and senior Rotarian. This impactful project provided 80 individuals with life- changing artificial limbs and also covered their lodging and fooding needs during the fitting process.

Snakebite Prevention Project: Rotary Club of Kathmandu Mid-Town organized Rotary Nepal Snakebite Prevention event on 22 February 2024, shared with 150 guests from Nepal's diplomats, NGO workers, media influencers and Kathmandu residents. There was particular interest from those working with rural communities in Nepal's lowland Terai which is most afflicted by this preventable public health issue. Every year over 40,000 people are bitten and more than 3,000 die from snakebite. The Rotary global grant funded Nepal Snakebite Prevention campaign to save thousands of lives by spreading awareness about the venomous snake species in Nepal, how accidents can be prevented, and the immediate steps to take when someone is bitten. During the snakebite season, May to September the campaign is run in five local languages (Nepali, Pashimi Tharu, Awadhi, Bhoipuri and Maithili subtitled in English) to reach the widest audience. This is the first nation-wide snakebite prevention project undertaken Nepal.



This global grant project of US\$84,000 is being implemented for 4 years during 2022 to 2026. Working partners in the program are Epidemiology Disease Control Division, National Health Education Information and Communication Center, BP Koirala Institute of Health Sciences in Dharan and its affiliated Snakebite Research Centre and World Health Organization (WHO-Nepal). The implementing partner is Digital Broadcast Initiative - Equal Access.

Gender-Free Toilet at Kalika Basic School: Rotary Club of Sainamaina has completed a Gender-Free (Girls) toilet guided by the RNLM program of Rotary District 3292 on January 13, 2024. This toilet was built at Kalika Basic School, in Ward No. 2 of Sainamaina Municipality. The toilet was handed over to the school administration.

Foundation Laying for Girls Toilet: RC Kathmandu Downtown 22nd January 2024 between the Rotary Club of Kathmandu and local authorities addressed the needs of vulnerable children. The 35 orphaned children, received warm clothes and also a sense of care and compassion from the Rotarians. By addressing the immediate needs of these children, the club has build a stronger, more supportive community link.

The Rotary Club of Sankhu's also distributed warm clothes to students, not just in the form of clothing but also in the hearts of those who generously contribute to the betterment of society.

Rotary Club of Biratnagar Downtown supported 30 single mothers of Budhnagar village on January 3. These resilient women were provided with saris, sweaters, essential toiletries, and health tonics, addressing both practical needs and health concerns during the harsh weather.

Act of Philanthropy: On February 3, 2024, the Rotary Club of Yala collaborated with Upachar Ko Laagi Sahayogi Haatharu, Nepal Cancer Relief Society Lalitpur and Jestha Nagarik Dibya Sewa Kendra, with the support of Nepal Cancer Hospital & Research Center Ltd. Harrisiddhi, to organize a health camp program on uterine and breast cancer screening at Jestha Nagaric Dibya Sewa Kendra in Badegaon, Ward No. 14, Godavari Municipality, Lalitpur.

### 5. Basic Education & Literacy

School Dress and Educational Materials Distribution: The Rotary Club of Matribhumi Baluwatar supported the underprivileged school-going Chepang children by distributing essential educational materials, warm winter clothes, and daily-use items on January 20, 2024. The program delighted atmosphere the beneficiaries, and the gratitude expressed by students and parents alike. Screenings for blood pressure, weight, and blood sugar, conducted by the medical team from KIST Hospital. 100 patients received dental health services from Kantipur Dental Hospital. Gynaecology health services were provided to 39 women by Dr. Bimala Malla and Subarna Baidya. Vision tests were conducted for 136 patients,

Warm Clothes Distribution: Rotary Club of Dharan Ghopa distributed warm clothes to all the students of SHREE JANSEWA ADHARBHUT VIDYALAYA, Kerabari, Morang on January 19. 56 sweaters were distributed after ensuring that the recipients of the clothes were deserving. The warmth we received from the students was much more than the warmth provided by the sweaters themselves. The beneficiaries were from financially deprived groups.

A Gift of Warmth: Rotary Club of Dharan Foothills organized a Winter Warmth Drive on 23rd January 2024. Focusing their efforts on the children within the community, the Rotary Club distributed warm clothes, including socks and topis (warm hats). The distribution was a manifestation of community solidarity and a testament to the Rotary Club's commitment to fostering warmth, both in the literal and figurative sense. As the students adorned their new socks

and topis, a sense of joy and appreciation radiated through the gathering. This initiative exemplifies the power of collective goodwill, proving that even the smallest acts of generosity can make a lasting impact on the lives of those less fortunate.

Warm Clothes Distribution: The Rotary Club of Swoyambhu distributed warm clothes, shoes, socks, and school bags to 68 Chepang students of Jalakanya & Jaldevi Adharbhut Vidyalaya in Benighat Rorang Rural Municipality, Ward No. 8, Dhadingember 23, 2023.

Rotary's Winter Relief Drive: Rotary Club of Biratnagar Downtown donated warm clothes to its adopted school: Shiv Aadharbhut Vidyalaya on January 1, 2024. A total of 149 cozy sweaters were distributed

Nepal Drug Users Survey 2019 reported an increasing number of drug use in the past two decades, from 46,309 in 2005 to 130,424 in 2019, especially in Bagmati, Lumbini, Koshi, and Madhesh provinces. The principal and teachers of the school participated in the event, encouraged the club to conduct such program in more schools in the coming days.

Distribution Of Uniforms At Happy School: The Rotary Club of Rupandehi orchestrated

a meaningful school uniform distribution programme on February 6, 2024, at Gautam Buddha Adarsha Sishu Sadan, Tilottama-9, Rupandehi. This initiative aimed to support the educational endeavors of the students by providing them with essential school attire. As part of our ongoing commitment to the school, the Happy School project under the RNLM, the Club distributed 115 sets of track-suits and 115 pairs of school shoes. The event was graced by DG Rtn Rajendra Prasad Dhoju as Chief Guest.

ICT Training for Public School Teachers: The Rotary Club of Kathmandu, in collaboration with Rotary International District 3292 and the Lions Club of Gaurishankar, organized a three-day ICT during February 17-19, 2024.

Cyclofun 2.0 and Cyclocross 1.0 "Pedal for Child Education": The Rotary Club of Dharan organized two cycling events: Cyclofun 2.0 (a 7 km fun ride) and Cyclocross 1.0 (a 16 km mountain bike race), titled "Pedal for Child Education," on February 19, 2024. The club had organized a Mountain Bike (MTB) Cross Country race. Having the most suitable landscape and a vibrant sporting culture, Dharan hosted the cycling event. A total of 105 participants from Kakarbhitta, Birtamode, Sundarharicha, Ithari, Biratnagar, Pokhara, Kathmandu, Kavre, and Dharan took part in the event. Since Cyclofun is the signature program of Rc Dharan, the event's proceeds was donated to installing a playground at Shree Janta Aadharbhut School, Dharan 15.

Educational Materials and Free Dental Check-ups: The Rotary Club of Tinau Butwal distributed educational materials to students along with conducting dental check-ups. The club distributed educational materials, including free dental check-ups, at our Sagarmatha Basic Foundation School in Tilottama on February 23. Rotary Club of Lumbini Star collaborated on the dental check-ups.

Digital Learning Support for Quality Education: RC Tripureswor provided computers, smart boards, CCTV cameras, and furniture to four schools to facilitate digital learning for the quality education of children. Open Learning Exchange (OLE) software was installed on the computers, enabling teachers and students to learn various subjects that support the improvement of their education. A total of 84 computers, 4 smart boards, 8 CCTV cameras, tables, and furniture have been supplied to

four schools namely Bhawani Secondary School, Kagati Gau, Kakani Ward No. 1;

Pashupati Mitra Secondary School, Mitra Park Chabahil, Kathmandu;

Melamchi Ghayan Secondary School, Melamchi, Sindhupalchowk; and Gram Sewa Secondary School, Dharmasthali, Kathmandu. This provision was made under the Global Grant project of Rs.5 million, covering schools in Kathmandu, Sindhupalchowk, and Nuwakot districts. A total of 3000 students from these four schools will benefit from the digital learning program. The project aims at enhancing the use of digital learning practices among teachers and students to improve learning outcomes

Food Distribution: Rotary Club of Bhairahawa celebrating its charter day on December 6, by assisting an orphanage: Siddhartha Balgriha at Siddharthanagar with foodstuffs other various activities with a budget of Rs. 512,605. The caretaker, Miss Krishna Maya Gurung of the orphanage, had communicated the priority for the foodstuffs food. The program provided an opportunity for many fellow members to understand and appreciate the importance of their contribution to the orphans, which was both remarkable and inspiring.

### 6. Economic & Community Development

Charity Show: Rotary E-Club of District organized a Charity Show to raise awareness and support for the crucial cause of mental health among girls and women on February 3. The event focused on addressing the distinctive challenges and disorders that they may encounter. The Rotary E-Club aims to foster understanding and empathy for mental health issues specific to women, encompassing concerns such as depression, anxiety, and eating disorders. The Charity Show took place at One Cinema, New Baneshwor, featuring the movie "Fighter." This initiative underscores the club's commitment to contributing to society and promoting solidarity through purposeful actions. Some 200 people watched the movie with fun and fellowship. Rotary Song and Annual theme of RID3292 'Light of Hope' were also played to share awareness on Rotary. The event raised a fund of Rs. 153,000 to support the cause of a thematic project called 'Rotary for Her, an initiative of Rotary E-Club of District 3292, Nepal.

Empowering Women: The Rotary Club of Biratnagar Downtown exemplified its commitment to community service by donating two thela rickshaws to financially vulnerable single women on February 7.

Yomari Making Entrepreneurship Training: Rotary Club of Kathmandu Height organized a 3 days entrepreneurship training during February 8-10, 2024 for twenty single women residing in Sunakothi, Lalitpur. The training empowered these women economically by equipping them with the skills needed to produce Yomari, a traditional Newari delicacy, and turn it into an income-generating venture. Yomari holds significant cultural value within the Newar community and is appreciated by other communities. By preserving and promoting this traditional delicacy, the trainees will support their livelihood while fostering cultural exchange and social harmony. The training covered various aspects of Yomari production, including recipe refinement, production techniques, dough preparation, shaping and filling, quality control, hygiene and marketing strategies. Project budget of Rs.20,000 was contributed by club members.

Vocational Training for Youth: Rotary Club of Kathmandu Mid-Town and the Career Connection had soft launch of the vocational training on January 21, 2024 at Silver Mountain School of Hotel Management. The program brought together a diverse group of individuals dedicated to fostering vocational training and career development in Nepal.

The event was followed by an introduction to the Global Grant Career Connection. The Career Connection project presentation by Tenzin, Founder/ Director of Social Development Initiative Nepal (Edulift) highlighted the project's goals, strategies, implementation plan and the potential impact on enhancing the skills and talents of the youth. The list of training announced for the college going youths were digital marketing, graphic designing, Social Media Marketing, CV/Resume preparing workshop, job interview skill, etc.

The list of training announced for the non-college going youths are Plumbing, Electrician, Mechanic, Welding, Motorcycle Mechanic, Culinary Arts, Bakery, Front Desk Office, Housekeeping, F&B Service, Barista, etc.

### 7. Support the Environment

Rotary Club of Biratnagar Downtown adopted an eco-friendly approach to distribute Recyclable cloth bags adorned with Rotary's logo for promoting sustainability and environmental consciousness on January 1.. The outcome of this project resonates beyond warmth and comfort; it echoes the spirit of compassion, community support, and environmental mindfulness fostered by the Rotary Club of Biratnagar Downtown.

Tree Plantation: On July 15, 2023 Rotary Club of Butwal South organized a Tree Plantation program in Bomghat, Butwal, jointly with two sponsor clubs, RAC Butwal South and RAC Tinau City. The event was chaired by President Rtn Sharada Pangeni, Rtr Subin Khadka, and Rtr Prakash Khanal, representing the respective sponsor clubs. The program took place in the presence of RC Butwal South Charter President Rtn Prof Dr. Ram Chandrya Acharya, Ward Chairman Bishnu Dhakal, Chief Administrative Officer Rohit Bhushal of Butwal Sub- Metropolitan City, Past Presidents, Board Members, and the general members.

A total of 151 plants (Amala, Khayar, Bay leaf) were planted at a cost of NPR 60,375. The project created awareness among participants and the wider community about the importance of tree plantation for environmental sustainability. The event fostered a sense of community engagement and collaboration, encouraging individuals to take responsibility for environmental conservation.

# **MAJOR HIGHLIGHTS OF RY 2022-2023**

Rotary building: Foundation has been laid for a Rotary building at Thapathali, Kathmandu on July 1, 2022 behind the existing Rotary office building. Earlier, a MOU was signed between Rotary District office and the Rotary club of Kathmandu with a plan to construct a five-storied building, with an immediate plan to build two floors- one for Rotary District 3292 office and another for the Rotary club of Kathmandu.

RI President Jennifer Jones visit Nepal: RIP Jennifer Jones graced the Rotary Foundation Seminar in November 2022 and also participated in the Heritage Walk at Bhaktapur. Her presence Nepal's Rotary activities had inspired Rotarians of Nepal for higher contribution to the Rotary Foundation and to dedicate more to serve the community selflessly.

MOU was sighned with Dr. Suniti Acharya for her contribution of Rs.2.5 million as endowment fund to provide scholarship of rupees one lacs each to two girl students- one Rotarian and one Non-Rotarian every year

Rotary Services in Seven Areas of Focus:

#### 2. Disease Prevention & Treatment

Rotary Club of Dhulikhel supported wheelchair Basketball competition organized by Nepal Spinal Cord Injury Sports Association. Disabled people who participated expressed their happiness and joy. Through sport, persons with disabilities acquire vital social skills, develop independence, and become empowered to act as agents of change.

Rotary Club of Yala handed over PCR Extraction Kits worth Rs.180,000 to Nepal Korea Friendship Municipality Hospital, Thimi on September 20, 2022 as part of a Global Grant No. GG2118291. On October 6, 2021 the club handed over PCR machines and associated kits to the hospital costing Rs. 8 million under a Global Grant of the Rotary Foundation.

Rotary Club of Yala handed over Digital Video Colposcopy machine to Nepal Cancer Relief Society.

Shrestha gave special thanks to Rtn Surendra Govinda Joshi and Spouse Badri Laxmi Joshi for supporting with Rs. 250,000 and Nepal Cancer Relief Society for supporting Rs. 100,000. A Colposcopy is a microscope fitted with a light and used for examining the uterine cervix, particularly for warning signs of cancer.

Rotary Club of Butwal supported Kidney patients and heart patients in Butwal -Rupandehi on September 19, 2022. The program supplied edible material like rice, edible oil, salt, pulses, soyabean and other edible items valued at Rs. 98,500. 45 patients directly benefited.

Rotary and Rotaract Clubs of Biratnagar Jointly distributed 10,000 masks on August 20, 2022 to people coming to observe the rath yatra from different places of Nepal and India to be safe from the COVID-19 pandemic.

Wheelchairs have been handed to six disabled persons by Ratnanagar Rotary Club, including an Ayurvedic hospital. Several people witnessed dthe handover ceremony.

Health camp by RC Purbi Chitwan: Rotary and Rotaract clubs of Purbi Chitwan oraganized a helath camp at 4 Shital Chowk, Ratnanagar on September 1 7, 2022 with technical support of Harsha Medical Hall. Dr. Pukar Ghimire, a senior chest and nephrology specialist of the old medical college, Bharatpur, examined the health of the patients at the camp together with Rotarian Dr Sundar Gautam

On this camp, Director of Harsha Medical Mr. Vikram Shah and a nurse Pratima Tiwari were supported by members of the club.

More than 100 people benefitted from the health camp in Kot Danda Health Post Godawari on 15th October 15, 2022. The program was jointly organized by Bishankhu Narayan Health Post, Kot Danda Health Post, Nepal Red Cross Society, SOWA Healthcare Center and Rotary Club of Yala. Dr Jyoti Limbu (Gynaecologist), Dr Sarita Pandey (General Practisioner), Dr Ishamma Yakthumba (Dentist) and few other members were present from SOWA

Healthcare Center and team from Nepal Red Cross Society for Blood Donation programs. The program was coordinated by Rtn Dr Dinesh Lal Shrestha.

RC Biratnagar Downtown organized a Mega Health Camp at Kharji village as part of the "HAPPY VILLAGE" project in collaboration with Birat Nursing Home Pvt. Ltd., Birat International Diagnostic Lab Pvt. Ltd., Biratnagar Mahanagarpalika Ward No. 4, and medicine support from Amtech Med Pvt. Ltd. Biratnagar. ENT, Gynecologist Dermatologist, Pediatrician, General Physician, and Surgeon were among the medical professionals in attendance. 1500 pamphlets were handed out in 5 communities in the three days health camp. Twenty medical professionals checked both adults and children for general health checks. All the residents received free medicines and blood sugar checks. About 500 people of neighboring villages benefits from the camp. The overall cost of the health camp was Rs. 81,000.

Wheel chair distribution: Ten wheelchairs were given away by RC Yala to various organizations: 4 to Sankhu Kathmandu's Conflict Victim Disabled Society. To Shyampati Health Post, Namobuddha, Kavre, there is one wheelchair, one to Daapcha Health Post in Kavre, two to a medical rehabilitation organization. One wheelchair each was donated to the Mother Nepal Child Home in Tarkeswor and the Nepal Disabled Women Association.

RC Kathmandu Downtown organized a Mega Health Camp in Tokha Municipality-2 on July 30. Medicines worth Rs 500,000 were distributed free of cost at the health camp. Around 500 people benefited from the health camp. On 17 Sep. 2022, the club organized another health camp in collaboration with Green City Hospital at Tarkeshwor, Kathmandu in order to provide health assistance for the local people of that area. The club organized yet another health camp at Buddhist Service Center Goldhunga, Balaju Nepal on 22 October. Free health kits and medicines were distributed. 375 locals had the opportunity to get general treatment & medicine for skin, bone and joint, gynecology and obstetrics, heart and dental diseases. 32 health workers provided the health services, including doctors and nurses with Rotarians. Hospital will treat at a 15% discount. Next health camp was organized on the occasion of Losar at Tudikhel, Kathmandu by the club with

Rtn. Dr. Moti Kumar Shrestha on December 30, 2022. During the camp 450 people were provided health service. On the 7 and 8th of January, a 2-day health camp was conducted at Shivpuri rural municipality 6 ward office under the joint effort of Rotary Club of Kathmandu DownTown and Greencity Hospital. 590 local residents were examined by 3 doctors and 4 staff-nurses providing gyno, bone-joints, asthma and cold-related services.

Distribution of wheelchairs and warm clothing: RC Kasthamandap gave away 4 wheelchairs and Rs.20,000 worth of warm to disabled people of Bhakhari and Jhorahat Morang District in two separate places. Over 30 locals, including the ward chairpersons from Jhorahat Morang's Mrs. Durga Devi Sardar and Bhakhari's Mr. Hira Lal Kamat.

RC Kasthamandap distributed two wheelchairs to disabled senior citizens in Samajik Bihar, Chatar. The club also gave away blankets, white sticks, senior citizen sticks to 32 people in Dharan at a cost of Rs,50,000 contributed by club members. Some 85 people including members of Samjik Bihar, Jaycees, businessmen and social workers

Two wheelchairs and 25 blankets were provided to Susta Manasthiti Sasokar at Suranga, Kankai, Jhapa at a cost of Rs 30,000 funded by PP Prabhu Ram Bhandary and PP Niranjan.

Rotary E-club of Medicofusion Hybrid Nepal organized two free health camps in February at Murgiya, Rupandehi and Shandhikharka, Arghakhanchi, jointly with Deurali Yatayat and Meditech International Hospital at Shandhikharka, Arghakhanchi. More than 600 patient had benefited from the specialist consultation services.

Distribution Electric Cooking and Wheelchairs: RC Kasthamandap visited Pithouli, Nawalparasi for a three-day service project with the goal of reducing the use of LPG gas for cooking. The club also organized Eye and Dental Camp\_@ Pithouli Health Post. 85 persons received glasses out of 154 participants who had eye exams. In addition, 71 individuals received dental examinations and treatment from Dr. Bimala and staff. Dr. Bimala and PP Gyanedra Lal Pradhan funded the cost of the medication for the dental examination.

RC E-Club Of Medicofusion Hybrid Nepal staged a fruitful multi-specialty health camp at Kalika secondary school, in collaboration with Ribdikot VDC. The 25 paramedics and 17 specialty doctors provided comprehensive healthcare. The health camp served a sizable number of people who might not have otherwise had access to healthcare. 587 patients were screened, 98 lab tests, 50 pap smear tests and 121 ultrasounds were done.

RC Blratnagar provided 4 sets of Cardiac Monitors to the district hospital in Inaruwa Sunsari. The hospital received medical equipment costing Rs. 5 Lakhs. The club also gave away Rs.7 lacs worth of medical equipment. The health camp was a valuable and much-needed resource for the community it served.

The Rotary Club of Birgunj held a blood donation camp on April 8, 2023, at Rotary Mahaveer Jaipur Rehabilitation Center. A total of 46 donors—5 women and 41 men—donated blood.

Rotary Club of Yala hosted a Blood Donation program on the 74rth birthday of Madan Krishna Shrestha In a selfless effort to contribute to the community . On the occasion of legendary artist Mr. Madan Krishna Shrestha's birthday, Rotary Club of Yala organized a blood donation program

in associated with Lalitpur Ward #16, and Nepal Cancer Relief Society. Held at the Patan Durbar Square on April 23, the event saw an overwhelming response from donors; and participants who generously gave their blood to help those in need.

A successful Retinoblastoma awareness campaign was launched by the Rotary Club of Yala in collaboration with Open Eyes Nepal in a number of hospitals and nursing schools in order to increase public awareness of this uncommon type of childhood eye cancer. Doctors from the Tilganga Institute of Ophthalmology led the educational sessions and offered insightful commentary on the significance of early detection and fast treatment of retinoblastoma specifics. The resource people involved were:

- On May 24, 2023, at Prasuti Griha: Dr. Purnima Rajkarnikar Sthapit
- May 25, 2023: Dr. Malita Amatya from the Manmohan Memorial Institute of Health Science
- May 28, 2023: Dr. Anushree Adhikary from the Kathmandu Model Hospital School of Nursing, and
- June 1, 2023: Dr. Purnima Rajkarnikar Sthapit, Kanti Hospital.

During the presentation, Umang Sharma, Suchita Shrestha and Rabin Shrestha gave a quick introduction on Open Eyes Nepal, and the Club president Rtn. Gautam Shrestha and former president Rtn Sushil Bajracharya emphasized the crucial role that Rotary clubs play.

A total of 255 attendants were present during these 4 events.

Support for Cancer Patients: Rotary Club of Yala donated Rs.55,000 to support two people receiving chemotherapy for liver and breast cancer, respectively. Anjana Biswokarma, a 42-year-old breast cancer patient, and Putali Maharjan, a 56-year-old liver cancer sufferer, received the donation, meant to lessen the financial strains these patients are under. The Governor Council contributed Rs. 25,000 towards this cause, while the Rotary Club of Yala contributed Rs.30,000. Rotary Club of Yala Anns Group contributed

Rs. 5,000 specifically for food expenses for both patients. Additionally,

Rtn Sarita Rajbhandary, the wife of DG Jitendra Bahadur Rajbhandary, contributed Rs. 4,000 to cover transportation expenses for the two patients and their family.

Rotary Club of Nagarjung supported the Rotary club of Bombay Mid-City to organise donation of PFT machine on 28th June 2022 and 16 Cadd Plus Pumps equipment to the Actrec at Tata Memorial Hospital Kharghar on 1st June 2023. The project was done under the Global Grant GG 2230528 \$ 61,951.

#### 3. Water & Sanitation

Rotary Club of Dhulikhel handed over the Drinking Water Project to Judigau Drinking Water User Committee Kavre-Nepal, received the Drinking Water Project under Global Grant GG no. 2122171. Gravity flow is used to provides water to 120 houses (+ 600 people) over a distance of 7.5 kilometers. It will a huge relief to women who spend hours to fetch water. The neighborhood has previously received instruction in fundamental hygiene and health.

Edwards Rotary Club, Rotary Club of Vail, Rotary Club of Fort Collins, Rotary Club of Denver Lodo, Rotary Club of Northglenn-Thornton, Rotary Club of Castle Rock High Noon, Rotary Club of Boulder, Rotary Club of Highlands Ranch, Rotary District 5470, Rotary International District 5450, the Rotary Foundation and Frank Boot, the Rotary Club of Denver Southeast, were international partner, is supporting this project.

Service to Manavsewa Ashram, Tintolia, Blratnagar, with free eye exams, and distribution of free eyeglasses to those in need. Medicines were given to individuals in need. All of the residents of Manavsewa Ashram received snack baskets. 86 mentally handicapped persons of ashram along with their staffs were benefited from this effort. 17 patients received free cataract surgery from Ramlal Golchha Eye Hospital. The project's price tag was Rs.94,500.

RC of Blratnagar Downtown carried out need-based, service projects, that discovered 73 out of 100 homes lacked essential amenities like toilets and many lacked access to drinking water. The club built 73 toilets and put 21 hand pumps in communal housing as part of GG 2238917. Moreover, 20 hand pumps were repaired. On February 28, 2023, a handover ceremony was held to the residents of the Kharji village, who had alerted the club about the awful state of sanitation.

Water & Sanitation facilities in Phulchowki Secondary School, Thaiba, Godawari Municipality "WASH in Schools" project is to improve the health of the school children of the school. Major components of this project were: (i) Better and user friendly sanitation and hygiene facilities: construction of toilets, hand washing, and solid waste management; (ii)

Build well and (iii) Access to safe drinking water.

Water Station: Every school has specific requirements for water accessibility.

There were no safe drinking water facility at Kharji-adopted Shree Jyoti Adharbhoot Vidhyalaya. In order to ensure that students, employees, and teachers are properly hydrated throughout the day, the RC of Biratnagar Downtown built a water station under GG 2238917. Rs. 524,000 was spent to develop the water station project.

#### 4. Maternal & Child Health

Rotary Club of Biratnagar Downtown conducted a training course on how to make reusable cloth pads as part of its "Happy Village Project." The shelf life of these pads is 6 to 12 months. The marginalized community benefited from this program by saving money on disposable pads each month and from the training they receive to create and sell the pads, which will enable them to become self-sufficient. The instructors were from Mahendra Morang Adarsh Multiple Campus.

Rotary Club of Biratnagar Downtown distributed sweaters with Rotary Emblem embroidered on them to the students of Shree Jyoti Adharbhoot Vidyalaya of village, Kharji. NIC ASIA sponsored the sweaters.

We believe that students can fully concentrate on their studies when they feel warm during the cold season.

Cervical and breast cancer screening for women:

Rotary and Spouse Clubs Ratnanagar jointly organized free cervical and breast cancer screening for women at Kalika Municipality Ward No. 9 Shaktikhor, Chitwan.

Marginalized Chepang women and women from other communities were examined. The health camp was Inaugurated by Kalika Municipality Mayor Mr. Binod Regmi and women were examined for cervical and other diseases. 106 women were screened for cervical and breast cancer and video X-ray was conducted in the camp. The camp was organized in collaboration with BP Koirala Memorial Cancer Hospital, Maulakalika Hospital, Shaktikhor Health Post, Nepal Ausadhi Byabasayi Sangh Chitwan, Rotaract Club Of Ratnanagar and Shakti Youth Club.

The Rotary E-club of Medicofusion Hybrid Nepal jointly with Chhaya hospital Shandhikharka Arghakhanchi completed a free surgical camp at Chhaya hospital from March 25 to 27, providing essential medical services to patients in need. The camp offered both major and mimor surgical procedures to patients, improving their quality of life. In addition, ultrasound and Lab tests were also conducted to diagnose and treat various health issues. Total 683 patients were screened, 273 ultrasound, 512 lab test, 12 major and 18 minor surgery and free medicine distribution was done.

On March 22, 2023, the Ramial Golchha Eye Hospital in Biratnagar provided technical support for a collaborative event between the RC of Biratnagar Downtown and Tillganga Ramlal Golchha Eye Hospital called "Free Eye Screening and Cataract Operation Camp.

On 8th March, 2023 on the occasion of 113th international women's day, Rotary and Rotaract's club of Chitwan jointly organized food, stationary, medicine and sanitary pads distribution and women's awareness program at Shree Janaki Gargi Gurukulam. Rotary District 3292 Jarno award winner and journalist Pratima Silwal talked about Women Empowerment and Sexual Harassment.

The club also provided 10 computers under a District grant to Pashupati Shiksha Sadan, Bhmrahawa to establish computer lab at school.

RC Butwal Downtown organized mega health camp in Satyawati Rural Municipality Bharse, Gulmi m the coordination with Satyawati Rural Municipality, Gulmi, Chandrakot Rural Municipali, Gulmi and Kaligandaki Rural Municipality Gulmi on January 28, 2023. The camp was focusing on Women and children. Dr Sharmila Sharma (Gynecologists), Dr. Kiran Subedi (Child Doctor), Dr. Shambu Khanal and Dr Sudip Bhandari (Physician) treated more than 450 patients. 15 of them were VIA TEST positive to cancer patient and they were referred to Lumbini province hospital and the club made agreement to support the patient for treatment. Different Medical distributor supported the camp by providing free medicine for the patients.

Rotary Club of Biratnagar Downtown established a campaign to educate pregnant women on proper nutrition and hygiene. Rtn. Dr. Mamta Verma, gynecologist, served as the resource person. In addition to the importance of nutrition and hygiene and the advantages of antenatal check-ups, information on how to care for a pregnant family member and how to prepare for delivery was presented through presentations. More than 50 expectant women benefited. All recipients received baskets containing maternity clothes, Horlicks, biscuits, fruits, B-complex, protein powder, and washing and bathing soaps.

The Rotary and Rotaract Clubs of Chitwan hosted a routine health checkup and diabetes test camp

at Rotary Karunalaya Briddhashram on April 22, 2023. 33 older people were examined and given medication. Rtn. Chandra Man Shrestha, President of Rotary Karunalaya and Past President of RC Chitwan, spoke on behalf of Rotary Karunalaya about the value of health camps and wrapped up the session with prayers of thankfulness.

### 5. Basic Education & Literacy

A disabled girl was given educational supplies by RC Pokhara Annapurna on September 18, 2022. The DG and Guests handed over a cheque of Rs.12,000 to Pabita Nepali, a physically disabled girl child. The club has been supporting her for past 11 years. She is currently studying in 9th standard in SOS Hermann Gmeiner Schoo The club has also been supporting the school annually, by contributing Rs. 18,000 yearly for the school scholarship program to financially deprived children.

RC Biratnagar Fusion gave 300 school bags to Mr. Kashiraj Dahal, the CDO of Biratnagar, for the schools in the Sindhu Pal Chowk neighborhood. This school was damaged by the 2015 earthquake. The club extends special thanks to Mr. Atul Goyal of the Monica Bag Center for the bags.

RC Biratnagar Fusion provided 300 children with food and chocolates as part of their celebration of Literacy Day at Aadarsh Balika Vidyalay. The stationery materials had the Rotary logo and the Four Way Test printed on them.

Rotary Club of Biratnagar Downtown distributed 150 umbrellas to school students (including 105 girls) of

Shree Jyoti Adharbhoot Vidhyalaya, Kharji. Adult Literacy and Sewing course was also provided to Kharji community people.

Rotary Club of Kasthamandap participated in the 35th annual general meeting of Nepal Association for Welfare of Blind (NAWB) on 3rd September 2022. Club President Yadab handed over Rs 150,000 to 15 SEE topper blind students from different parts of Nepal. Rs. 10,000.00 was handed over to 15 students. On the occasion brail Nepali book was also donated by CP Gajendra to NAWB.

In the winter, the Sree Baraho Prathmik Vidyalay Debpur students received 90 sweaters from the Rotary and Rotaract Clubs of Narayani Midtown, sponsored by Keshav Raj Burtel. Ward presidents, society presidents, school principal, teachers, guardians, etc. were present in the program.

Rotary Club of Chitwan handed over sports materials at Shree Basic School m Bharatpur 17, Laungata. The school principal and the school management committee received the papers.

On October 22, RC Kathmandu Downtown held a health camp in the Buddhist Service Center Goldhunga, Balaju Nepal. Free medical supplies and medications were given out in association with Green City Hospital. 375 residents benefitted from the general medical care and medication for heart, dental, skin, bone, and joint, gynecological, and obstetrical conditions at the health camp. There were 32 health professionals, including Rotarians and doctors and nurses. Among the patients, those with lower economic levels received free care from Green City Hospital, while those who come from the camp for treatment will receive a 15% discount

RC Patan Durbar Square organized a walkathon for a healthy lifestyle on November 12, 2022 starting from Patan Durbar Square - Mangal Bazaar- Pulchowk- Kupondol and Maitighar Mandala.

Deputy Mayor of KMC, Sunita Dangol was among the 100 participants in the event.

Rotary Clubs of Biratnagar handed over a Happy School under a Global Grant project.

"Happy School" creates an atmosphere where children, parents and teachers all feel happy about their school under the Rotary Nepal Literacy Mission focusing on TEACH program. Rotary Club of Biratnagar Downtown adopted Shree Birat Mahendra Ratri Secondary School and converted it into Happy School by renovating and painting the entire school building including classrooms, toilets, doors, windows & boundry wall. Electric wiring was changed. Railing, Water station, Library, computer room with tables ,desks & benches, montessori room with various games, office, Teacher's training etc.

The Rotary Club of Yala and its Anns Group has supported Disabled Service Association, Bungmati Lalitpur since 2010 for the educational development and general well-being of differently-abled children living in the Centre. Mr Dayaram Maharjan of Disabled Service Association had requested RC Yala for urgently needed Braille Papers for blind children studying at Adarsa Saula School at Karyabinayak, Bungamati. The Braille books are essential but expensive for the school to purchase on its own. On January 13, 2023 Rotary Club of Yala handed over the Braille papers to the Centre

Rotaract Club Of Bhaktapur initiated "Project Sikshya - A Ray of Hope. In phase one, stationery and bags were distributed to the students of Sharada Secondary School, Yalachhen, Bhaktapur with support of our Parent Club, Rotary Club of Bhaktapur. "Caravan Readymade Company" provided the bags required for the project.

Similarly, "Praud Sikshya" is the second phase of "Project Sikshya-A Ray of Hope" mainly focused on teaching community women to read and write along with basics of how to use smart phones. 15 women from the age group of 40- 60 years took a month long project which started from first of Chaitra. The supporting hands were Mount Valley English School that helped us by providing classrooms, stationery items and foods to run this project.

RC Bhaktapur initiated Free Barista and Waiter Training to 10 hearing-impaired individuals. Funded of \$1,000 contributed from the District Grant and an additional \$1,000 from the TMNL-FOUND Project Nepal for the comprehensive two-week training program equipped participants with hospitality skills. Despite their hearing impairment, the trainees showcased remarkable talent and dedication, proving their excellence in any professional capacity.

Following the training, participants are undergoing internship at Café Beans Bhaktapur, to further enhancing their practical skills.

After the internship, the Club will coordinate with potential employers to secure suitable job placements, ensuring the trainees' skills are put to use in gainful employment. This noble initiative represents a significant step towards inclusivity, empowering individuals with special abilities to achieve their aspirations, and serves as an inspiration for future opportunities

## 6. Economic & Community Development

Rotary Club of Yala and its Anns group distributed food items (80 kg potato, 50 kg onion, 12 kg pulses, 8 kg cabbage, 2 boxes noodles and I piece of Wheelchair to Conflict Victim and disable Society Nepal. More than 60 people benefitted from this program.

On October 10, the Rotary Club of Biratnagar Downtown launched "Mushroom Farming Training" project at Shree Jyoti Adharbhoot Vidhyalaya in Kharji as part of the "Happy Village Project" with the goal of empowering women, supported by RCC members and nearby communities in organizing the 5 days training by instructor is Rajan Rajwanshi. The theory portion of the training was preceded by the practical portion. It will take 35 to 40 days to harvest the first batch of mushrooms. The women involved in this project will become more independent with some income generation.

Rotary Club of Chitwan held a sewing machine handover program in Bharatpur 22, Patihani. The Machme was given to financially vulnerable Gamreshwori Mahato.

5-day training program for floral arrangement for five underprivileged women was completed in partnership with Radhe Radhe Flower Junction, Rotary Club of Narayani Midtown, Rotaract club, and WEAN Chitwan. Jobs will be provided for them in accordance with their training. Mandaps, automobiles, bouquets, and other decorations are examples. Mr. Manoj Ranabhat, the president of ward 2, served as the event's special guest.

### 7. Support the Environment

Rotary Club of Biratnagar Downtown planted fruit tree in Bakhri and Barjugaon on the grounds of Gaushala, Singhia Hanuman Mandir, Sai Mandir, and Basukinath Mandir. 250 fruit tree saplings (jackfruit, mango, litchi, jamun, custard apple, amla, and guava) were planted. These plants will provide fruits, offer shade and shelter, and improve the environment by bringing greenery and fresh air. These plants will aid 100 families in Bakhri and Barjugaon as a source of income.

RC Bhaktapur planted 104 avocado and pecannut trees in Suryabinayak-8. Bhaktapur, , and Patibhanjhyang Hariyali Saamudaayik Ban Upabhokta Samiti Hariyali Saamudaayik Ban Upabhokta Samiti are taking care of the plants.

"Ek Chhaak Gailai Daan": Rotary Club of Kathmandu Downtown initiated activities to protect environment and community. In a special concern for the preservation and service of cows, the club initiated a campaign "Donate a meal for Cow". To experience the power of kindness and the joy of giving the club handed 10 donation boxes to the representatives of Godhuli, Indreni, Sky Banquet, Diyalo, Lord Palace, Basundhara, Annapurna, Yeti Events and Panas banquets in Basundhara in the last week of October. 2022.

The success of the campaign is attributed to the collective efforts of individuals, communities, and organizations that have embraced this campaign and its noble cause. It is a testament to the inherent generosity and compassion of the Nepali people and their unwavering commitment to making a positive impact on society.

We can take the abandoned cattle and reach the various cowsheds where they are kept, and we can give them food and water. We have started this campaign in order to save the environment.

Bag Distribution: 250 fabric bags bearing the message "SAY NO TO PLASTIC," the Rotary emblem and the name of the club were distributed as the first step of Rotary Club Of Biratnagar Downtown project to preserve the environment. These were provided at clubs adoptive community. To discourage the use of plastic bags, the community, Kharji, various retailers, and the gudri area. The purpose of this project is to increase public awareness of the negative environmental effects of

using poisonous, non-biodegradable plastic bags. It encourages the use of cloth bags since they are sturdy, resilient, environmentally beneficial, and can be recycled.

Cyclothon the flagship project of Rotary Club of Biratnagar Fusion was started 6 years ago and to date they have completed 4 successful events with 300+ participants. The objective of the event is to promote good health, spread greenery around the city and to raise funds for education through cycling. It was also organized to create awareness about cycling and its close relation with the environment benefits and with their hearts. Till now in Nepal, cycle is considered as poor man's transport and rich man's hobby. They had changed the perception by creating awareness of cycling as cycling is the best form of exercise that helps strengthen the heart. With this vision to beat disease and pollution together they had a major objective behind organizing this fund-raising event for the development of community and Nobel Cause.

Cyclothon is considered a National Game to which the country looks forward to. Despite of whatever situation they had 300+ participants from Dharan, Inarwa, Itahari, Kathmandu, Birtamode, Damak and Biratnagar.

'Vocational Excellence Award' for Support to Culture & Heritage: Rotary Club of Mount Everest Lalitpur proposed to "Support to Culture & Heritage" by conducting activities focused to support Culture & Heritage. The Vocational Excellence Award on "Support to Culture and Heritage" was established by RCMEL to recognize the contributions of scholars and activists engaged in the sector for its conservation and promotion. RCMEL has its plan to continue working in this new proposed focus area.

The club has prepared a list of activists, contributors and scholars in the sector of culture and heritage in Nepal. With due process, revered Shanskriti Shiromany shree Hariram Joshi as an awardee of the Life Time Achievement award and Mr. Ganapati Lal Shrestha as an awardee of Keshar Lall-Subhadra Shrestha Heritage Award were selected for the 'Vocational Excellence Award' for Support to Culture & Heritage. The Keshar Lall-Subhadra Shrestha Heritage Award was founded in the memory of late Keshar Lall Shrestha and Subhadra Shrestha, and this included a cash prize of NPR 25,000 committed by the Keshar Lall-Subhadra Shrestha family through PP Rtn. Jenny Vaidya Shrestha. The award ceremony was jointly organized by the Club with Lalitpur Centre for Culture Conservation. # **Rotary Services in Seven Areas of Focus:**

#### 1. Peace & Conflict Prevention Resolution

Self Dfence Awaremness: Rotary and Rotaract clubs of Kasthamandap and Interact club of Little Angles School organized Self Defense Awareness Campaign on November 13 in various parts of Nepal, with the objective developing physical and mental competence through a variety of drills, exercises, and techniques designed to engage their minds and develop their physical strength, coordination and endurance to promotes self- defense and security."

The Self Defense Awareness and workshop educated participants about physical and mental aspects of self-defense. Evana Manandhar suggested ideas to deal with mental health problems. Rtn Sajjan BS Thapa focused on legal aspects. Laws related with self-defense. The second phase was organized on November 20, where participants were offered basic self-defense skills. The workshop session was divided into two- time frame and was facilitated by our trainer Sajen Thapa. There were 60 participation in the awareness and 20 in workshop session.

### 2. Disease Prevention & Treatment

Rotary provided Flood Relief materials: The devastating landslides and flood that struck Sindhupalchowk district had caused inconceivable loss of lives and properties. As an immediate response, Rotary and Inner-wheel Clubs of Kantipur provided relief materials costing Rs. 655,000, including blankets, cooking utensils, potable water filter, corrugated sheets, personal hygiene packets on July 8 to 11 Sherpa families of Helambu. Rotary Club of Greenland Kathmandu also raised Rs. 50,000 plus other items (essential staple food and medical supplies plus



temporary shelter (tarpaulin sheet) and sanitizers etc. ) to support 50 families of Helambu, that were affected by the Melamchi flood.

Rotarians also distributed relief materials to the flood victims of Siddhi Village, Kalika, Chitwan on July 7, 2021, providing cooking utensils and food materials to 49 families of the affected area.

On July 5, 2021 Rotary Club of Narayangarh distributed relief materials to 30 flood-affected families of Kalika Municipality (ward no.10 and 11), whose houses were destroyed by flood and landslide. Rotary club members donated Rs. 150,000 for a bundle of rice, Dal, gram, potato, salt,

bhuja, beaten rice, dalmoth, soybean, clothes, utensils, blankets and medicines.

Rotary club of Ratnanagar distributed food items to 65 flood affected Chepang community in Kalika Municipality 9, Latauli on July 5, 2021 at a cost of Rs.157,025. On July 15, 2021, RC Narayangarh and Wine to Water, Nepal distributed relief materials to 38 flood victims of Ward No.1 at Maadi at a budget of Rs. 275,000. On July 17, RC Narayani Mid Town distributed food items worth Rs. 125,000 to 90 flood victims at various places: Bankatta, Seruwa, Bhangara and Gardi of Maadi Ward No. 1.

Rotary Club Kathmandu Downtown distributed various Relief materials at Himalayan Old Age Home, Gangabu, Buspark Kathmandu on September 19, 2021. The Home is sheltering 100 seniors citizens, most of whom are physically and mentally challenged.

Rotary club of Biratnagar downtown on October 22, 2021 lent a helped flood victims of RCC Bakhari village, Simrahi with dry food items (200 packets of biscuits, 100 packets of noodles, 100 packets of chiura & 100 packets of bhuja). The support costing of Rs 98,700 benefited 100 people of the village.

COVID 19 RELIEF: Covid-19 pandemic affected all sectors of income-generating activity. Many people lost their jobs and faced severe financial crises. Rotary clubs around the country launched support programs to help the affected people. Rotary Club of Dhulikhel supported 20 Covid-19 Lactating Mother Kits and 15 disable food packages at Bhumlu Rural Municipality. People were struggling for livelihood due to lockdown and less agricultural land.

On July 1, 2021 Rotary Club of Narayangarh handed over health & hospital equipment (12-Channel ECG machine, two Wheelchair, five Oxygen Concentrator, Automatic Hand Sanitizer Machine, Automatic Liquid Soap Dispenser, 600 units of surgical mask, 30 pieces of face shield, and 300 pieces of surgical gloves) to Madi Municipality and Baghauda Hospital Isolation Center.

Rotary Club of Purbi Chitwan handed over "Vaccine Carrier Box" to Khairahani Municipality on July 20. Rotary Club of Central Lumbini handed over COVID 19 related health materials to Mayadevi Rural Municipality, Kapilvastu on July 10, 2021. It included masks, Sanitizer, Face shield, and Soap costing US\$ 250.

RC Dhulikhel handed over Covid-19 Kits to Sunkoshi Rural Municipality. Kits included 50 PPE Sets, 5 oximeter, 5 thermal gun, 2000 3ply masks, 300 KN-95 masks, 30 face shields, 20 liters Sanitizer, 10 liters disinfect etc.

Rotary Club of Central Lumbini conducted "COVID-19 related health material distribution program" on August 6, 2021, at Universal College of Medical Science, Bhairahawa. 20 sets of PPE, 2000 pcs of Mask, 2000 pcs of Gloves, 4 Gallons of 5 liters Sanitizer, and 50 pcs of Face Shield were distributed to UCMS frontlines.

RC Hetauda established a Help Desk to spread awareness about COVID 19 and free distribution of Mask, Sanitizer, and Pure Drinking water.

RC Butwal Downtown organized Mask and sanitizer distribution program to Traffic Police office Butwal along with distribution of covid prevention materials to different schools, offices, health posts in with coordination with other clubs. The club have organized sewing and cutting training program at different part of Rupandehi.

RC Kathmandu Kalanki rendered COVID related support to help people find hospitals with oxygen supplies to manage ICU beds and ventilators needed for treatment. A vaccination program was also done during August 8 to 22, and seconddose vaccines for senior citizens, family members of Rotarians, and other non-members were done to 21,000 people were inoculated along with Rotarians of 45 different clubs.

Rotary Club of Jawalakhel handed over USD and ECG in Huwas Healthpost of Paiyun Rural Municipality, Parbat district on July 24, 2021.

RC Pokhara Fishtail distributed 150 sets of PPE, 2 sets of wheel chair, 4 sets of oxygen cylinder trolley, surgical masks to Communicable Hospital at Sisuwa to help treat more Covid-19 cases.

Health Camps: Rotary and Rotaract Clubs of Chitwan organized Health and Dental checkup Camp at Rotary Karunalaya (Old Aged Home), Bharatpur -1 Devghat on July 24, 2021. 37 dependent senior citizens were diagnosed and treated for general health and dental related problems and provided required medicines.

Rotary club of Rupandehi conducted a specialist health camp on gynecology at Semarabazar Health post on August 6, 2021. The facilities included ultrasound, expert consultancy, genocopy for pregnant women etc. More than 50 pregnant women benefited from the program. One woman with critical complications on delivery was referred to Lumbini province Hospital and after operation both child & mother are completely safe.

Rotary Club of Central Lumbini in association with the Nepal Child Welfare Foundation conducted a Free Health checkup, Fruit, Stationery, and medicine distribution program at Bal Sudhar Griha, Bhairahawa Rupandehi on the occasion of National Children's Day on September 14, 2021.

Rotary club of Rupandehi conducted a second specialist health camp on gynecology at Semarabazar Health post on 24th Sep 2021. Club provided a whole range of facilities for pregnant women such as ultrasound facility, consultant facility, lab facility and other essential facilities to pregnant women & gynecology. More than 20 pregnant women are benefited from the program. Dr, Tara K.C. consultant gynecologist of the universal college of Medical sciences support to program to provide consultant service in a rural area.

RC Biratnagar Downtown marked "The World Heart Day" by doing health checkup of Senior Citizens at the Club's adopted old age home: Birat Vriddhashram on September 19, 2021 with 4 Doctors and 16 medical team. ECG screening with diagnosis was done. Those with more issues were referred to the hospital for further free treatment. Fruits and juice were distributed to all the seniors.

Rotary Club of Rajdhani organized a "Free Eye Cataract Screening Camp" with technical support of Matrika Eye Centre, Kathmandu in association with Jayal Kumari Saving and Credit Cooperative Ltd. on October 30, 2021 at Ganga Jamuna Jamuna School Premises, Lele Ward no 5 of Godavari Municipality, Lalitpur. All together 440 locals came for Eye Screening Checkup and 63 patients were detected with Cataracts. Matrika Eye Centre fixed the schedule for free surgery for those patients on November 13, 2021 for the surgery. The club also distributed free medicines and spectacles frames for the needy ones.

Rotary Club of Gangabu organized a "Child Health Camp" on November 26, 2021, at Dharma Vidhyaashram Aadharvut Vidhyalaya. 125 students from Dharma Vidhyaashram Aadharvut Vidhyalaya and Saraswoti Aadharvut Vidhyalaya benefited from this health camp which was supported by Doctors and Nurses of Siddhi Hospital, Kantipur Dental College and Bir Hospital. Free consultation, checkup & medicine were provided to the students.

Rotary club of Rupandehi conducted 4th specialty health camp. at Dhadhai Primary Health Care Centre, Rohini Rural municipality, Rupandehi on Nov.26, 2021. Club served patients in five different areas, namely Medicine, Surgery, Gynaecology, Dermatology, and pediatrician. Medicines were also given to the as per the doctor's prescription. Total 287 patients are benefited from the health camp at a cost of Rs. 370,000.

Rotary & Rotaract Clubs of Chitwan jointly organized a Health camp for senior citizens of Rotary Karunalaya where 38 senior citizens benefitted with a health check-up, blood pressure, sugar level measurement, and prescribed medicine.

Rotary Club of Butwal Chautari on 17 December 2021 conducted a free health camp at Gaidhawa-7 in Rupandehi. A total of 660 people received free medicine worth Rs. 2,50,000 and checkups at the camp. Physician Dr. Hari Prasad Panthi, Dr. Netra Bahadur Thapa (Nose and Ear), Dentist Dr. Shisir Aryal, Pediatrician Dr. Sandeep Sakya, Physiotherapist Dr. Prakash Gupta, Dr. Nilkanth Aryal, Dr. Sunil G.C, Dr. Sandeep Gupta, Dr. Ram Panthi was participating in a health camp. The health camp was co-organized by Gaidhawa Smart Agriculture Cooperative Society and Lumbini Development Forum. Simli Dental Care Pvt Ltd, Butwal, and Vivan Pharmacy played the role of supporting organizations in the camp. On the Occasion, Chief Guest Khim Lal Bhattarai thanked the Club family for providing various free health camps.

RC Dillibazar Organized Free Eye CATARACT Screening Camp on November 27, 2021 at Mangalodaya Secondary School, Thankot, with the Coordination of Matrika Eye Centre of Old Baneshwar, Local Government body & school authority. 400 eye patients were examined and 74 had recognized cataracts, who were freely operated by Matrika Eye Centre Old Baneshwar.

Rotary Club of Biratnagar Downtown organized a Dental health check-up & awareness program on December 8 at Mahendra Ratri Vidyalaya, Biratnagar. Dr. Abhishek Kumar BDS, MDS, Ph.D. perodontist and his team did a check- up of all students, staff, and teachers of the school. He also visited Cerebral Palsy Center and provided dental check-up help to Cerebral Palsy children and staff as well. A total of 50 people benefitted from this project costing Rs. 7,000 sponsored by Charter President Rtn. Dr. Mamata Verma.

Rotary Club of Bhaktapur on January 2, 2022 organized a health camp at UCEP Nepal, Bhaktapur. Rotary Club of Pokhara Newroad organized 'Health Camp' for the natives of Chandrawati Bazar of Bhanu Municipality, Tanahun on January 8, 2022. Altogether 520 people benefited from the Camp with technical supported of Manipal Teaching Hospital and Galaxy Hospital Pokhara in association with Baba Foundation Nepal.

The local benefited from the general body screening with random blood sugar tests and video x-rays, Eye Check-up, Nerves and Bones check-up, Child illness, and Women Health issues free medicines for the people. Eye-specialist screened more than 300 patients and around 100 were

reported as having Cataract out of which 30 were found to be operable. 50 patients were found to have Presbyopia. Eye drops, medicines with the antibiotics and 100 reading glasses were provided to the needy people.

RC Hetauda organized eye camp from December 16 to 21, 2021 Brindavan Na.pa.1 Rautahat, Manahari Municipality 1 Makari Makawanpur and in Mahahari Municipality 3 Hadikhola Makwanpur with the support from Rotary Club of Tasmanian, Australia. The camp screened 875 patients, out of which 154 were diagnosed with Cataract cases and 122 were operated

Rotary Club of Narayani Mid Town conducted free eye screening and glass distribution program to students of Shree Rastriya Ma. Vi. Gardas, Chitwan on January 5, 2022. Eye screening of total 417 students were done and spectacles were distributed to 5 children whose vision need to be corrected.

RC Bharatpur organized a health checkup and medicine distribution camp at Rotary Children's Day Care Center. A medical team from BP Koirala Memorial Cancer Hospital examined 56 students and their guardians and were provided with free medicines.

Vaccination Drive: RC Kathmandu Kalanki rendered Covid-related support (oxygen supplies, managing ICU beds and ventilators etc) needed for the treatment in coordination with Association of International through Damian Foundation to inoculate as many as possible during August 8 to 22 August, inoculating 7000 people along with Rotarians of 39 different clubs.

A total of 40 dogs were successfully vaccinated.

The medical team, Self Help Group Cerebral palsy (SHGCP) examined 12 kids of CP Day care center. #### 4. Maternal & Child Health

Support Orphanage: On 25 August 2021, RC Lalitpur delivered 5 storage racks worth NRs 45,000 to Snehi Kakh, a non-profit organization serving and accommodating the needy people from street, at Kusunti Lalitpur. Altogether 75 people including 35 children were residing and benefitting from the organization on the day of club's visit. Realizing the poor management of storage stuff at the organization, RC Lalitpur had supported the racks to them. President Rtn Rose Shrestha, Secretary, PP Rtn Manoj B Shrestha with spouse Gindira Shrestha, Treasurer PP Rtn Rupak Das Tamrakar with spouse Angur Tamrakar and PP Rtn Shyam K Maharjan were present during the handover program.

## 5. Basic Education & Literacy

School Support: RC Kopundol supported 150 students of Bal Rashtriya Adharbhut School Gothatar, Kathmandu with uniform and warm clothing and stationaries and to 150 students of grade 1-3 Bal Rastriaya Adharbhut school. The project cost of Rs 250,000 was sponsored by Dr. Surya Prakash Shrestha.

Rotary E Library: DG Santosh Rijal inaugurated Rotary e-Library at Durga Adaharbhut School Chitwan on December 24, 2021 in a ceremony organized by Rotary Club of Chitwan. A Smart TV received from Rotary Nepal Literacy Mission (RNLM) was also handed over to the school.

After completing their school, The students are encouraged to undergo vocational training or study technical subjects like nursing, health assistant, overseer, agricultural technician, electrician, etc. Until now over 200 students have completed their education and are serving the nation in different field

Rotary Child Education Cente: On July 10, the Rotary Club of Narayangarh laid down foundation stone to construct a Rotary Child Education Center at Devghat. The project is expected cost NPR 1 million and will benefit 38 families.

Adult Literacy Program: Rotary Club of Biratnagar Downtown marked "International Day for Girl Child" on October 11, 2021 with Adult Literacy Program for 20 adult women at Janta Secondary School, Jahada-2, Majhare. A local villager and RCC young volunteer, Madhu Mandal assisted in organizing the program. The Club had provided books, copies, pencils, erasers, scales, a sharpener, one cloth bag to each student worth Rs.8,000. The project with a cost of Rs 8,000 and will benefit 20 individuals.

Classroom Handover: Rotary Club Kathmandu Mid-Town handed over newly constructed classrooms at Shree Azad Basic Government School on 19 November 2021. There are two classrooms completed and desks and new furniture have been installed. The children at Shree Azad Basic School benefitted

Laptops for E Learning: Due to the onslaught of Covid-19, educational institutions became the first and immediate victims of the lockdowns imposed to contain the spread of COVID 19. Schools in Nepal started virtual/online classes around September 2021 when symptoms of the coronavirus appeared. Due to the lack of hardware (laptops) Shri Buddha Secondary School, Badegaun, Lalitpur was able to conduct only 40% of their total classes through the virtual/online. The school required ten laptops so that they could conduct all the regular classes without interruption (to reach 100%). Rotary Club of Kantipur, provided 10 HP laptops to the school under the TEACH program. Total cost of Rs 610,000 was raised from among the club members.

Rotary Club of Biratnagar Fusion distributed School Bags to 120 students under the Happy School project to classes 4, 5, and 6 at Shri Beganlal Vidyalaya School, which is also the adopted school of the club. Rotaract Club of Biratnagar Fusion and Interact Club of Biratnagar Fusion participated in the program alongside the Club.

Digital Learning Support To School: Many schools are implementing digital technologies as a part of normal educational procedures. Amidst this, some government schools in Nepal have received the Information and Community Technology (ICT) materials while many are still in queue or haven't been able to apply for the funding. One of these schools is Jana Uddhar Secondary School, Budhanilkantha. Most children from this school are from daily wage working families. Rotary E-Club District 3292 Nepal utilized the District Grant and match it to provide 3 brand new HP computer systems and UPS to the school. This will enable the teachers to integrate digital learning in any subject matter while the students can get used to this method of learning which shall enable them to participate in the larger digitally competitive education as well as a career in their future.

Mudita Bhawan Handover Of School Building: Rotary Club of Patan on January 15, 2022 "inaugurated Mudita Bhawan at Anandakut Vidhyapeeth School, Swoyambhu, Kathmandu. The school building was reconstructed with funding from its alumni, the Rotary Club of Patan with support of Rotary International District 3292-Earthquake Relief, Rehabilitation & Reconstruction Program (ERRRP).



Anandakuti Bidhyapeeth School Reconstruction Project was completed at a cost of Rs. 6.4 million.

Sweaters: Rotary Club and Spouse of Chitwan distributed Sweater to 130 students from Grade Nursery to Grade Five on January 4, 2022 at Balkumari Secondary School in collaboration with

Fertilizer bottles, tarpaulins, mustard oil, 4 packets of medicine for good harvest etc.). at a cost of Rs 25,000 to benefit 30 people. Mushrooms in the first phase wes harvested in 45 days in excellent quality.

Rotary and Rotaract clubs of Dharan organized women empowerment program for women of remote areas in September 10, 2021. Sanitary pad were distributed for the needy ones and also conducted menstrual health awareness program for 80 girls.

The training included the basic methods of food processing as well as the details of processing Lapsi to produce the Lapsi preserve, Lapsi relish (sweet), Lapsi relish (hot and sweet), and by-products like Lapsi skin dried powder and Lapsi drink. With the theoretical and practical class of drying in the solar house dryer made for the training basic information on packaging and making a brand name and label for the product.

Rotary Club of Chitwan in the support of Salt Trading Corporation Ltd. and Arun Stationary organized a school bag and stationary materials distribution program at Shree Shree Kaligandaki Primary

School December 6, 2021, where 69 Childrens are studying. The support includes 100 school bags, 80 dozen Note Books, 80 dozen pen, and 80 dozen pencils.MAANOVER

The program trained 100 ladies from marginal and scheduled categories. 25 students were also trained at Chure Shikhar Agriculture Cooperative and 25 students at the Rotary Building Hetauda 4 Hupra.

### 7. Support the Environment

Tree Plantation: Rotary and Rotaract Clubs of Rajdhani organized a tree plantation program on July 1, 2021, in Sanepa Road outside. On July 17, 2021, the clubs organized a plantation of various kinds of fruit trees like avocado, orange, and lemon on the premises of Ashadeep at Nayapati, Sundarijal. On July 12, 2021, Rotary club of Hetauda distributed 500 saplings of fruits at various places of Hetauda. 1000 Tree plantation were also carried out at Haandikhola, Manahari Gaunpalika-3 with the cooperation of Bagmati Province Government

On July 19, Rotary Club of Butwal Downtown organized a tree plantation in the road divider of Siddhartha Highway from Milanchok to Rajmarga Chauraha and Rotary Garden on the auspicious occasion of the 20th Installation of the club. A total of Rs. 20,000 was raised from the club members to support this program.

Around 360 plants of various flowers and fruits were planted. School, Bharatpur-11 on July 31, 2021. 90 plants of different fruits were planted at school premises and the rest 90 were distributed at Bharatpur-22. Rotary and Rotaract Clubs of Kopundol, organized a 'Tree Plantation Program' at UN Park Kopundol on July 30 and 31 2021 to beautify the landscape and also restore the ecosystem of the park. The Divisional Forest Office was also present in the programme. Different saplings such as Kapur (Cinamomom camphora), Jamun (Syzygiun cumini), Kainyo (Gravelia robusta), Bottlebrush (Callistemon lanceolatus), Sirish (Jacaranda minosifolia), Bay Leaf/Tejpatta (cinnamomum

tamala), Gauva (Psidium guajava), Dhupi (Juniperus indica) and many others suitable for the mid hills of Nepal. A total of 140 tree saplings were planted in the UN park, Kopundol.

On September 15, 2021, a group of Rotarians from the Rotary Club of Kantipur, departed for Majhimtar, about 62 km from Kathmandu on the Prithvi Highway. The plantation site is on a landslide-prone hillside below Thingmang Village some 2 km off the main highway. The team selected some landslide-prone sites, where they planted 500 seeds of Bambusa bamboo, commonly known as the Indian Spiny Bamboo by using the seed dibbling technique (as recommended). RC Hetauda planted Bambo seed, at Chitre Pani community forest users group. More than 2000 seeds were planted

Handover of Solar Items: Solar Lamps and Food Items worth Rs. 335,000/- were handed over to the children from 56 deprived families of Bheriganga – 1 Dhanubas Surkhet at Chhinchu on August 22, 2021. It is believed that the students of Dhanubas will enjoy their studies and get an opportunity to improve their academic standards after the implementation of this project.

Cycling for Environment: Rotary E-Club of District 3292, Nepal organized a cycling program on August 21, 2021, with 20 participants including members of Rotaract Club of Kathmandu Metropolis, Interact Club of LRI School, and Rotakids of E-Club of District 3292. Hundreds of Rotarians, Rotaracters and Interactors participated and planted 300 trees, jointly organized by Rotary Club of Saibu Bhaisepati, Rotary Club of Jawlakhel Manjushree, and Rotary E-Club of District 3292, Nepal. Tree saplings were sponsored by Green Valley Green Nepal Campaign & Rotary Club of Tripureswor.

RC Tinau organized a Drug Abuse Awareness program from July 31 to August 2, 2021. This three-day program was conducted through District Grant and was very beneficial as per the review of the participants. This program in Marchwari Adarsh Higher Secondary School, Kothimai Village Municipality

RC Narayangarh organized the Narayani River bank cleaning program on 12 September 2021. The club in association with RC Ratnanagar, RC Gaidakot, RC Kawasoti, Wine to Water Nepal, and Devghat Rural municipality jointly organized 500 sawyer water filters and 500 buckets distribution at Ward no. 3, 4, and 5 of Devghat rural municipality on September 26, 2021. This project cost of Rs. 2,700,000 will benefit 500 villagers.

Cycling: On the occasion of World Polio Day, region 3 opf the District organized Cycling and Walkathon on October 24, 2021. The event was hosted by 4 clubs viz. Rotary E-Club of District 3292 Nepal, Rotary Club of Jawalakhel Manjushree, Rotary Club of Sainbu Bhainsepati and Rotary Club of Himalayan Patan

Heritage Walk: On October 23, 2021, RC Yala initiated a Heritage Tour with members of RC Madhyapur Thimi. The tour, which started from Shankhadhar Park, Thimi, went along different heritages of Thimi to Nagadesh and concluded in Bode, with scrumptious lunch at Nilbarahi banquet.

Dustbin Handover: Rotary Club of Biratnagar Downtown handed over 60 liters of 2 pc dustbin to Nagar Palika to install at Anamika Marg, Biratnagar on 16th January, 2022. Residents of Anamika Marg benefitted. From this project costing Rs 4,500. Rotary Club of Jawalakhel organized tree plantation program in Paiyun Rural Municipality, Parbat district on July 24, 2021.

### MAJOR ROTARY SERVICE PROJECTS IN NEPAL

In the past six decades of Rotary movement in Nepal, Rotary clubs have played a vital role in improving the quality of life of the people by supplementing the efforts of the Government of Nepal in many areas. Rotary has mobilized resources from around the Rotary world to undertake several community development projects in all the areas of focus including health, education, computer literacy, environment, population & development, poverty reduction, water and sanitation, micro-credit, income generating projects, hydropower, solar energy, disaster relief, earthquake rehabilitation/ reconstruction, orphanage and old-age homes, peace building and conflict resolution, Covid-19 response etc. for the overall development of Nepal.

Rotarians, as community volunteers, have invested millions of their expertise hours, particularly after a separate Rotart District for Nepal since July 1, 2008, in the selfless service of the nation to address some of the most pressing problems of under-development. The family of Rotary in Nepal involving over 6,000 professional leaders and an equal number of affiliated young force in Rotaract and Interact clubs are engaged in the voluntary service in collaboration with many other institutions and agencies. Some of the most notable service projects accomplished by Rotary in Nepal are listed below. As the great philanthropist Rotarian Gopal Raj Bhandari says "being able to provide support for a good cause is in itself a matter of satisfaction and pride for a Rotarian".

The onslaught of Covid 19 pandemic since 2019-20 has opened up unlimited opportunity for Rotary to serve in the suffering communities, while the limited the physical mobility had challenged the Rotarians to ervice the community in need. For the first time Rotary could not hold Rotary International conventions physically and had to be convened virtually for the last two years.

### 1) Water, Sanitation and Hygiene facilities at Schools 2020

The Rotary Club of Patan partnered with the Rotary Club of Vignola Castelfranco E. Bazzano and several other Rotary Clubs and Districts in Italy to improve the water, sanitation and hygiene facilities in 12 of Lalitpur in a comprehensive and sustainable manner. The Rotary Foundation of Rotary International approved a Global Grant proposal, of over US\$ 80,000 in March 2018 and the project was completed successfully by early 2020.

This project was accomplished in consultation with the World Health Organization, UNICEF, the District Education Office of the Government of Nepal and followed the government's guidelines and standards for a sustainable improvement of Water, Sanitation and Hygiene (WASH) facilities in schools in Nepal. SPLASH Nepal (Prabhav Nepal) was the implementing partner. The RCP used WHO Nepal's 'Seven Flag Approach of Total Sanitation' (7FATS) in schools as the conceptual framework to achieve sustainable improvements.

### 2) Rotary Response to Disaster Relief in Bara/ Parsa Districts in 2019

Rotarians in Nepal and around the world were deeply concerned to help the natural disaster striken people of Bara and Parsa districts, which were worse hit by the unusual tornado like powerful hailstorm, thunderstorm and lightening on March 31, 2019 that killed 29 people and injured over 700 people. The hailstorm also destroyed houses, stored grains, crops, uprooted ground water/ electricity poles and blocked road access, thus displacing life there.

Rotary response to the devastating natural disaster was instant and immediate, as the Rotarians of Rotary clubs of Birgunj and Birgunj Metropolis rushed to the affected villages of Bara and Parsa in the next morning and rescued the affected people with relief supplies including food, cloths, drinking water, medicines etc. Many of the 116 Rotary clubs of Nepal have mobilized monetary and material supplies in support of the disaster victims with food and clothes and other basic necessities distributed in coordination with local government authority.

On April 8, Rotary, in association with Armed Police Force distributed to the affected people of Bara 76 aqua boxes received from Rotary club of Wirksworth, UK together with mosquito nets (152 pieces), lady maxi, lunge and chunee shawls (76 pcs each), gent's shirts (31 pcs), lady outer, baby frock and leggings (50 pcs each), which were well received by the people of Telgai-7 Gadhimai of Bara district.

Rotary clubs around the country collected funds to supplement the Rotary Disaster Relief Fund at the Rotary District, which was offered to build 100 temporary shelters for the affected people in the areas allocated by the local government/ district authorities.

For a longer term improvement of the communities in Gadimai village, Rotary also took up one school under the Rotary's Total Literacy Mission and developed it with all the components of the mission, like Teacher support, E-learning facilities, Adult Literacy, Child Development and several other factors of a Happy school. This has become a Model School for others in the district to immolate. Rotary was deeply moved by the natural disaster and takes it as an opportunity to transform the communities for a better future

### 3) First Fibro-Scan Machine in Nepal: 2018 June:

9 Haemodialysis machines were handed over to Bir Hospital, Kathmandu on June 1, 2018 in the presence of senior Rotarian Sushil Gupta. The Fibro San machine was acquired under Rotary's Global Grant (GG) number 1641117 by Rotary Clubs of Rajdhani and DDF of Rotary District 3292 at a total cost of US\$900,000/- also funded by Holistic Service P. Ltd, Rtn. Roop Jyoti, DDF and the Rotary Foundation. Rotary club of Jaipur Royal of RI District 3054 was the international partner.

The Fibro scan is a specialized ultra-sound machine, which is used to assess the hardness and stiffness in the liver, and gives result within 5 minutes. Within 2 months of installation, 200 patients diagnosed with hepatitis C, 300 patients with hepatitis Band 150 with liver cirrhosis have received fibro-scan services in the hospital. Dr. Anil Kumar Mishra, head of Liver department at the hospital said "...it is easier to diagnose hardness in the liver without getting sample from the body".

Dr. Rajani Hada, head of department of nephrology said "addition of 9 haemodialysis machines help to provide quick service to the patients with hepatitis B, C and HIV/AIDS". Some 30-40 Nefro patients are served daily by the Haemodialysis machines. These machines were supplied by Rotar club of Kathmandu Metro.

### 4) Prajapati Education Endowment Fund (PEEF)

of Rotary Club of Patan has been supplemented by Sarswati Govinda Foundation with the largest annual contribution by a Nepali to Rotary in Nepal of Rs.10 lacs (one million) from August 29, 2017, the charter day of the club. Mr. Govinda Das Shrestha, chairman of the Foundation and of Radission Hotel, Kathmandu handed over second annual cheque of Rs.10 lacs on August 29, 2018. PEEF

was established by the club in 1991 to support scholarship programme in the public schools of Lalitpur district. As of 30 June 2018, the PEEF Trust Fund reached Rs.1 crore 20 lakh with an operational fund close to 6 Lakh. Total annual distribution is about Rs.15 lakh. This year, the club distributed scholarship to 402 students from grades 7 to 10 in 27 public schools of Lalitpur.



## 5) Micro Hydropower for Community Development in Solu Rotary Global grant project no. 1637020 US\$51,119.

In September 2018 the Rotarians of Rotary club of Patan visited the remote village of Chepel in Solukhumbu to monitor progres and completion of the Microhydro Powerplant of 15 Kw, which supported 114 families of Chepel and 10 surrounding villages, as part of a comprehensive community debelopment effort supported by tye Rotary club of Patan in collaboration with tye Rotar club of Russelshein-Mainapitze in Germany and Rotary club of Rugby in the UK, District 1080



as the international partners and the world fund match by the Rotary Foundation. The government has also supported this \$ 51,119 GG project with contribution of of \$ 37,500. This project will improve the quality of life of the people there and will halp create income generating opportunities.

### 6) Improve Basic Conditions In Selected Prisons of Nepal 2015/16

The condition in prisons in Nepal is far from any standard. Over crowding is a major problem. The 74 prisons in the country has a capacity of 6,419 persons, but they are accommodating more than 15,000 inmates. Lack of basic needs (clean drinking water, toilets and other living conditions), and balanced diet makes prisoners sick and depressed very often. Depression and regular sickness creating life-long health problems result in losses of prisoners' health conditions demanding more investment in basic health services. Prisoners often come healthy and go back with number of communicable diseases like HIV, TB, Hepatitis B and skin diseases. Inside the Jail, there are instances of frequent outbreak of these communicable diseases due to poor maintenance of simple hygienic measures.

Some Jails even lack toilets of their own. Every day, prisoners need to stand in a long queue for 2 to 3 hours to go for toilet. Separate toilets for women, children and elderly people are a far cry. Newspapers report almost every day about the pathetic condition of Jails of Nepal.

In this context, Rotary District 3292, Nepal-Bhutan in partnership with Government of Nepal, Department of Prison Management, Ministry of Home Affairs is implementing a project entitled "Improvement of Basic Facilities in Selected 32 Prisons (Jails) of Nepal". The basic facilities include providing water supply, toilets, solar lights, biogas, computers, skill development trainings etc. The action has started in the Jails in Pokhara, Bhairawa, Bhadrapur, Kathmandu etc.

### 7) Gautam Buddha Community Heart Hospital, Butwal 2015

ICU Unit in the GBF Heart Hospital was inaugurated on December 01, 2015 under the Rotary Foundation term gift of US\$301,500 with the support of fellow Rotarians of RC Butwal Downtown,

RC Butwal South and Rupandehi Chamber of Industries. Later, a fully equipped cath lab project was added in the hospital by Rotary club of Butwal under a global grant 1639691 of Rs70 million. This is the only cardiac service center in the western region of Nepal.



### 8) Jaluke Drinking Water Supply Project, Gaidakot, Nawal Parasi (2013)

Rotary Club of Narayani Mid Town complete Jaluke drinking water project at Gaidakot in Nawalparasi district, funded by the Rotary Foundation matching grant of US \$ 109,252 in partnership with Rotary Club of Fairfield, Lowa RID 6000 USA. The project constructed RCC water storage tank of 400,000 liters, 100 meter deep bore well supplying 30 liters of water supply per second to the storage tank. The project also included 4 trainings to the community to ensure its sustainability. This water supply project is providing drinking water supply to 1,100 households of the area.

### 9) Rotary Disability Awareness Project (2008)

The Rotary Foundation approved a 3H Grant no. 62861 in April 2008, worth US\$ 330,000 to bring about a definite change in the lives of the differently abled community of Nepal through multimedia campaign to create awareness about their condition, potentials, ability and personal rights that will lead to opportunity, education and productive lives. The project coincided with the beginning of a new Rotary district 3292 for Nepal from July 1, 2008. The project, focused on seven pilot districts, targeted to benefit the 72,094 people living with disabilities in these districts.

### 10) Hydropower and Solar Energy in Humla 2005

Limi Power project in Humla, the remote far western district of Nepal is taken by Rotarians of Nepal with the financxial help of Rotarians of UK. The project provides for better health care, education, food production and income generation, besides providing power to the schools, health post and lighting homes for the first time. Lali village was choosen for "the best value for money" consideration. The Rotaery cklubs of Thamel and Swoyambhu teamed up to do this \$36,475 project funded mostly by UK Rotary clubs of Maidenhead Thames, St. Nom La Bretch, Hengelo, Steinfurt and Rotary Matching Grant.

A Solar energy project initiated by Rotary club of Lalitpur in partnership with RI District 1120, 1520, 1620 and 1870 that provided \$21,606 plus \$10,988 from the Rotrey Foundation to provide solar energy to the redisents of Limi valley. The club has also iunstalled a micro-hydro project in Jang village of Humla with the Rotary Foundation fund of \$11,620 plus another \$ 11,620 from Rotary club of Northampton RI District 1070. Yet another micro-hydro project for the residents of Gothi village of Humla was launched costing \$75,300 contributed by the Rotary clubs of England, Scotland and USA matched by the Rotary Foundation.

### 11) ANM Project: Matching Grants and 3H Grants (2004)

Rotary Clubs of Kathmandu Midtown and Mount Everest along with Rotary club of Dramstad Bergstrasse started the first pilot project called ANM (Auxiliary Nurse Midwife) project in 2004 to train young women from remote districts in ANM Health Care for 18 months at a Health Institute in Kavre. Successful candidates are also trained in Micro- credit to assist the capacity building of the village women by enhancing their livelihood. This poject complemented the government's efforts to reach remote and unattained areas to provide reproductive health services and improve the lives

of many needy village women by increasing their capabilities with micro- credit opportunities. Several Matching Grant and 3H Grant projects from the Rotary International (MG 51554, 59787, 63107, 63246, 62749, 63120, 63184, 63200, 64116, 64201, 64888, 3H Grant 59787) have been mobilized to train girls from remote areas in the districts of Kavre, Sindhupalchowk, Rasuwa, Dhading, Manang, Nuwakot, Pyuthan, Ramechhap, Sankhuwasabha etc. who will sent up a clinic and do their round in their village, assist women to understand and join micro-credit system and become true Rotary Ambassador in

- Reducing maternal mortality in areas where no medical service are available,
- Ensuring the traine ANM remains in the remote village area,
- Improve the economic situation of the local people by introducing a system of micro-credit.

### 12) Rotary Karunalaya in Devghat, Chitwan 2000

Rotary Karunalaya is a home for economically underprivileged senior citizens where they can live peacefully for the rest of their lives. The Center with Thaha Sadavatra (free kitchen) provides food, shelter, clothes and provides personal care. Past President of Rotary Club Kathmandu Mid Town Rtn Dr. Chandra Lekha Tuladhar along with Past President Rtn Mahendra Lal Pradhan of RC Chitwan initiated the



establishment of Rotary Karunalaya. Many generous donors, especially late Rtn Gopal Rajbhandari, late Mr Govinda Das Shrestha, Inner Wheeler Mohan Devi Shrestha and othera have helped in building the home and its complex.

District Governor of 1998/1999 of RI District 3290 Rtn Shekhar Meheta laid the foundation stone of Rotary Karunalaya in 1999 AD, which was brought into operation in 2000 AD. It is situated in Devghat at the confluence of the Kali Gandaki and Trishuli rivers. Devghat is the place where the Gods used to come for a holy bath. The confluence of rivers is considered to be a holy place in the Hindu religion and Devghat, as a holy place of worship, is also mentioned in the Hindu Holi book of Ramayan.

Every passing day, an increasing number of underprivileged, helpless and neglected people are approaching Devghat with a hope of being served by the visiting pilgrims. However, pilgrims visit Devghat only on auspicious occasions, Keeping this problem in mind, Past President Guna Chandra Bista of RC Chitwan, in memory of his late brother Roop Chandra Bista (THAHA), contributed generously towards building a free kitchen, a common dining hall and some fund for the Karunalaya Trust. It is functional since May 5, 2009.

An autonomous executive committee consisting of senior Rotarians, Presidents of Rotary and Rotaract Clubs of Chitwan and President from Spouse Club of RC Chitwan oversees the management of Rotary Karunalaya and Rotary Thaha Sadavarta (free kitchen). This committee decides on new intake in Karunalaya as per the vacancy. All the residents are provided with free medical checkups and medicines periodically from a Regular Health Service Center (a Joint Project of RC Chitwan & Bharatpur Metropolitan City). This flagship project of RC Chitwan runs on donations in cash and kind received from kind-hearted and generous people. Donors regularly sponsor meals or even the upkeep of an elderly care home

The main objective of the project is to give an opportunity for the senior citizens to lead a dignified and meaningful life and encourage them to use their skills and capabilities for a productive purpose for the rest of their life. Currently, 36 senior citizens are benefitted from the facilities provided within Rotary Karunalaya.

Rotary Karunalaya is an exemplanery humanitarian service project so well managed to serve the needy senior citizens who are abandoned by their family and wish to spend peaceful spiritual life till they live in this holy land.

### 13) Center for Maxillofacial Surgery 1999.2000

(Rotary contribution \$ 174,405 by RID 1020 Scotland for Bir Hospital, Kathmandu. Rotarty has supported the National Dental Hospital, Panipokhari, Kathmandu in building one floor and in setting up Maxillofacial Surgery facility in the hospital.

### 14) Nepal Orthopedic Hospital, Jorpati, Kathmandu (1998)

Rotary International has awarded Matching Grants for the equipment installed. More than US\$ 700,000 was raised from 120 Rotary Clubs from over 9 RI Districts. Nine Matching Grant projects of the Rotary Foundation (listed below) were implemented out of which, 5 projects were implemented by RC Patan.

Dr. Anil Shrestha of RC Kathmandu West teamed up with Rtn. Luc Salens, from Maldegem, Belgium. Luc and raised money from various sources in Belgium for the running cost and initial capital expenses since August 1998. The surgery schedule started initially from once a week to six days a week since January 2011.

After the addition of some extra beds, NOH came into the category of a 100 beds hospital. The funding for this project came from multiple sources including Mr. Luc Salens from Belgium and Rotary clubs from Belgium. Sagarmatha general ward of the hospital was inaugurated by Rt. Honorable President Dr. Ram Baran Yadav on December 3, 2011 and since then the Hospital is operating 100 beds and providing services to the general Nepali population in an affordable manner.

The hospital has helped change the life of many physically handicapped persons, mainly from the remote parts of Nepal, who otherwise would be living an unproductive life, dependent on other people. They are now contributing to the society as equals.

### 15) National Dental Hospital 1999

The National Center for Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery was established in National Dental Hospital to provide treatment to the under-priviledged and to develop human resources for oral and maxillofacial surgery through training and research. Rotary club of Kathmandu teamed up with Rotary club of Peebles, Australia (RID 1020) for a 3H matching grant worth \$174,500 from Rotary Foundation for surgical equipment in two operating rooms, intensive care and in-patient units, while Rotarian Gopal Raj Bhandari contributed for the construction of maxillofacial floor at the National Dental Hospital. Cleft surgery for about 300 patients, who are unable to afford the cost, are sponsored every year. The Rotary Foundation has also awarded \$12,495 as Matching Grant to the hospital to come up with a specialized unit for cleft lip and palate surgery for children and a mobileubnit to carry out such surgeries in the remote areas of the country.

### 16) Kosi Zonal Hospital 1999

The second Rotay Foundation grant of \$ 341,775 was giveen to the Rotary club of Biratnagar to reduce infact mortality. Drinking water, sanitation and health education program in Kosi Zonal Hospital was launched by Rotary clubs of Biratnagar and Denvar, USA with an objective to reduce infant mortality, diarrhoeal and vector -borne diseases by improving the hospital's drainage and drinking water system. Part of the Rotary fund was used to supply clean water and construct latrins, several toilets, wash basins, drainage, sock pits, safety tanks and incinerators to benefit more than 1,000 peopoe who visit the hospital evert day. The project also included health education for two communities (hospital area and Rani area communities). A mobile library was also used to educate the people. The Rotary Foundation has also awarded thgis hospital with \$27,000 to install an X-ray machine under a Matching Grant with District 5450 Denver USA, which also provided \$26,000 and District Designated Fund of \$20,000.

### 17) Rotary Maternity Home in Bandipur maternity Hospital 1998

The Rotary Maternity Home in the Bandipur Maternity Hospital was developed by Rotary clubs of Patan West and Gwinnett Country, Georgia, USA with a Rotary Foundation grant of \$34,000 plus \$14,300 supoplemented by the non-resident Bandipurians. Another matching grant project with Rotary clubs of Singapore, Taichung Tatong in Taiwan funded \$18,000 to improve the water supply system nd to collect rainwater for the hospital.

### 18) Bhaktpur Cancer Hospital:1998

In 1995 the Rotary clubs of Kathmandu, Patan, Patan West Kathmandu Mid-town, Kathmandu North together with the Rotary club of Mansfield UK and 35 other clubs applied for a 3H grant from the Rotary Foundation. On May 5, 1998, the Rotary Foundation approved the first 3H grant project for Nepal worth US \$375,025 to donate a radiotherapy Cirus Cobalt 60 Tele Therapy machine for the Cancer Care project in Bhaktapur Cancer Hospital. The Government of Nepal contributed Rs. 5.5 million and Nepal Cancer Relief Society (NCRS) raised Rs. 2.5 million to construct a new building for radiotherapy machine. Bhaktapur Municipality, Chamber of Commerce, District Development Board qnd the public also supported the endeavor. Consequently, on October 8, 1999 late king Birendra inaugurated the new department. In 2001 the Rotary club of Derby D1220 in UK donated

a Laboratory for Haematology, histopathology and general administration. Later in 2004, a Rotary Walkathon raised Rs. 3 million for the hospital to provide free treatment to 200 destitute cancer patient every year.

Rotary club of Mansfield, UK and the UK Friends of Bhakta Cancer Hospital (UKFOBCH) raised fund to establish Cancer Upachar Dan in 2001 and Memorial building (Smriti Bhawan) in the hospital in 2004. The hospital does an excellent job on palliative care on the ground floor of the memorial building. Bhaktapur Cancer Hospital is run by a voluntary board represented by Rotary, NCRS, Bhaktapur people and the government of Nepal. This is the only non-profit making hospital under public-private partnership to serve the large number of cancer patients it attracts. (Sourced from Rtn. Dr. Bibek Prasdhan's book "How the Bhaktapur Cancer Hospital was Established": January 2020)

### 19) "Gift of Sight" Eye Hospital in Hetauda

"Gift of Sight" is the most wonderful gift you can ever give to a visually impaired person. The need of care and treatment of avoidable blindness is very severe in the rural areas of Nepal. To address this problem, Rotary club of Kathmandu Midtown teamed up with Hetauda Community Eye Hospital and Rotary Club of Makwanpur to carry out this project since past 20 years with the support from Rotary club of Garden City Singapore. The regular eye camp and Intra Ocular lense implant have been a great success. During February 22 – 27, 2018 the eye camp screened 1,150 patients and 214 were operated with free Intra Ocular lense implant. The club received 3,000 ete shades from RC of Mauritius.

### 20) Bir Hospital Coronary Care Unit Project 1992

A team of Australian Rotarians led by Lee Russel, working in collaboration with the Rotary club of Kathmandu made history in 1992 when they introduced open heart surgery for the first time in Nepal. The team also helped renovate a modern Coronary Care Unit of the hospital, which was inaugurated by Rotary International president Rajendra K. Saboo on April 15, 1992.

At other occasions, Rotary has helped the Bir Hospital in other areas like equipment for intensive care unit worth Rs.5 million, dialysis units, Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery equipment, establishment of the Burnt Care Unit with equipment worth DM 50,174 from Borke Rotary club in Germany through the Rotary club of Kathmandu Midtown on November 29, 1993.

### 21) Shahid Ganga Lal National Heart Center

Rotarians of Nepal and abroad have been continuously supporting Shahid Ganga Lal National Heart Center. The Rotary club of Kathmandu with the support of Australian Rotarians helped equip the hospital with a Cathlab. The Cathlab machine and its auxiliaries worth \$1.6 million in collaboration with Australian World Community Service. Rotarian Gopal Raj Bhandari of RC Kathmandu helped the National Heart Center in improving and upgrading physical facilities and building for Coronary Care Unit with two new operations theaters totaling Rs.13.5 million.

### 23. Social Enterprize in Bandipur, to develop 5 schools

(GG 1527386) USD 97,293 RC Patan West/RC Aberdeen St. Machar

To establish a Social Enterprise-a small guest -house and coffee shop in a village which attracts tourists. As well as offering employment and generating surpluses the social enterprise will offer training opportunities in hospitality and catering for young unemployed, where the unemployment rate is 12.6%. The surpluses will be used to improve the quality of education in 5 schools in poor villages 4 of which are based on subsidence agriculture and this in turn will boost the children's' opportunities for employment and generally help the local economy. Sustainability/employment and good education are at the forefront of our thinking GG1527386 Development of social enterprises in Bandipur.to establish a small guest house in a village which attracts tourists. As well as offering employment, it will train locals in hospitality and catering. The surpluses will be used to improve quality of education in 5 schools

# 24. Water and Micro-Credit to Support Sustainable Development in Gorkha USD 110,000 (GG1746148) -RC Kathmandu Metro/ E-Club 2650 (Japan)

The project is designed to provide a rural hill community that was affected by the earthquake of 2015 with a multi-purpose water system. The short-term objectives are: provide water for irrigation; water for household and school consumption; and a rudimentary grey and black waters' management system. The medium to long-term objectives are: foster agricultural production by fine-tuning the agricultural skills of the villagers; improve sanitation levels by educating them on water and hygiene issues.

### 25. Income opportunities for women in Khokana, Lalitpur.

GG 17467726 (\$ 42,263)

This project will equip 150 last earthquake- affected women with income generating activities close to home. It will also strengthen the local organization KWAS to better manage its activities for communitydevelopment

### 26. Solar and sustainable technologies Tatopani villages Nepal

RC Kathmandu Sunrise/Los Altos (GG1419827 USD 40,234)

Improve economic development and community status for women, youth and all villagers by creating awareness on renewable, alternative and sustainable technologies through solar cooking, drying, lights and efficient almost smokeless cook stoves, biomass briquettes from waste, and other sustainable technologies that save time, money and provide opportunities for income generation and more decent and new productive work.

GG 1419827 Solar and sustainable technologies in Tatopani village to improve economic and community status for women and youth by creating awareness on renewable, alternative and sustainable technologies through solar cooking, drying, lights, biomass briquettes from waste and otheractivities that provide income generation \$ 40234.

# 27. Water and Sanitation in Chitwan to Empowering Lives of Poor Community (GG1530965)

- RC Nagarjun/Tokyo Shintoshin

The main objective of this project of \$40,000 was to provide safe drinking water and start organic kitchen garden to the 200 households in Chitwan District. It also aims to increase the awareness on hygiene and sanitation behavior on individual and domestic level for healthy living.

# 28. Income generation for rural women through organic farming USD 45,198 (GG1633900)

- RC Dhulikhel/ Singapore

To provide long term source of livelihood for 21 most affected families of Poudel village who had lost their source of livelihood due to catastrophic earthquake occurred in 25th April 2015.

# **29.** Holistic Community Development Project to Uplift Deprived Community USD 68,270 (GG1635438) - RC Patan/ Singapore

This global grant seeks to provide technical support including training and in-kind contribution such as goats, seeds, farm tools to enable participating families that are part of an ongoing holistic community development project in Chandi-Bhanjyang village of Chitwan District to improve their income level. The community development project is being implemented by the Rotary Club of Patan (RCP) and Heifer Project Nepal (HPN).

### MILESTONES OF ROTARY MOVEMENT IN NEPAL




# **Rotarian Code of Conduct**
