

Key Highlights from November

1.End Polio Now Campaign - A District-Wide Movement : Rotary District 3292 marked World POLIO Day with extraordinary efforts:

a.Rallies Across Cities: Over 700 Rotarians, Rotaractors, Interactors, and community members united to spread awareness about polio eradication. Even 600 Non-Rotarians cyclists participated in the cycle rally to spread the awareness of eradicating POLIO.

b.llluminating Dharahara: The iconic monument, Dharahara, was lit with the message End Polio Now, symbolizing hope and determination.

c.Hoardings and Billboards: Key locations across the district showcased the End Polio Now message, amplifying awareness and advocacy.

2.Mobile Vans for ETS Testing

As part of our commitment to disease prevention, we are distributing mobile vans for ETS (Early Testing Services) across the district. These vans will enhance access to vital diagnostic services, bringing healthcare closer to underserved communities.

3.Cervical Cancer Screening Camps

Collaborating with multiple Rotary clubs, we are conducting cervical cancer screening camps, a crucial step in early detection and prevention of one of the most prevalent cancers affecting women in our region.

4.Rotary Youth Leadership Award (RYLA)

The Rotary Youth Leadership Award was a resounding success, with enthusiastic participation from Rotaractors and Interactors under the age of 21. This program showcased the passion and potential of our young leaders, inspiring them to contribute meaningfully to their communities.

5.Vibrant Club Workshops and Club Visits

To strengthen club engagement and ensure alignment with our district goals, we have been conducting Vibrant Club Workshops and visiting as many clubs as possible. These visits have allowed us to witness firsthand the impactful projects being conducted and celebrate the dedication of our members.

Rotary International and The Rotary Foundation – An Overview

Rotary began with the vision of one man: Paul Harris, a Chicago attorney, who founded the Rotary Club of Chicago on February 23, 1905. His goal was to create a space where professionals from diverse backgrounds could share ideas and build lasting friendships. In 1907, this same club initiated Rotary's first public service project: constructing public comfort stations. This milestone established Rotary as the world's first service club. Today, Rotary International, as a member organization, operates under the guidance of a Board of Directors, while The Rotary Foundation of Rotary International, a separate entity, functions as a public charity governed by a Board of Trustees. Both entities are tax-exempt under U.S. law and have headquarters in Evanston, Illinois, USA.



ROTARY'S FIRST PUBLIC SERVICE PROJECT

At the 1917 Rotary convention, outgoing President Arch Klumph proposed the creation of an endowment "to do good in the world." This idea, supported by an initial contribution of \$26.50, became a powerful force for global change. As of June 30, 2023, The Rotary Foundation has assets totaling \$1.450 billion. Over the past century, it has invested over \$4 billion in transformative projects that improve health, provide education, protect the environment, and alleviate poverty worldwide.

The Rotary Foundation funds projects through Global Grants and District Grants, supporting Rotary members in advancing world understanding, goodwill, and peace. Contributions to the Foundation fuel life-changing projects that benefit communities globally and often return to support local efforts, allowing Rotarians to continue making a difference. Analysis over the last four years shows that contributions to the Annual Fund have resulted in more than tenfold increases in funding for local community service projects.Rotary recognizes its contributors through various honors, including Rotary Foundation Sustaining Member, Benefactor, PHF, MPHF, PHS, Major Donor, AKS, and Bequest Society.

Rotary's core values—Service, Fellowship, Diversity, Integrity, and Leadership—guide its mission, embodied in the motto "Service Above Self." As Rotarians, it is both our duty and our privilege to support the Foundation, ensuring it can continue to bring positive change to our communities and the world.

Types of Grants

The Rotary Foundation offers various grants to support humanitarian projects, scholarships, and vocational training teams. Here's an overview:

Global Grants: These grants fund significant international projects with longterm, sustainable impacts in one or more of Rotary's focus areas. They range from \$30,000 to \$400,000. **District Grants:** These grants support smaller-scale, short-term projects that address immediate needs within local or international communities.

Disaster Response Grants: These grants aid disaster relief and recovery efforts, funded through the Rotary Disaster Response Fund.

Programs of Scale Grants: These grants

support Rotary member-led, evidencebased programs with a track record of success. They provide substantial financial support of more than USD 2 million.

Rotary Healthy Communities Challenge:

This initiative provides long-term resources to implement large-scale, impactful programs aimed at reducing severe disease and child mortality from malaria, respiratory infections, and diarrhea in targeted countries.

The Lifecycle of a Rotary Grant

The lifecycle of a Rotary grant consists of several key stages, each crucial for ensuring the project's success and accountability:

1. Draft

Rotary members plan the project or scholarship and build their grant application online. During this stage, members outline project goals, objectives, budget, and expected outcomes.

2. Authorization

Club and district leaders review the application to verify that it aligns with Rotary's goals and guidelines. They also ensure the funding request is reasonable and authorize the grant.

3. Submitted

The project planners automatically submit the authorized application to The Rotary Foundation for review. This stage marks the formal request for Foundation support.

4. Approved

If the application meets the Foundation's criteria, the Foundation team reviews the submitted application. Upon approval, the Foundation issues payment to support the project. or scholarship as planned and provide annual reports to the Foundation detailing progress, finances, and impact. Upon the completion of the work or studies, the clubs must submit a final report within two months. Once the final report is received and reviewed, the grant is officially closed.

This lifecycle ensures proper planning, accountability, and impact assessment, aligning projects with Rotary's mission.

5. Completion

Over the past four years, total contributions to the Annual Fund amounted to USD 993,641. In that same period, total grant funding reached USD 10,082,959—representing an impact that is 10 times greater than the contributions received.

Ongoing Projects

As of the latest report, a total of **223** applications are in various stages of the grant process. Currently, **59** applications are in draft status, with **9** awaiting authorization. Meanwhile, **12** applications have successfully reached the submission stage, and a significant **143** applications have already been approved. These **143** approvals are contributing to ongoing global grant projects, aimed at supporting impactful initiatives in our communities.

Stewardship & Responsibilities

RID 3292 oversees the responsible management of funds provided by The Rotary Foundation to clubs within the district. This includes managing District Grants and Global Grants, ensuring that these funds are used transparently and effectively.

It is essential to maintain constant and consistent updates for all TRF-funded projects from the beginning to the end. Regular reporting allows for accurate tracking, ensures accountability, and highlights the impact of each project.

Stewardship Defined

- Good stewardship means doing the right thing even when unobserved. For Rotary projects, this entails:
- •Using TRF funds responsibly and
- transparently
- •Following TRF policies in grant
- implementation
- •Ensuring proper grant management and strict financial compliance

Consequences of Poor Stewardship

Failing to uphold stewardship standards can lead to:

- Loss of Rotary funds
- •Damage to Rotary's reputation
- •Weakening of project effectiveness and limited impact
- •Negative impacts on beneficiaries •Potential sanctions
- •Failure to pass the Four-Way Test of ethics

Current Reporting Status

As of the October 2024 quarterly analysis, compliance with reporting stands at 73%, with 20 TRF-funded grants having overdue reports. Timely and accurate reporting is crucial for maintaining trust and ensuring ongoing support for Rotary projects.

Awareness on Cerebral Palsy & Down Syndrome program

District Cerebral Palsy/Down Syndrome Committee



The District Committee on Cerebral Palsy and Down Syndrome organized an awareness program on Cerebral Palsy and Down Syndrome at Ratna Hotel, Biratnagar, on 13th November 2024 for Rotarians from the Rotary Clubs of Zone 7 to enhance their understanding of these conditions. The meeting aimed to empower Rotarians to become advocates for inclusion and active participants in improving the lives of individuals affected by these conditions.

The program was hosted by the **Rotary Clubs of Patan Durbar Square, Biratnagar Down Town, Biratnagar Central, Biratnagar Fusion, and Biratnagar Midtown**, with support from the **Self-Help Group** for Cerebral Palsy, Dhapakhel.

Thirty-four Rotarians from Zone 7 actively participated in the event. Rotarian Dr.

Pragya Karmacharya Rajbhandari, Co-chair of the District Committee on Cerebral Palsy and Down Syndrome, Service Chair of RC Patan Durbar Square, and Technical Director of the Self-Help Group for Cerebral Palsy, provided an overview to enhance knowledge about Cerebral Palsy and Down Syndrome. She also explained the contributions of the Self-Help Group for Cerebral Palsy and the Cerebral Palsy Clinic and Care Center in supporting children with Cerebral Palsy and other neurological conditions in Nepal.

Dr. Bernhard Schmitt, a Pediatric

Neurologist from Switzerland, discussed the significant contributions of the Self-Help Group for Cerebral Palsy in empowering individuals with Cerebral Palsy and their families.

Prevention of Early Childhood Blindness Rotary Club of Bagmati

GG# 2352110 | Cost: USD 48,239 | Project Date: May 2024 - November 2024

Project Overview

This Global Grant project is an initiative of the Rotary Club of Bagmati aimed at addressing the healthcare needs of premature babies at the Tilganga Institute of Ophthalmology, Nepal. Premature babies, born before 34 weeks of gestation and weighing less than 2000 grams, are at high risk of developing Retinopathy of Prematurity (ROP). This condition arises due to oxygen therapy provided in Neonatal Intensive Care Units (NICUs) to aid their breathing, which can adversely affect their eyes.

ROP is a preventable cause of blindness if diagnosed and treated promptly. The grant facilitates the purchase of specialized equipment to diagnose and treat ROP effectively, thereby preventing blindness in these vulnerable infants.

Equipment Funded by the Grant

1. Portable Indirect Laser: This portable device is used for laser therapy on the retinas of premature babies, allowing treatment to be performed directly within NICUs, thereby avoiding the need to transport critically ill infants.

 Head-Mounted Indirect Ophthalmoscope: Worn by ophthalmologists during laser therapy and examinations.
 Handheld Portable Fundus Camera: This portable and versatile device captures images of the retina for diagnostic and documentation purposes, making it suitable for use in clinics, operating rooms, and community centers.

These advanced and highly expensive instruments are critical for ensuring timely and effective treatment, especially in underresourced areas.

Impact and Beneficiaries

The Tilganga Institute of Ophthalmology, a leading referral center,



serves underprivileged patients from across Nepal and neighboring countries. Catering to approximately 1,300 patients daily, it offers subsidized treatment to those in need. This project strengthens the institute's capacity to deliver high-quality care for ROP and other retinal diseases, particularly for underprivileged and deprived patients.

The facility is situated near Doleshwor Temple in Suryabinayak Municipality-8.

As part of the program, cooked meals were provided to all 182 residents, with the cost amounting to NPR 10,500 for the day. The Chairperson also extended an invitation to the public to visit the Ashram and support its cause.

In the Rotary year 2023-24, The Rotary Foundation (TRF) endorsed 1,287 Global Grant Projects worth \$72 million across its 530 districts in 200 countries. One of these successful projects was Rotary Club of Yala's Teaching at the Right Level (TaRL).

This project is supported by international partners RC Aachen of Germany and RC Hilversum-West of the Netherlands. It aims to train primary school teachers in the TaRL pedagogical approach to improve the academic achievement of children in community schools and help them develop foundational reading and mathematics skills for rapid recovery.

The Beginning

First, we should study Rotary's global grant literature, attend Grant Management Seminars, and enrich ourselves with the valuable information available in the Rotary Learning Centre. Additionally, we can review and learn from numerous global grant project reports available online. This will guide us in drafting a global grant application, which must go through TRF's highly credible vetting system. Selected grants are reviewed post-approval to ensure that Rotarians complete their projects as described in the application, with strong financial management in place. This process ensures that grants are implemented with transparency and integrity.

Finding International Project Partner

A Rotary global grant project can only be realized as a collaborative undertaking between national and international clubs. At times, our clubs may find international project partners but lack tangible project ideas. Conversely, we may have great project ideas but struggle to find international project partners. In Yala, based on various community needs and requests, we have drafted several projects addressing issues related to Rotary's Focus Areas. This allows us to present ready-to-implement project ideas to potential international partners interested in our community development initiatives.

Our visibility on online platforms like club's Official Website, and Social Media played a key role

in building cooperation with RC Aachen of Germany and RC Hilversum-West of the Netherlands as international partners. They were seeking a credible club in Nepal for a collaborative global grant project. Together, we developed a successful application for the TaRL project, selected from several other project ideas.

Another extremely helpful platform for finding international partners is https://www.rotarygrants.org, developed by District 5340. Here, we can list our project proposals to attract international partners interested in supporting specific project objectives.

Of the many factors involved, two aspects we consider most important for any successful global grant project application are Community Assessment and Sustainability. While we may secure international project partners, without proper community assessment and a strong focus on sustainability, the project application is unlikely to succeed.

Community Assessment

The TaRL pedagogy had previously been implemented by Street Child of Nepal in community schools in the Terai and Middle-Hill districts of Nepal. We used these pilot projects as the foundation for an extensive community assessment conducted in more than 30 public schools in the Lalitpur and Kavre districts. This assessment provided valuable insights into the needs of the target beneficiaries—such as schools, students, teachers, and School Management Committees—as well as the skills and resources they could contribute to the project.

The combination of the pilot projects and the community assessment was instrumental in drafting the application: •To clearly articulate the specific issue or problem the project aims to address. Proficiency tests in Math, Nepali, and English, conducted with 300 primary school children from 15 community schools, were used to underscore the urgency and importance of the problem, as well as the necessity of addressing it. •To detail the project description and solution to the identified need. This included outlining the objectives, activities, and timeline, explaining how the project is innovative or unique compared to existing solutions, and describing the expected outcomes and impact of the project, along with methods for measuring success.

Sustainability

From day one of this project's development, we have been consistently focused on its sustainability. The project covers 26–28 schools over a two-year period, with the implementation period in each school lasting only one year. This raises several important questions:

(a) What will happen in the project schools after the project concludes?
(b) Will these schools be able to sustain TaRL as a teaching and learning approach?
(c) What role can Rotary play in improving foundational education in the 26,500+ public schools across Nepal?
And many more.

To ensure continuity in project schools, we are training teachers who can transfer their newly acquired skills to other teachers. The training materials are simple, costeffective, and can be easily prepared by teachers and students at minimal expense. Local government representatives, who chair the School Management Committees, have committed to providing resources for training materials.

The Nepal Government has decided to implement the TaRL approach in all 26,500+ public schools across the country. However, one major challenge is identifying resource persons who can train teachers in TaRL pedagogy on this scale. Teachers trained under this project could serve as resource persons to address this challenge.

Rotary Clubs of Nepal could collaborate with the Government and other organizations to help train tens of thousands of teachers required to implement TaRL pedagogy nationwide.

Project Implementation and Reporting

Now that we have received Rotary global grant funding for this project, our primary responsibility is to ensure its proper implementation. Documentation and reporting are essential for maintaining transparency, accountability, and the ability to communicate progress and outcomes to both national and international partners.

We need to evaluate the project's outcomes, measure its successes, and reflect on its challenges in relation to the goals that were set. During implementation, we may need to adapt and adjust our strategies to achieve the desired outcomes. If these adjustments involve financial reallocations, we must secure approval from our international partners and TRF.

For any Rotary global grant project, progress reports must be submitted every 12 months, with a final report due within two months of the project's completion. Failure to submit reports on time may result in Rotary International taking strict measures against the cooperating clubs and districts.



District Governor Official Visit

The Rotary District Governor's visit to a club is an annual tradition that fosters engagement and collaboration. During these visits, the Governor meets with club members to review their activities, address challenges, and outline future goals. This interaction provides valuable guidance, reinforces Rotary's broader vision, and strengthens connections within the Rotary network. It also plays a pivotal role in aligning the club's initiatives with district objectives, promoting greater collaboration among clubs.
