On October 24, 2021, we also celebrated World Polio Day, and am very happy with the way which clubs celebrated our effort in putting Polio to an End. Rotary has been working to eradicate polio for more than 35 years, and we've made incredible progress in the fight to rid the world of it forever. As a founding partner of the Global Polio Eradication Initiative, we've helped to reduce polio cases by more than 99.9 percent.

The Rotary Foundation which is a non-profit corporation supports the efforts of Rotary International to achieve world understanding and peace through international humanitarian, educational, and cultural exchange programs. Foundation is the heart of our Rotary for which the month of November is dedicated as the Rotary Foundation Month. It is during this month that we take a moment to remember the sixth president of Rotary International Arch C. Klumph, who in 1917 created this Foundation as an endowment fund for Rotary "to do good in the world." From a humble contribution of US\$26.50, it has grown to more than US\$1billion and is one of the largest and most prestigious international fellowship programs in the world.

As Rotarians, we should all feel proud that The Rotary Foundation of Rotary International has been awarded a perfect four-star rating from Charity Navigator, the US-based evaluator of charity. We have scored 99.40 out of 100 thus earning a 4-Star rating and a statement Donors can "Give with Confidence" to this charity. The score has been calculated from two sub-score of Finance and Accountability & Transparency.

I would like to thank DRFC MK Jha and his team for their tremendous support in raising funds for our Foundation. The response from Clubs towards contribution to The Rotary Foundation has been very encouraging and please accept my appreciation and thank you.

Let us make an effort to raise as many funds as possible during this month of November and urge each member and Rotary Club to contribute. Please remember as Winston Churchill once said- "We make a living by what we get, but, we make a life by what we give" so let's "Live to Serve" and "Serve to Change Lives".

near our city. It moved forward when we promoted sanitation and provided opportunities for education across the country, thanks to generous gifts from supporters who believed in our projects as much as those of us on the ground did.

There is no better time of the year to be reminded of that generosity than November, which is Rotary Foundation Month.

As the charitable arm of Rotary International, The Rotary Foundation is the engine that powers so many Rotary projects throughout the world. The Foundation transforms your gifts into projects that change lives. It is the Foundation that helps us to get closer to our goal of eradicating polio, to show more people how we promote peace through tangible actions, and to demonstrate the impact our projects have in our areas of focus.

Consider some recent projects that were made possible by the Foundation:

- The Rotary clubs of Guatemala La Reforma, Guatemala, and Calgary, Alberta, received an \$80,000 global grant to organize a comprehensive plan to train nurses and rural health care workers to prevent and treat cervical cancer and to implement a sustainable system of referrals in seven regions of Guatemala.
- More than two dozen hospitals in Honduras • received personal protective equipment for their medical staff thanks to a \$169,347 global grant sponsored by the Rotary clubs of Villa Real de Tegucigalpa, Honduras, and Waldo Brookside-Kansas City, Missouri.
- The Rotary clubs of Cotonou Le Nautile, Benin, and Tournai Haut-Escaut, Belgium, received

a \$39,390 global grant to provide agricultural ecologically training at an responsible permaculture mini-farm connected to a center for children in Sowé, Benin. This will help a new generation of farmers become economically selfsufficient.

#### **GLOBAL ETHICS DAY CELEBRATED**





### Message from the TRF Trustee Chair

Do you know your Foundation?

When people ask me what TRF is, I tell them it's the heart of Rotary. You may have heard before thatRotary has an intelligent heart. The Foundation combines our emotional response of compassion with pragmatic action. With both heart and brain, you can change the world.So, what does the Foundation mean to you? November is Rotary Foundation month, but do you really know our Foundation? First, it truly is our Foundation. TRF doesn't

belong to me or the other 14 trustees, nor to the RI Board of Directors, nor to the RI President. It

belongs to each Rotarian around the world. And it's there for all of us to change the world.

We save mothers and children because we have compassion, and we know how to plan. We provide clean water and sanitation where they're needed to those who need them, because we build strategies based on a community's needs. We combine support for peace, education, and economic stability for atrisk communities with an ability to manage big projects.

Giving to the Foundation is smart, too, because in doing so, you multiply the value of that gift. How many other foundations can you think of that identify the projects, fund them, and run them on the ground themselves?

Ours is the only one I know. And we get it all done at such a relatively low administrative cost. This is one reason Charity Navigator consistently gives the Foundation a four-star rating.

I sometimes get asked a question:

How much should I be giving to the Foundation?

Each year, make a gift of what you can afford to give. For some, that is \$100, and for others, more. What's most important is that you give something, because each generous gift helps us meet the increased demand we're seeing from members for global grants and our other programmes.

This year, we want to raise \$50 million for PolioPlus, which will be matched 2-to-1 by the Bill & amp; Melinda Gates Foundation, for a total of \$150 million. If every Rotary club contributed just \$1,500, we would surpass this goal. We have other goals as well — for the Annual Fund, the Endowment Fund, and outright gifts — adding up to a grand total of \$410 million.

We will get there if we set our hearts — and minds — to it. But remember, it's not about the money; it's what the money can do. There's a saying that goes, "I alone cannot change the world, but I can cast a stone across the waters to create many ripples."

The Foundation is that stone, so let us turn ripples into great waves with it, using our hearts and our minds.

## What is Polio?

Polio, or poliomyelitis, is a paralyzing and potentially deadly infectious disease that most commonly affects children under the age of 5. The virus spreads from person to person, typically through contaminated water. It can then attack the nervous system.

Rotary has been working to eradicate polio for more than 35 years. Our goal of ridding the world of this disease is closer than ever.



As a founding partner of the Global Polio Eradication Initiative, we've reduced polio cases by 99.9 percent since our first project to vaccinate children in the Philippines in 1979. Rotary members have contributed more than \$2.1 billion and countless volunteer hours to protect nearly 3 billion children in 122 countries from this paralyzing disease. Rotary's advocacy efforts have played a role in decisions by governments to contribute more than \$10 billion to the effort. Today, polio remains endemic only in Afghanistan and Pakistan. But it's crucial to continue working to keep other countries polio-free. If all eradication efforts stopped today, within 10 years, polio could paralyze as many as 200,000 children each year.



## Message from DRFC

Dear Friends,

Wish you a very happy Tihar, Deepawali, Bhai Tika and Chhath!

As we all know November is dedicated month for our Foundation. In The Rotary Foundation2 G's are very important. One is Giving and another is Grants.

Each and every contribution is properly recognized and appreciated, which also helps to do good for world. It is very important that you go through

the Terms and Conditions for Rotary Foundation District Grants and Global Grants. This will serve as a guidance in proceeding ahead for such Grants.

Further, there are certain changes recently made by TRF, which are very important to note and I have listed down those changes for your easy understanding as under;

- 1. No cash contributions shall be matched by world fund.
- 2. DDF shall be matched by 80% only.
- 3. If grants at draft stage is more than twelve months, it will get automatically cancelled.
- 4. From International partner, only 15% of total contributions is required to be contributed in grant.
- 5. If grant is under Directed Gift, no minimum contributions is required from International partner.
- 6. No minimum fund is required from world fund. Without taking any fund from wirld fund, grant can be done.
- 7. If grants get approved, committed cash contributions must be deposited within six months from the date of approval. If it's not deposited, grant shall be cancelled.
- 8. Within 12 months grant has to be implemented from the date of approval.
- 9. Now, the Rotaract Clubs are also eligible to apply for Global Grants.

Hopeful that terms and conditions would be read minutely and it would be practiced.

#### **TREE PLANTATION**

On September 15, 2021, a group of Rotarians from the Rotary Club of Kantipur, under the leadership of President Rtn. Dilip Narsingh Adhikari, departed for Majhimtar, about 62 km from Kathmandu on the Prithvi Highway. The plantation site is on a landslide-prone hillside below Thingmang Village some 2 km off the main highway.



The team selected some landslide-prone sites, where they planted approximately 500 seeds of Bambusa bamboo, commonly known as the Indian Spiny Bamboo by using the seed dibbling technique (as recommended). Since the germination of this seed is normally expected around 12 - 15 days, it is assumed that these seeds will grow into tall, clumping thickets, thereby significantly contributing towards conserving the ecosystem and preventing soil erosion.

#### SUPPORT OF FURNITURE TO SNEHI KAKH ORGANIZATION

On 25 August 2021, RC Lalitpur delivered 5 storage racks worth NRs 45,000 to Snehi Kakh, a non-profit organization serving and accommodating the needy people from street, at Kusunti Lalitpur. Altogether 75 people including 35 children were residing and benefitting from the organization on the day of club's visit. Realizing the poor management of storage stuff at the organization, RC Lalitpur had supported the racks to them. President Rtn Rose Shrestha, Secretary, PP Rtn Manoj B Shrestha with spouse Gindira Shrestha, Treasurer PP Rtn Rupak Das Tamrakar with spouse Angur Tamrakar and PP Rtn Shyam K Maharjan were present during the handover program.

#### **6TH FOOD BANK ACTION**



Fishtail Fund is a joint project between RCP Fishtail and RC Dronfield UK. This is a literacy program that supports students with good educational backgrounds but faces severe financial problems and they are at the juncture of dropping their education due to lack of financial support. Fishtail Fund was started in the RY 2009/10 and since then over 300 students have been beneficiaries of this program. The target students are from the middle school level and are continued until they complete their education and start to earn. After completing their school, they are encouraged to undergo vocational training or study technical subjects like nursing, health assistant, overseer, agricultural technician, electrician, etc. Until now over 200 students have completed their education from different faculty and they are served to the nation in the field of medicine, agriculture, construction and maintenance, telecom, electricity, water supply, and so on. Some of the beneficiaries are providing their service abroad.

When the Covid-19 pandemic hit our country, early April 2020, it affected all sectors of income-generating activity. Many people lost their jobs and passed into severe financial crises. Families of beneficiaries of Fishtail Fund were also facing big problems with their daily food. During this critical situation, Fishtail Fund Trustees from both clubs decided to start Food Bank. Food Bank supplies food items to the family of every student who is currently under Fishtail Fund Scheme. On 2nd day of October, the 6th Food Bank Action was organized and a total of 32 families were provided with rice, lentils, cooking oil, cooking spices, salt, sugar, tea, packets of instant noodles, biscuits, and some other cooking ingredients. It is believed that this Food Bank Action will help them to celebrate Dashain Festival with little ease. The worth of all these materials is Rs 350,000.
