In August, I was proud to visit Pakistan and highlight Rotary's top goal, eradicating polio. It was also a tremendous opportunity to spotlight female health workers who are playing a critical role in protecting children from this vaccine-preventable disease.

This month, as we celebrate World Polio Day, we are shining a spotlight on our more than 30-year effort to lead the first global polio eradication campaign and our success in forming partnerships capable of completing this massive goal. We all know that this is one of the most ambitious global health initiatives in history and that we've reduced polio cases by more than 99.9 percent worldwide.

Pakistan is one of only two countries in the world where wild poliovirus remains endemic. (The other is neighboring Afghanistan.) I was able to witness and take part in vaccination campaigns in Pakistan, and soon after I left, a monumental nationwide immunization campaign took place, focused on 43 million children under the age of 5. I saw the incredible work of Rotary members on the ground. More than 60 percent of vaccinators in Pakistan are women, and they are doing a remarkable job building trust and convincing mothers to vaccinate their children.

Seeing it all firsthand, I know that the will exists across the Rotary world to end polio, and I'm confident that we have the strategy. The Pakistani media has been very supportive of our efforts as well, and this is making a difference. This month, a new global pledging moment at the World Health Summit in Berlin promises to pull together more resources to fund these time-sensitive eradication efforts. Now it is up to us to do our part and raise \$50 million this year to earn the full 2-to-1 match from the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation.

There's great cause for optimism on the polio front — but also some staggering new events that have further raised the stakes. Over the past few months, new polio outbreaks have occurred in Israel, the United Kingdom and, most recently, in the New York City area. These stories are frightening, but in every case, the response is clear — vaccines work, and if polio is spreading, we need to make sure the most at-risk people have kept their vaccinations up to date.

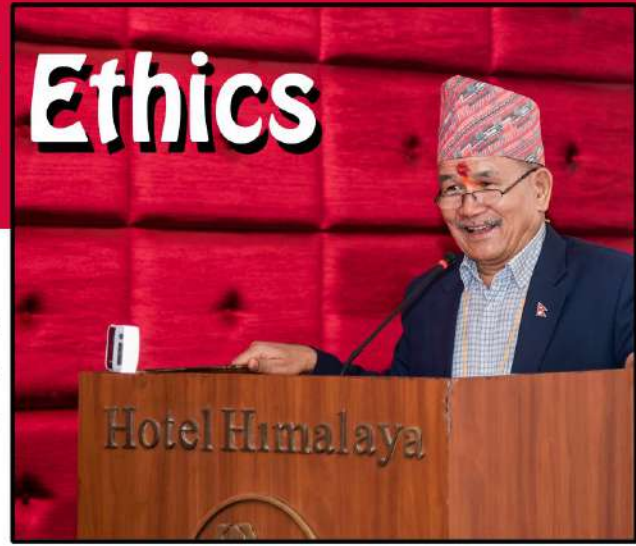
Most importantly, we need to eradicate this virus now. If polio exists anywhere, it can spread everywhere. What I saw in Pakistan convinced me that we can and must finish the job, but it will only happen if we remain committed to a strategy that's working and back it with all necessary resources.

Through our commitment, generosity, and sheer determination,

Celebrating Global Ethics



The Rotary Ethics and the Four Way Test Subcommittee has extended invitation to various colleges, schools, youth groups, business houses to collaborate in partnership to bring better awareness to ethics and the Four Way Test.



Rotary International District 3292 successfully celebrated the Global Ethics Day on Saturday, October 15. It was held at Hotel Himalaya, Lalitpur. Mayor of Lalitpur, Mr. Chiri Babu Maharjan was the Guest of Honor and shared his life experience in civil service while upholding ethical values. He addressed the gathering and shared very effective message.

DG Jitendra Rajbhandary, Chief Guest spoke on the Rotary vision and goal and why ethics and the Four Way Test is paramount. DGE Rajendra Dhoju and DGN Rajendra Man Sherchan were present to support the program along with other District officials.

There were diverse speakers from varied fields example, medicine, businesses, media and the Government sector. Rotary also provided opportunity to the youth speakers to share about ethics from their point of view while referencing the Rotary's Four Way Test.

The youths that spoke on ethics brought examples of women's empowerment, the importance of culture, youth career and the disparity between public and private education. Creating such a platform to bring awareness on ethics, was well received by around seventeen rotary host clubs, the rotary district and guests that attended the conference.

The esteemed panelists comprised of Dr Nirmal Rijal, President RC Kathmandu Mid-Town, Dr Rtn Anil B Shrestha, MBBs, MS (Ortho) Senior Consultant, Orthopedic Surgeon, Dr Sabeena Bhattarai, ED Lavan Skin and Hair Clinic & President, Society of Dermatologist, Mr. Kuvera Chalise Editor, Karobar National Economic Daily spoke from their specific areas of expertise and shared poignant examples from various backgrounds. Rtn Padma Lal Shrestha, Member Ethics and Four Way Test Subcommittee spoke on "Rotary's documented policies/guides on ethics and revisiting the Four Way Test".

PP Neeva M. Pradhan RC Kathmandu Mid-Town and Member Ethics Four Way Test Subcommittee delivered the welcome note as the session Moderator and the Master of Ceremony. Chairman, Ethics and the Four

Way Test Subcommittee Badan Lal Nyachhyon provided the highlight and background on the Ethics Symposium. The Ethics subcommittee members welcomed all dignitaries and guests. “Rotary Action in Keeping our Environment Free from Waste”

An Inter City Meet (ICM) on “Rotary Action in Keeping our Environment Free from Waste” was conducted on 10th September 2022. The event was participated by a remarkable number of Rotarians and guests with a total of registration of 118 participants. Speaker Rtn. Badan Lal Nyachhyon from Rotary Club of Mount Everest Lalitpur shared on Zero Waste Nepal initiatives by Rotary Clubs of District 3292. He also highlighted on the Zero Waste Lalitpur campaign initiated by Network of Rotary Clubs of Lalitpur (NRCL). The needs of policy and institutional strengthening was put forward as one of the agenda.

Another speaker, Rtn. Nabin Bikash Maharjan from Rotary Club of Patan shared on the entrepreneurship and technology options for waste value chain. He focused on small scale investments and technologies for environment friendly options including compost machines and waste recovery technologies.

This session was moderated by MC of the event, Rtn. Yogesh Shakya from the Lead Host club, Rotary club of Mount Everest Lalitpur. The following session of Panel Discussion was moderated by Rtn. Dinesh Manandhar, Chair of Environment & Preserve Plant, Subcommittee, and the panelists included Mr. Rabindra Bohara, Project Director of Banchara Danda Landfill Site Project Coordination Unit, Ministry of Urban Development. The other panelists were from Kathmandu Metropolitan City, Lalitpur Metropolitan City, and Solid Waste Management Association of Nepal. The panel discussion focused basically on current status of waste management and further policy and institutional approaches.

The event had an added attention with the presence and message of waste management from Dr. Sareesha Shrestha - Miss Earth Nepal 2022. She being a part of Rotary family as a Rotaractor in her experience, had a positive look to the further roles of Rotarains in resolving the dire issue of waste management - specially in Kathmandu.

The event's Chief Guest, DG Rtn. Jitendra Bahadur Rajbhandari gave a message that a joint activity to address the concern of solid waste management in urban centers is very important and Rotary District 3292 is willing to take it further. 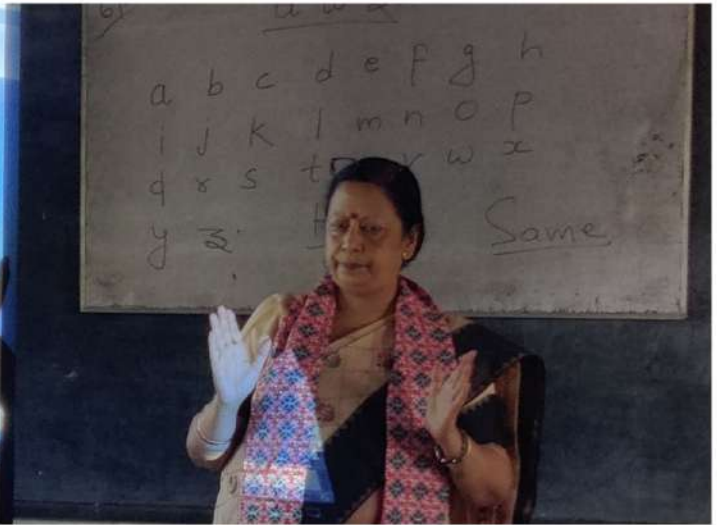
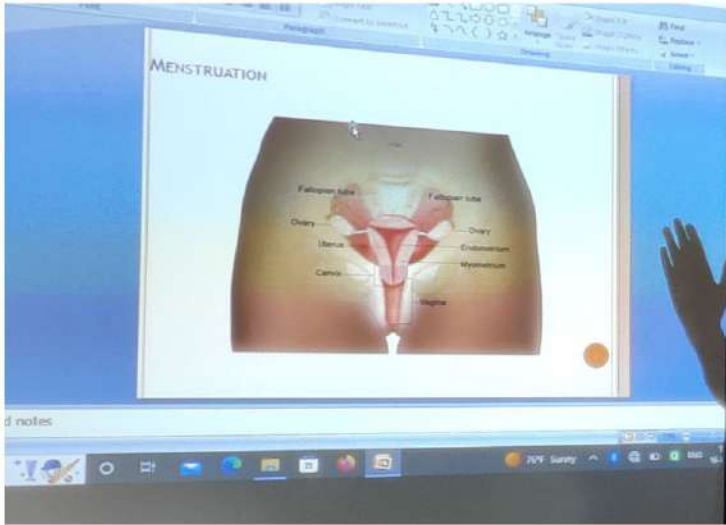


HANDED OVER LEARNING MATERIALS TO TEACHER

We had assistance from RCC members and nearby communities in organizing the program. The instructor is Rajan Rajwanshi, who holds a diploma in agricultural farming. The theory portion of the training was preceded by the practical portion. It will take five days to finish.

It will take 35 to 40 days to harvest the first batch of mushrooms. The women involved in this project will become more independent because they can choose to work in this field. Thirty women and their families will get something from this endeavor.

Celebrating International Day of Girl Child

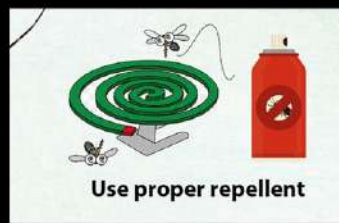
