RI President's Message

We have overcome so many challenges these past two years and changed numerous lives. It brings me great joy that we have worked so hard this year to grow Rotary through the Each One, Bring One initiative. The result has been excellent growth in membership. Let us keep up the momentum. I am happy that you have put a spotlight on all we do by organizing projects around the world in our Rotary Days of Service. The future looks brighter than ever for Rotary and our 1,4 million members.

On 11 March 2020, the World Health Organization declared that COVID-19 constituted a pandemic, and two years later it is important that we continue to draw on our expertise in our disease prevention and treatment area of focus to help people worldwide cope with the continuing challenges. The pandemic continues to defy all expectations, but we cannot be frozen in fear. Our work is too important. It is also important that we

make time for each other, and I urge you to register for the upcoming 2022 Rotary International Convention in Houston. It is a great way for all of us to safely celebrate Rotary service.

We can continue to build hope and spread peace in the world by using our resources to help the most vulnerable and keeping our faith in the future. The pandemic has had an especially devastating impact on girls worldwide. On the first anniversary of the pandemic, Henrietta Fore, the executive director of UNICEF, said that "immediate action is needed to mitigate the toll on girls and their families." This need, unfortunately, remains just as strong a year later. The ripples of the pandemic have affected girls in unique ways — stunting their educational attainment, weakening their job prospects, and contributing to other terrible results such as child marriages and increased human trafficking.

Data from UNICEF reveals why our action is so essential. In the 2010s, important progress was made toward eliminating the practice of child marriage, and UNICEF estimates that 25 million such marriages were averted worldwide. Unfortunately, the pandemic reversed those positive trends, and as a result an additional 10 million girls are vulnerable to becoming child brides by the end of this decade.

This is why our focus on Empowering Girls is such vital work, and I am delighted that at this year's virtual International Assembly, President-elect Jennifer Jones committed to continuing this initiative for another year. In my travels, I have witnessed many wonderful examples of club projects that back our Empowering Girls goals. But all Rotary members know that real change requires big efforts sustained over many years. This is the power of our global grants and actions taken within our areas of focus.

I encourage clubs to think of innovative ways to empower girls when designing their grant projects. Every step we take to improve education, health care, and economic opportunities for girls makes an important difference in helping them achieve their full potential. With opportunity we create hope, and with hope we address the root causes of conflict around the world, setting the stage for sustainable peace.

None of us know how long the COVID-19 virus will linger — and as an organization that has worked tirelessly for decades to eradicate polio, we understand better than most the difficult work that lies ahead for the world. That is why we need to remain focused on the future and on what is possible — not feeling nostalgic for the way our lives were, but looking hopefully to a future that uses this opportunity to Serve to Change Lives. Water, Sanitation & Hygiene (WASH)

The saying is true that "Water is life". It is used for drinking, sanitation, and health purpose humankind. for But it is also used for Irrigation, Industrial use, and Recreation purpose. It can be taken from rivers,

streams, springs as surface water and dug well, hand pumps, and tube wells as groundwater. To use the sources one must be careful about their quality and availability.

It is a very important topic to talk about but very difficult to implement in Nepal. We, the Rotarians are also been very much involved in WASH in the last few years. The clubs are doing WASH in school and developing drinking water facilities for the communities through District Grants and Global Grants.

The poor Water and Sanitation Hygiene (WASH) facility in Schools that influences hygiene behavior are one of the main public health problems in Nepal. According to UNICEF Nepal, the percentage of schools with basic drinking water is 81% and basic sanitation or toilets is 68%. Although water and sanitation coverage has been improving in schools, critical bottlenecks remain, particularly as they relate to girls and children with disabilities. About 20% of government schools lack improved water and sanitation facilities with an additional 19 percent lacking separate toilets for girls and boys and menstrual hygiene management facilities. 15% of community schools lack separate toilets for boys and girls and Menstrual Hygiene Management (MHM) facilities for girls. Similarly, only 50%

of the schools have permanent hand-washing stations. Due to inadequate WASH facilities, about 3500 children die each year from waterborne diseases primarily. In the wake of the present pandemic COVID-19 situation, WASH facilities and behavior have become even more imperative to ensure the health and safety of school children.

According to Nepal government policy, schools must ensure one toilet for every 50 students. However, Water Aid's research shows that the average school toilet serves 127 students, nearly three times as many as the government recommended.

In the densely populated southern region of Terai, where most of the houses lack clean toilets or do not have toilets at all, the risks of infection are higher, and schools have been identified as particularly high risk. According to Nepal for Water Health (NEWAH), the state of toilets and washing facilities in schools in both Terai and hills, including lack of soap for all-important hand-washing, is a strong disincentive for students to attend. Lack of WASH services in school creates many other problems like it increases the level of girls' absenteeism in schools during menstruation and creates poor cleanliness, operation, maintenance, and sustainability in schools.

Hence, WASH facilities play a great role and importance in the life of the students so proper and sustainable WASH facilities are essential in schools.

What Rotary Clubs should do?

The program or project regarding drinking water, sanitation, and hygiene must be done by doing proper communities assessment, cultural values about water and its use. By constructing toilets, hand wash, and drinking facilities one





must look for their sustainability and proper use.

To make the project successful the clubs must give the training to use the system effectively. The clubs must be assured that water sources must be secured, safe, and within the reach of the communities or schools.

Now the time has come the Rotarian must see the WASH with Environmental aspect in following perspectives either by providing training/awareness/advocacy or doing projects:

- To create healthy, resilient, and water-secure communities at the watershed level
- Increased sustainable access to safe drinking water and water for productive uses in schools and communities

- Increased sustainable access to and use of safely managed sanitation through fecal sludge management
- Strengthened governance for sustainable resilient management of water resources
- Strengthened conservation of watersheds and biodiversity.

DRINKING-WATER PROJECT HANDOVER CEREMONY



Rotary Club of Bharatpur handed over Rotary Dangisharana Drinking Water Project to the local community of Kauwaghari village of Dhagisharana Rural Municipality Ward No. 2 of Dang, Lumbini Province amid a function in the gracious presence of Mrs. Bimala Kumari Khatri, Minister of State for Health, Population and Family Welfare of Lumbini Province and IPDG RID 3292 Rtn. Rajib Pokharel on 20th February 2022. The project was a global grant (GG 2096862) of RC Bharatpur with RC Vellore North (RID 3231 India) as the International partner with a worth of 86590 USD. The funding partners for the project were Rotary Club of Bharatpur, Rotary International, and Rotary Club of Vellore North (RID 3231). The project benefitted more than 300 households of underprivileged communities of Kauwaghari village through its water tank with a capacity of 150 kiloliters. Prior to this project, locals were compelled to use unhygienic water from a local stream around 1.9 kilometers far from the village.

CERVICAL CANCER SCREENING CAMP



As a part of Social Responsibility, the Rotary Club of Rupandehi conducted a cervical cancer screening camp at Anandavan Health post, Tilottama-06, Rupandehi targeting mainly rural women and minorities. Seventy women were examined out of which 40 suspected samples were collected for cancer screening. Club also provided all the required medicine completely free to the patient. The total cost of the project was Rs. 465,000. Six Rotarians contributed around 30 hours of voluntary service to the project.





JOINT SCHOLARSHIP DISTRIBUTION PROGRAM

VOCATIONAL TRAINING

The inauguration has been held for 30 women targeting wards 9, 15, 14, and 13 under the hospitality of ward no. 14 chairperson Deepak Khadka.

Earlier, training camps have been started for 23 students at Gauritar, Hetauda-15, 24 at Rotary Bhawan, Hupra, and 26 at Manhari-3, Handikhola.
