RI PRESIDENTIAL STATEMENT

To adapt, as laid out in Rotary's Action
Plan, we must occasionally step out of our
comfort zone and try something new. Here
are two examples of clubs that adapted
— one with heart and one through critical
thinking and strategy.

The Rotary Club of Chandigarh Mid Town, India, led with heart earlier this year. To engage members and grow membership, Club President Nitin Kapur personally called every former member of the club and invited them to a gathering billed as an alumni meetup.

Eight former members attended, and the results were stupendous. The visitors had a chance to connect once more — not only with current members but with the sense of camaraderie and belonging that membership gave them. By the end of the evening, the club welcomed six of the former members back into the Rotary family.

Club President Kapur showed courage when he reached out to the alumni. Not only did he adapt and try something new but he had the strength of character to show the club's alumni how much they still meant to the family of Rotary. That bravery paid off.

People want to feel needed and appreciated. People want to feel that they belong. And they might never feel that way if we don't have the courage to tell them.

Meanwhile, the Rotary Club of Seoul-Hansoo, Korea, has been experimenting with different club models to great effect. Over the past four years, Seoul-Hansoo has created and maintained four satellite clubs — a service club, an interest-based club for musicians, a cause-based club that mentors professionals, and a club for college students.

These satellite clubs are part of a five-year plan the Seoul-Hansoo club implemented to increase membership through innovation.

What's the secret to founding and maintaining so many satellite clubs?

Membership between Seoul-Hansoo and its satellite clubs is fluid and synergistic. Many members of the satellite clubs attend the sponsor club's meetings. And many of the sponsor club's members participate in the satellite clubs.

Additionally, the focus of each satellite club is no accident. Each one appeals to different interests of people in the sponsor club and in the community, attracting existing and potential members. This is an excellent strategy to both retain and attract members because it offers flexibility. If someone is interested in joining but they can't make it to the sponsor club's meetings, they have plenty of options to choose from.

These are just two examples of how we can adapt with our hearts and minds. Every club is different, so I encourage you to reach out to members of your club and of the community around you. Ask them about the club experience and what you can do to improve.

Talk to enough people and you might find ways that you can adapt and spark The Magic of Rotary in your club.

Governor Elect & Governor Nominee Learning Seminar

December 3,4, and 5 Kochi, Kerala.

My Experience on Governor Elect Learning Seminar and Rotary Institute in Kochi

December has been the busiest month so far, with numerous Rotary activities and a few personal extended visits. During the month, I visited various cities in Nepal and India for learning, meetings, workshops, and other preparatory work. From December 3rd to 5th, I participated in the Governor Elect Learning Seminar (GELS) organized in Kochi, Kerala, India. There were 44 Governor Elects from Zones 4, 5, 6, and 7. Since this was my second physical meeting with my batchmates after my DGN training in Bangalore last year, the interaction was more open and frank. Learning from my batchmates and strengthening friendships have been great achievements of this seminar.

Rotary International has been shifting trainings to facilitation models, and all the resource persons demonstrated their roles well during the three-day seminar. Adult learning is not easy, as many people get bored with slides and the mostly one-way communication of trainers. In GELS, participants were divided into two groups, which allowed everyone to speak in each session. The size of the participants is crucial in such seminars. Facilitators focused on creating an environment to explore learning points among the participants, even without making many remarks themselves. This seminar inspired me to change our training modality and adopt the facilitation method. I have committed to starting this with our "Training to Learning Facilitators" (formerly ToT) scheduled for early January 2025 and continuing with other trainings.

GELS is also considered preparatory work for the Rotary International Assembly, which will be held in Orlando, Florida, USA, in the second week of February. It was an eye-opener for the necessary preparations before the RI Assembly, participation in the assembly, and much more. It gave us many ideas that will definitely help in preparation and presentation at the assembly.

Following GELS, we took part in the Rotary Institute, a massive gathering of COGs from the region and a few leaders from Rotary International. Listening to senior leaders and influential speakers from various fields was an amazing learning experience. Meeting and greeting batchmates and past governors was also a great opportunity. The fellowship and entertainment, including live bands and a carnival, were excellent experiences. Indeed, it was a valuable learning opportunity on how to organize large Rotary events.

Informal and bilateral talks with batchmates were very beneficial to me and others. It was an opportunity to learn about different activities organized by other DGEs. Many districts in India are interested in working with our clubs in Nepal for their proposed GGs. Several districts are eager to organize Rotary Friendship Exchanges with our district, and I am looking forward to organizing at least a few of such exchange visits in 2025-26. Some district governor elects also want to organize their training/seminars in Nepal. However, poor road conditions to Kathmandu and



other cities, as well as flight hassles and concerns about past plane crashes, present challenges.

After the Kochi Institute, we took the opportunity to visit some famous temples in Kerala and Tamil Nadu. We were fortunate to have hassle-free, special darshan at all the temples with Rotary connections at each place. We truly felt proud of our Rotary network and privileged to be a part of it. Everything is possible in Rotary!

In a nutshell, GELS followed by the Rotary Institute provided an enriching and insightful learning experience. I believe this will help me shape next year's activities and develop strategies for their successful implementation.

Himalaya Hotel, Kopundol, Lalitpur December 27, 2024 The Rotary International District 3292 Nepal ICM Committee and the Senior Citizen Subcommittee, in collaboration with the Department of Health (MoHP), World Health Organization (WHO), and the Geriatric Society of Nepal, organized an Intercity Meeting on Healthy Ageing at Hotel Himalaya, Lalitpur. This initiative aimed to raise awareness and promote strategies for enhancing the quality of life for older adults.

Rtn Anil K. Thapaliya, ICM Chair, delivered the welcome remarks and outlined the program's objectives. **WHO Nepal Chief, Dr. Rajesh Sambhajirao Pandav**, shared insights on WHO's initiatives for Healthy Ageing and discussed future collaboration with Rotary.

In his keynote speech, **Chief Guest Dr. Bikash Devkota**, **Director General of the Department of Health Services**, emphasized the importance of family support in old age, highlighting that elderly care should be viewed as a responsibility rather than a burden. His remarks reflected a compassionate and ethical approach toward elder care, promoting dignity and respect for seniors.

District Governor Rtn. Rajendra Man Sherchan shared insightful remarks, focusing on the role of Rotary in promoting health awareness, creating age-friendly communities, and supporting collaborations for the well-being of older adults. He highlighted the importance of addressing the challenges of healthy ageing and fostering partnerships with the WHO and the Government of Nepal for sustainable support systems.

Geriatrician Dr. Ramesh Kandel discussed Healthy Ageing, age-related changes, and the need for long-term care systems in Nepal. He stressed the importance of awareness programs, especially regarding issues like forgetfulness in old age, which is often not taken seriously by society.

Hira Kumari Niraula, Director of Nursing and Social Security Division of the Department of Health Services, spoke about laws related to older adults and provided statistical data on senior citizens in Nepal. **Psychiatrist Dr. Nidesh Sapkota** highlighted dementia, Alzheimer's, their causes, effects, and care precautions for family members.

Other speakers included Dr. Umesh Bogati, President of the Geriatric Society of Nepal, Dr. Ananta Aryal, Geriatrician, Dr. Banshdeep Kharel, Department of Ayurveda and Alternative Medicine, Raju Maharjan, Spokesperson for Lalitpur Metropolitan City, and Ward No. 9



Chair.

The event emphasized the importance of identifying health challenges in old age, modern medical solutions, and social support systems. Key speakers called for raising awareness, policymaking, and community collaboration to ensure a healthy and dignified life for older adults across Nepal.

A working paper was presented on access to health facilities for older people, mental health care, and nutritional lifestyle measures. Participants discussed the role of organizations, governments, and communities in supporting older adults.

The objective of the program is to create a multi-pronged strategy to improve the health and quality of life of senior citizens. Rotary District 3292 Nepal has pledged to continue raising awareness about healthy ageing through similar programs in the future.


Rtn. Youraj Roka, serving as the program host and co-chair of the Senior Citizen Subcommittee, emphasized that healthy ageing sensitization is essential for both Rotarians and non-Rotarians. The responsibility for promoting healthy ageing begins with all of us, and it's important to discuss healthy ageing before reaching old age. Such programs

should be rolled out across all regions of Nepal through ICM events.

PDG Dilendra Raj Shrestha delivered the closing remarks, and the vote of thanks was given by Sushil Kumar Karki. The event saw participation from 260 people, including non-Rotarians, media personnel, and members from 18 host clubs.

Distribute 1,526 Bedkits to Dhunebesi Children in Pilot Project

Increased awareness of this provision will promote better oral hygiene and preventive care, which are crucial for long-term health benefits.

By integrating dental treatment facilities into the Nepal Health Insurance Policy, the public can enjoy improved access to affordable dental care, significantly enhancing community wellbeing and quality of life.





Awareness program on Cervical Cancer & HPV/DNA Test

December 7 & 14, 2024

The Awareness Program on Cervical Cancer was jointly organized by the Rotary Club of Patan East and the Westar Welfare Society on December 7th at the Westar premises. The program featured Dr. Anu Bajracharya, Senior Consultant Gynecologist and Oncologist at Nepal Cancer Hospital and Research Center (NCHRC), Harisidhi, Bhaktapur, as the key speaker. AG Arjun Shrestha from District 3292 was also present. During the program, 65 women benefited and registered for the HPV/DNA test. The total cost of the program

was NPR 14,000.

Continuing the awareness efforts, an HPV/DNA test program was successfully conducted on December 14th, 2024, with technical support from NCHRC. A total of 42 women were tested, and the reports indicated that 4 women tested positive. The total cost of this program was NPR 74,100 (Seventy-four thousand one hundred only).

The Rotary Club of Patan East expressed gratitude to the entire technical team of NCHRC, as well as to Rtn. Sworupa Shrestha, Director of the Hospital and Vice-President

of RC Yala, for their generous support in achieving these significant outcomes for women's health.

In Nepal, cervical cancer claims the lives of approximately 11 women per 100,000, despite being preventable with time-tested screening strategies. In addition to its impact on health and mortality, cervical cancer imposes a substantial social and economic burden in low- and middle-income countries (LMICs) like Nepal. Awareness and screening through the Papillomavirus (HPV) DNA Detector Test can enable early diagnosis and prompt treatment, making cervical cancer curable.

This initiative aimed to provide free eye and dental checkups, ensuring access to




essential health services for those in need. Medical professionals from Birtamode Eye Hospital conducted comprehensive eye exams, while the dental team offered consultations and basic treatments.

RC Tripureswor has undertaken a threeyear (2022–2025) Global Grant Project titled "Enhancing Quality Education in Six Adopted Schools in Nepal."

The Rotary Club of Bozeman Sunrise,
Montana, USA, is its International Global
Grant Partner. The total cost of the project is
USD 148.457.

The vision of this 3-year Global Grant Project: The project aims to transform each school into a stage where all children have access to child-friendly, quality education. The expected outcomes are:

1.Increased enrollment (100%—no child left behind) and 100% retention of students.
2.A child-friendly teaching and learning environment that promotes joyful learning.
3.Well-maintained, child-friendly school facilities including school WASH facilities, IT/Science Labs, and safe, child-friendly premises.

4.Well-functioning and effective SMC/PTA (School Management Committee/Parent-Teacher Association).

5.Active involvement and support from local governments.

6.A high level of student confidence and

participation in extracurricular activities.
7.Marked improvement in students'
knowledge and performance.
This project follows an integrated approach

under the "T-E-A-C-H" modality of the Rotary Nepal Literacy Mission:

T: Teacher Support

- Training for teachers to enhance skills and knowledge, enabling the application of childfriendly, interactive pedagogical methods.
- A gradual transformation from a teachercentered teaching approach to a childcentered learning approach.
- Impact: 150 teachers trained.

E: E-Learning

- Introduction of IT/computer-based teaching and learning methods to enhance motivation and interest among teachers and students.
- Utilization of an interactive, IT-based curriculum to make learning more joyful and explorative for children.
- Infrastructure: 6 computer labs with 126 computers, 6 smart screens, and 24 CCTV cameras established.

A-Adult Education

 Support for parents of schoolchildren through adult education sessions and PTA involvement to review their children's learning progress. • Impact: 750 parents engaged.

C-Child Development

•Support for students' all-round development, including leadership, communication, and problem-solving skills, through extracurricular activities.

•Impact: Over 1,300 children engaged in extracurricular activities.

H: Happy School

Improvement of physical facilities, including computer sets, smart screens, school playground materials, and maintenance of school water and sanitation facilities to enhance the learning environment.

Outcome Achieved so far:

- Increased motivation among teachers to apply child-focused, quality teaching methodologies.
- Better-prepared and more confident teachers equipped with new tools to conduct effective classroom sessions.
- Improved student attendance due to access to a joyful learning environment.
- Enhanced student performance across grades, reflected in improved government ranking reports.
- Progressive improvement in the social and physical learning environment of schools.
