# Rotary Club of Himalayan Golfers

The Rotary Club of Himalayan Golfers was chartered on 27th June, 2022 & even before the charter, the club has played an active role to serve the community and its people. The club has few ongoing projects and few projects that has been completed. The following are the Completed Project's details for your reference;



Title of the Project: Kurintar Mother's Home building (Yekikrit Krishi Aama Samuha)

Direct Beneficiaries: Women in Kurintar community
Total Budget: NPR 250,000/Project timeline: 6th April - 11th July, 2022



During a recreational visit, Rtn. Bhai Raja Panday and Rtn. Purna Man Sakya had an opportunity to explore the area near Kurintar and found a new to be build Aama Samuha (Mother's home) near their stay. Aama Samuha (Nepali: आमा समृह, lit. 'Mothers' Group') is a Nepalese voluntary group formed to raise awareness about gender equality, issues affecting women and other social issues. Women involved participate and organize group meetings to discuss their problems and support each another. They planned to set up a revolving fund where they contribute a certain amount of money each month. Group members in need of financial support can borrow the necessary sum from their aggregate fund collection. Besides helping one another, these groups are active in campaigning right causes & raising voices to create a safer and equitable society for women.

President aspired to support the community of such diligent women and thus the first project of The Rotary Club of Himalayan Golfers came into existence. Charter President Rtn. Bhai Raja Panday proposed Kurintar Mother's Home building project to the club members on a weekly meeting held on 9th Feb,2022. The financial aid provided then was for the construction of community hall for holding group meetings and gatherings. The Rotary Club of Himalayan Golfers raised contribution from distinct club members to support the project. Charter member Rtn. Phinsto O Lama was kind enough to become a bridge between RCHG and Yekikrit Krishi Aama Samuha aiding communication and financial assistance.

For more than 35 years, Rotary has worked to end polio. To help with the effort, numerous volunteers have donated more than \$2.1 billion from Rotary members. Only Afghanistan and Pakistan still have an endemic polio outbreak today, but it is essential to keep trying to eradicate the disease in other nations. If all eradication efforts were to cease now, polio might disable as many as 200,000 children annually during the next ten years.

Rtn. Purna Man Sakya, chair of the Rotary Club of Himalayan Golfers of the service project, suggested holding a golf outing to collect money for polio eradication, which would help those impacted all over the world. South Asia Fellowship for Golfing Rotarians sponsored the event (SAFGR). Globally, there are those who are direct beneficiaries. The whole budget is 300,000 NPR. South Asia Fellowship's for Golfing Rotarians (SAFGR).



The Rotary Club of Himalayan Golfers arranged an eye screening camp for the residents of Thali at the initiative of Chair, Club Administration Major Gen. Daman Ghale and in collaboration with Nepal Eye Hospital. More than 240 patients were screened in the camp. Since Nepal Eye Hospital and RCHG have a solid working relationship, numerous screening camps of this nature will be held in various locations over the next few days.

Local residents are the direct beneficiaries and The Nepal Eye Camp provides technical support.

# Digital Video Colposcopy Machine Handover by RC Yala

A Colposcopy is a microscope fitted with a light and used for examining the uterine cervix, particularly for warning signs of cancer. Using the device,

abnormal tissue or blood vessel development in the vagina and around the cervix can be identified and tissue samples taken for biopsy, if necessary. A team of skilled doctors and skilled technicians from Nepal Cancer Hospital and Research Center (NCHRC) will available for assist to use of this machine.
