



Each year, Rotary awards up to 130 fellowships for leaders around the world to study peace and development, and what these peace fellows learn prepares them to work in conflict prevention and resolution and promote Positive Peace. Here are a few examples of the creative ways peace fellows advance peace:

Promoting sustainability

Alejandra Rueda-Zarate combined her Rotary Peace Fellowship in peace and conflict resolution with her master's degree in energy and resources to support her dream of protecting the Colombian countryside. She founded the organization NES Naturaleza in 2011 to help farmers in Colombia and across rural Latin America gain access to knowledge and training to uphold sustainable farming standards.

Ending racism

Peace fellows Geoffrey Diesel and Kathy Doherty have applied their fellowships in peace and development studies toward co-founding the Racial Equity Project, a subcommittee of Rotary Positive Peace Activators in North America committed to studying ways to create a more peaceful society through anti-racism efforts.

Managing disasters using data

Through a Rotary Peace Fellowship, Jamie LeSueur earned a master's degree in social science within peace and conflict research. He now leads emergency operations for the International Federation of Red Cross and Red Crescent Societies, setting a management and operational framework for agency collaboration in emergency response situations.

These stories — and hundreds like them — show how Rotary is creating a generation of leaders ready and able to build peace worldwide. Nearly 1,800 peace fellows have graduated from Rotary Peace Centers, and they are applying their craft in more than 140 countries.



He is Cadre of Technical Advisor, WASH and Environment and member of WASHRAG and ESRAG in Rotary International. He is District secretary of district 3292, RY 2023-24. He has participated in various national and international events including district conferences and international conventions. He is keen to work in team and to serve the best for humanitarian activities and society at large. Doing good in the world and knowledge sharing is his passion.

Here is an excerpt of the interview taken by Rtn. Raj Shrestha, Chair-District Publication and GML Sub Committee.

Rotary has been a unique platform to serve the community. How have you been assessing its contribution so far?

Rotary is an international organisation having members from different sections of vocations joining together for a common goal and for doing good to society. Rotary

does humanitarian service above self. It has mainly seven areas of focus towards its service to the community in need viz; Providing safe drinking water and sanitation, Promoting peace and conflict resolution, Maternal and child care, Community and economic development, Diseases prevention and treatment, Supporting environment, Providing education and literacy and many more. Rotary is known to the world for its support towards eradicating polio. Rotarians are the volunteer leaders who dedicate their time. treasure and talent to tackle the world's most pressing humanitarian challenges.

Nepal has now graduated from least developed country to developing country as Human Development Report 2020 has portrayed. Do you see any pertinent challenge on the improvement of lives, especially on availability of safe drinking water supply and sanitation?

United Nations General Assembly (UNGA) in November 2021 has passed resolution to graduate Nepal from LDC to MDC. Nepal committed to the UN SDGs and spelt out in key policy documents, such as the current

15th five year Development Plan and other policy documents. Out of 17 goals of SDG, goal 6 is to ensure access to water and sanitation for all. Access to safe water, sanitation and hygiene is the most basic human need for health and well-being. SDG 6 calls for ensuring universal access to safe and affordable drinking water, sanitation and hygiene, and ending open defecation.


In Nepal, latest data from the Joint Monitoring Program for Water Supply, Sanitation and Hygiene (JMP), showed that in 2022, 91% and 81% of the country's population had access to basic drinking water supplies and basic sanitation, respectively. As for hygiene, data shows that 60 % and % of the population have access to a basic handwashing service, in rural and urban areas, respectively. So there is still a gap and challenges for universal coverage.

Rotary also focuses on providing clean water, sanitary and hygiene as one of its seven key areas, do you have any data on how it is helping the people on this front?

As mentioned earlier, Water and sanitation is one of the areas of focus of Rotary. Through water, sanitation, and hygiene (WASH) programs, Rotary's people of action mobilize resources, form partnerships, and invest in infrastructure and training that yield long-term change. Since 2013, The Rotary Foundation has invested in more than \$130 million in over 2,000 projects worldwide (www.rotary.org). Rotary clubs in the countries have invested from their own fund and also partnering with government and private sector in many large WASH projects. Through these investments, our volunteers of action have improved access to safely managed and basic WASH services to communities, schools and healthcare facilities, and also protecting and conserving scarce water resources.

Nepal being one of the richest countries in the world with fresh water availability, why are we still struggling to manage sufficient supply to the people?

Yes, Nepal is rich in availability of water resources, but harnessing the water with adequate access to safely managed water through the water systems is challenging due to urbanization, pollution due to anthropogenic activities and industries, wastewater intrusion and solid waste disposal in to water bodies like river,



ponds and lakes. Another important factor is treatment necessary for maintaining national water quality standards and as per WHO guidelines. Due to climate change, water sources from stream as well as groundwater are depleting, challenging the supply chain with demand. Tackling the disasters and emergencies like landslides, floods, droughts and fires have been a great issues for the water utilities in the country.

Nepal's WASH component is guided by the WASH Sector Development Plan, SDP (2024-2043) which is to be implemented by the Ministry of Water Supply. Is there any Rotary collaboration with Nepal government effort?

The SDP for Nepal in the WASH sector needs to provide a solution to address multifaceted challenges and harness opportunities for transformative change. Nepal has made commendable progress in expanding access to WASH services, yet significant gaps persist, and emerging complexities necessitate a comprehensive strategic framework. The SDP responds to the urgent need for a unified roadmap that aligns with national and global development goals, particularly the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). It serves as a guide to channel resources effectively, enhance coordination, and ensure that no one is left behind. Rotary

clubs in Nepal have been collaborating with local government at the grassroot level for implementing WASH projects. The district 3292 is also soon launching a RI USAID partnership project of 2 Million USD, for which a pre-approval have been already received. This project will be carried out in partnership with USAID and government as well

There are many water and sanitation related diseases affecting people of Nepal and takes many lives every year. What are the challenges community-based organizations face and immediate measure they can take to save lives?

Poor water quality due to pollution and failure to maintain hygiene and safe environment when handling water and waste are the causes of water borne diseases impacting on their lives with high mortality and morbidity rates prevailing in the country. This has effect on the productivity of people and their livelihoods as well. The measures to be taken by community based organization like Rotary and others is to invest in capacity building of not only community, but all three tiers of government, promote advocacy and awareness including investment in infrastructures for the water utilities at community, HHs, Schools and Healthcare facilities as well.

The Chhaupadi tradition mainly in Karnali and Sudurpaschhim and the social taboos prevailing in our country towards menstrual hygiene has impacted many women and girl child knowingly and unknowingly.

Since 2013, The Rotary Foundation has invested in more than \$130 million in over 2,000 projects worldwide

Rotary also have initiated along with other organizations in awareness building, promoting reusable pads, linking production of pads with economic development programme and income generation.

Menstrual health challenges still exist in girls and women mainly in rural areas. How effective you see the Rotary's role for creating positive change?

Menstrual hygiene is one of the concerned challenges for the girl children, who miss the schools mainly in rural areas. The Chhaupadi tradition mainly in Karnali and Sudurpaschhim and the social taboos prevailing in our country towards menstrual hygiene has impacted many women and girl child knowingly and unknowingly. There have been promising steps taken by various organizations including government to tackle the issue. Rotary also have initiated along with other organizations in awareness building, promoting reusable pads, linking production of pads with economic development programme and income generation. The initiatives has to be scaled up to create a lasting positive change by Rotary clubs mainly in schools and community working with government and private sector.

Rotary prioritizes its effort to support positive learning environment in school, where sanitation and hygiene issues become vital. How effectively Rotary clubs throughout the district is collaborating with school administration and local government to bring change?

Rotary Nepal is implementing Rotary Nepal Literacy Mission (RNLM) programme and one priority aspect under TEACH is Happy School. Many Rotary clubs are implementing Wash in Schools projects by providing access to water and sanitation facilities, conducting Teachers training and providing support towards Girl Child Toilet project (supported by district) in partnership with local government as well. The MoU between clubs and schools and partnership and collaboration with local governement have so far brought good impact and raised public image of Rotary.

How do you see the Rotary making a difference in community in terms of water, sanitation and hygiene (WASH) as its cumulative efforts?

The entry in to any community is through providing basic services to the community. Water and Sanitation are the basic services that every community demands. Rotary clubs and their members are always a part of the community compared to other NGOs, who build the projects and leave. The long-term operation and maintenance is key issue for sustainability of such projects. Through the collaboration with the local government and continuous advocacy and capacity building at all levels and policy influence, Rotary's role is instrumental. Thus, through the small to large WASH projects that Rotary implements, it makes a significant difference at the communities.

The participants (principals and the school committee members) received insights of the project in detail after a presentation presented by the members of the Rotary club of Yala and question /answer session afterwards. The total budget for this project is Rs. 95000.



Girls Toilte (Service Project) is on Progress

RC Kathmandu Downtown 22nd March 2024

The Rotary Club of Kathmandu Downtown has initiated a service project for the construction of a girls' toilet at Samundra Higher Secondary School in Gurje-6, Nuwakot. The building structure has been completed, and water sanitation, doors, windows, and tiling works have also been finished. The remaining finishing touches will be completed within a week, and the inauguration ceremony will be finalized soon. The total cost of the project is Rs. 6,50,000.00 (Six lakh fifty thousand rupees only), with the club sponsoring Rs. 2,50,000.00 towards its completion. The construction works are being handled by the RCC Club of Gurje, Nuwakot.





Mental Health Support Project

RC of Patan South Rota Year 2023/24

Inspired by Rotary International President Gordon McInally's emphasis on mental health and the World Health Organization's declaration of mental health as a universal human right, the Rotary Club of Patan South (RCPS) has launched a significant initiative aimed at supporting individuals facing mental health issues in their community. Led by Past President Binaya Bajra Bajracharya, RCPS, in collaboration with Alka Hospital and Hand of Grace, a mental health care home, is providing essential assistance to those in need.

Currently focusing on 11 mentally challenged individuals recommended by Hand of Grace, RCPS is offering meals (including Dal, Rice, cereals, etc.) to Hand of Grace, and ensuring access to medicine and psychiatric consultations on a regular basis for those in need. Treatment is facilitated through collaboration with Alka Hospital in Jawalakhel, Lalitpur. However, RCPS envisions expanding their reach beyond the initial 11 beneficiaries to serve a larger population in the near future.

After consultation with a neuropsychiatrist, it was determined that most of the patients suffer from severe mental disorders such as schizophrenia, bipolar disorder, depression, and anxiety. These patients require regular medication and some may need lifelong treatment. Hand of Grace, a mental health

care home, supports 4-5 severely affected patients who lack family support.

RCPS's primary focus is on ensuring patients receive proper medical attention and medication. To date, RCPS has sponsored over 30 consultations with the doctor, with each patient receiving 3-4 consultations over an 8-month period. The project's initial funding of NRs. 129,000 to Alka Hospital has been allocated towards doctor consultation fees and medication purchases, amounting to over 1 lakh as of March.

Recognizing the long-term nature of mental health recovery, RCPS aims to provide sustained support highlighting their commitment to promoting mental health.



The change within

Together, we see a world where people unite and take action to create lasting change — across the globe, in our communities, and in ourselves.

These are times that cry out for peace. The Middle East is in its most volatile condition in years. The war in Ukraine is the largest in Europe since World War II, and there are armed conflicts in Sudan and parts of Central Africa. Nearly every continent is experiencing a major armed conflict.

Rotary has a vital role to play in advancing the cause of peace — I often say Rotary needs to work toward peace as aggressively as those who wish to wage war. It's the spirit found in our vision statement: "Together, we see a world where people unite and take action to create lasting change — across the globe, in our communities, and in ourselves."

We must never lose track of that last call — that to bring about change in the world, we need to foster change within.

It is up to us to model peacebuilding
-behaviour among each other. We can do
better than questioning the motives of one
another and jumping to the harshest possible
explanation. After hearing words that might
strain or offend us, we have an opportunity

to ask, with compassion and curiosity, the intent of those offending words. And then we have another opportunity to repair the breach.

If we wish to be a beacon to the world, let us start by being so to one another. Let's help each other find greater understanding and productive alternatives to words that cause hurt and distrust. And let's stick to our principles, but never doubt the sincerity of each other to end conflicts, not inflame them.

I'm reminded of a speech that US –Senator Robert Kennedy made on April 4, 1968, that dreadful day when the Rev Martin Luther King Jr was assassinated. Kennedy was in –Indianapolis speaking to an audience in a predominantly African American neighbourhood where people had yet to learn that Dr King had been killed.

He shared the terrible news. He honoured Dr King for all he had done for the cause of justice and peace. And then he connected with the fuming, grieving crowd by saying: "For those of you who are Black and are tempted to be filled with hatred and distrust at the injustice of such an act, against all white people, I can only say that I feel in my own heart the same kind of feeling. I had a member of my family killed." It was the first time he had spoken publicly about ¬President John F Kennedy's assassination. And while many American cities exploded in ¬violence that night, Indianapolis did not. It is in times of crisis and despair that we need empathy most of all. Empathy is the most powerful tool of peace, and it is vital if we are to take the first brave, humble steps to Create Hope in the World.
