CROSS-BORDER SUPPORT TO LEPROSY IN INDIA



Rotary Club Rajdhani on 10th March 2022 in coordination with Samjhana Maitreya Foundation donated NPR 9.27 lakhs direct cash contribution to "Little Flower Leprosy Welfare Association" Raxaul, Bihar India. This cross-border support program undertaken by RC Rajdhani is a unique program in itself as it's probably a very few occasions where Nepal has supported an institution in India. The project was initiated by Charter Member of RC Rajdhani Ms. Kabita Bhattarai who is a Sanyasini and has dedicated her life to servicing the Leprosy on the Nepal-India border. Each Leprosy patient needs monthly food support of INR 500 which is NPR 800 and approximately NPR 10,000 in a year for 200 patients. Support was raised from individual members/people who were willing to support either a month or a year's ration.

The handover event of the direct cash contribution was organized at Birgunj in association with RC Birgunj and the contribution was received by the president of Little Flower Leprosy Welfare Association Sundarpur Raxaul Mr. Mahesh Kumar Agarwal along with Sanyasini Kabita Ma amidst a program which was attended by PP Pradeep Kumar Shrestha, PP Pratap Singh Tater, PP Debendra Lal Shrestha, and Rtn. Rashmi Pokhrel Acharya (also President of Samjhana Maitri Foundation) of RC Rajdhani, and members from RC Birgunj.

DRINKING WATER PROJECT HANDOVER



Rotary Club of Bharatpur handed over Rotary Dangisharana Drinking Water Project to the local community of Kauwaghari village of Dhagisharana Rural Municipality Ward No. 2 of Dang, Lumbini Province Nepal amid a function in the gracious presence of Mrs. Bimala Kumari Khatri, Minister of State for Health, Population and Family Welfare of Lumbini Province and IPDG RID 3292 Rtn. Rajib Pokharel on 20th February 2022. The project was a global grant (GG 2096862) of RC Bharatpur with RC Vellore North (RID 3231 India) as an international partner with a worth of 86,590 USD. The funding partners for the project were the Rotary Club of Bharatpur, Rotary International, and the Rotary Club of Vellore North (RID 3231). The project benefitted more than 300 households of underprivileged communities of Kauwaghari village through its water tank with a capacity of 150 kiloliters. Prior to this project, locals were compelled to use unhygienic water from a local stream around 1.9 kilometers far from the village.

Honorable Minister of State Mrs. Khatri appreciated the efforts of Rotary International for providing basic facilities to the people serving humanity. She also committed to more developmental works in the locality in the coming future. IPDG Rtn. Pokharel appreciated the initiation of RC Bharatpur for this project and handed over the project to the local Drinking Water User Committee. Chairman of the Rural Municipality Mr. Bhagiram Chaudhary, RID 3292 Public Image Chair Rtn. Rabi Baral and other distinguished guests also appreciated the efforts to provide clean drinking water in every household and make the accessibility of the most important amenity for everyone's life; water.

Project Coordinator and IPP of RC Bharatpur Rtn. Dr. Rebanta Kumar Bhattarai thanked all the Rotarians, non-Rotarians, and well-wishers who helped directly or indirectly to turn this dream into a reality. The smiles on the faces of the local people of Kauwaghari after getting pure drinking water in their home were priceless and these small things really motivate all of us, the Rotarians, to push one further in serving the people with a cause. The handover ceremony was attended by more than 120 people including Rotarians from RC Bharatpur, Tulsipur City, and Ratnanagar along with District officials; local dignitaries, and the stakeholders of the Rotary Dangisharana Drinking Water Project.

DONATING ARTIFICIAL LEGS



On 3rd March 2022, Rotary Club of Narayani Midtown along with the Rotary Club of Birgunj organized a charity event of donating artificial legs to 10 unfortunate people who had lost their legs. A woman of 21 years had lost her leg during the earthquake of 2072. She was exceptionally happy to receive a leg to support her and she thanked the rotary club. A foreign driver from abroad lost his leg in an accident and he has gained control of his body back and is very happy to have his normal life back. The Rotary Club of Mahaveer Jaipur Foot Centre of Rehabilitation organized this event along with the other two clubs and arranged everything. The chief guest was Krishi Vikash Minister Om Prakash Sharma of Madhesh Pradesh and he handed over the artificial legs to the victims. The president of the Rotary Club of Birgunj, Dr. Saswat, Past President of Rotary Club of Narayani Midtown, Bharat Malla, Chairperson Bhupendra Shrestha and Rotarians from RC Narayani Midtown attended the program. Rotary club of Narayani Midtown supported the lodging, transportation and fooding for 5 days for the 10 patients, cost of the same was Rs.70,540 The patients were very happy to get back to their normal lives due to this charitable event by Rotary Club.

TRAINING ON WEAVING



CHANDESWORI TEMPLE CLEANING AT PIMBAHAL BY ROTARY CLUB OF YALA, FEBRUARY 4, 2022

On February 4, 2022, the Rotary Club of Yala initiated a trend of holding a weekly meeting this year in our traditional heritage sites combining with cleaning the temple and using the public space for the meetings. In order to revive participation declined due to pandemic, Rotary Yala held the weekly meeting at Pimbahal sattal in the middle of the pond (Jagmadu pukhu). Preceding the meeting, some 50-55 members assembled to clean the Chandeswori temple, including Rotarians, Rotaracts, Interacts, Anns, together with the Chandeswori Misa Pucha (Chandeswori Women's Group) and Yala Sampada Group (Patan Heritage Group) who had been involved in the restoration of Pimbahal area. The temples are important sites where the local communities pay a visit in the morning and sing bhajan as a way of purifying the mind, putting lights and giving offerings to birds and animals. These places, despite their richness in heritage, do not have a regular cleaning system and remain dirty and stained with oil, vermillion powder, rice, and flowers.

Shailendra Shrestha, the local resident, and resource person from Taja Phaa was invited as a guest speaker to talk about the historical and cultural importance of the temple and the Pimbahal area and the role it plays in the lifestyle and economic fabric of the local community.

This way we have physical meetings, a clean temple, sharing potluck of indigenous food (Samaye baji), and public event to draw the attention of non-Rotarians. Rotary Club of Yala acknowledges Twinkle Nyachhyon, Public Image Director for introducing a new concept of bringing Rotary's social service activities of utility to the public and engaging communities alongside ROTARIANS.


