- PARTNERSHIP, to join hands in possible partnership. (AIROP for acronym).















RHEUMATIC HEART & HEART DISEASE SCREENING & TREATMENT CAMP

Rotary Club of Dhulikhel organized a Rheumatic Heart & Heart Disease Screening & Treatment Camp at Bhumlu-10, Dolalghat. The event was supported through the financial assistance of the Rotary Club of Waukesha and in association with Nepal Heart Foundation-Kavre, Rotaract Club of Kathmandu University Medical Science, and Bhumlu-10 local government. 137 patient general examinations, 55 patients ECG and 43 Echo were done with 12 patients' referral to tertiary care.

BLOOD DONATION PROGRAM



We are planning to increase the number of plates to 200+ due to huge demand and pressure from the community and the needy. We hope to fulfill the lives of the needy every day.



HANDOVER OF REFLECTOR JACKETS

Efforts by our Club Rotary Club of Biratnagar Fusion for the safety of 250 cleaners in the whole of Biratnagar during especially these foggy days, so that the reflector Jackets can protect them and also provide uniform status to all the cleaners whilst promoting Rotary. This project not only provided safety to the people who keep our city clean and hygienic but was also a good medium to promote Rotary and our Club.



SCHOOL BAG DISTRIBUTION

Keeping in mind, the Disease Prevention and Treatment Month, Rotary Club of Biratnagar Fusion distributed 200 biodegradable, plastic-free Menstrual Sanitary pads which are reusable and can be used from 6 months to 1 year. The Club also distributed the pads to 100 girls in the school giving 2 pads to each and also educating them on Menstrual Hygiene so that they do not get any diseases due to the same and can also save money spent on pads every month. They can even create the same and get job opportunities.



DISTRIBUTION OF SCHOOL UNIFORM AND STATIONERY ITEMS

The Bal Rashtriya Adharbhut School is a government school located in Kageswori-Manohar Municipality, Gothatar, Kathmandu. The school has about 150 students, out of which about 60% are girls. Most of these students are from socially deprived backgrounds and are children of migrant workers. RC Kopundol supported this school through a Child protection and education project. This project handed over stationaries and uniform and warm clothing to 150 students of grade 1-3 Bal Rastriaya Adharbhut school. PP Dr. Dhurba Acharya, the coordinator of the project, handed over the agreed items to the School Headteacher.
