Binod Koirala, a native of Pokhara, Nepal, graduated from Tribhuvan University with master's degrees in science and health education. Binod is a genuine team player because of his approachable demeanor and straightforward personality. He has honed his administrative and leadership abilities to oversee a group in the fields of social development and humanitarianism. He has developed important competencies in communication, interpersonal interactions, leadership, networking, training, and project management thanks to his professional experience in senior and responsible positions in multinational corporations. He has worked in a wide variety of international development fields, including public health, education, disability, income production, the environment, humanity, and other social development challenges. Binod has travelled extensively in many districts of Nepal, which gives him the added advantage of being able to assess and evaluate situations practically and effectively. He is conversant with the government's service delivery systems, working modalities of various (I)NGOs, and practices in local and national contexts.

17. Binod has good passion in Rotary trainings and served as a trainer/facilitator in various district-level trainings for many years. He served as chair of the District Training Team for Region 4 of District 3292 in 2021-22 and co-chair of the District Training Committee in 2022-23. Binod is an active member of the Clean Cooking task force of ESRA. He is a major donor and a Paul Harris Society member.

Binod has represented his Rotary club and the district in many international forums. He initiated and implemented various humanitarian projects, mainly on clean drinking water supply, school sanitation and cleanliness, outreach health camps, and a large educational scholarship program. He has developed a number of GGs/MGs and implemented them successfully. He further extended his skills in project management support to other clubs in the district. Binod attended the District Conference of RID 1040, UK, in 2015-16 and RID 1220, UK, in 2011-12 as a speaker in plenary sessions. These sessions were completely facilitation-based, with just approximately 20 members per group, allowing everyone to talk

and share their thoughts. Language obstacles were obvious, particularly among Japanese participants; however, translations were provided via headsets in mixed-language sessions. He exchanged approximately 100 business cards and formed friendships with Rotarians from all around the globe.

Prior to the RI Assembly, he visited several clubs in New Jersey, New York, and Virginia, where he gave talks on Nepal and the Rotary movement. Furthermore, he had the opportunity to connect

with University of Virginia (UVA) students as well as meet with the university's dean and trustees. That has provided an opportunity to create a connection with the university and acquire their support for research-based projects.

More than 50,000 saplings were planted in one day after the participants took part. This saplings initiative had a district-wide goal. It was completed in a single day. The Rotary Club of Mechinagar, in collaboration with local healthcare professionals from Manamohan Community Hospital Birtamode, organized a student-Doctors Interaction Program at Dhulabari Higher Secondary Community School on the first day of the Rotary year, in 1st July, with chief guest Assistant Governor of Zone 39 Rtn. Binod Chapagai. The event aimed to raise awareness among adolescents about crucial health topics such as mental wellness, nutrition, and menstrual hygiene.



More than 250 students from grades 8 to 10 participated in the interactive session, where a panel of doctors and health experts addressed concerns and misconceptions related to growing up, emotional well-being, balanced diets, and menstrual care.

Need Assessment for Water and Sanitation Project

A comprehensive need assessment for a new water and sanitation project has been successfully concluded across three government schools in Nepal. This project, which falls under a Global Grant, aims to address critical infrastructure gaps through the construction of modern and accessible toilet facilities.

On July 3, 2025, a team from the Rotary Club of The Himalayan Gurkhas conducted an initial assessment at Ghami Basic School, located in Ghami, Mustang. The objective of this visit was to meticulously evaluate the school's requirements for the proposed water and sanitation infrastructure. Extensive discussions were held with key stakeholders, including Mr. Raju Bista, Chairperson of the Lo-Ghekar Damodarkunda Rural Municipality; Mr. Pemba Gurung, Chairperson of the Construction (Users) Subcommittee; and Mr. Pahal Man Thapa, the school's Headmaster. Furthermore, the Rotary team actively engaged with the student body, teaching staff, and members of the local community to gather diverse perspectives.

Subsequently, on July 6, 2025, the team proceeded to Shree Vidhya Nikunja Secondary School in Bayapani, Bhanu-12, Tanahun District. During this assessment meeting, valuable insights were obtained through interactive sessions with students, teachers, and local community representatives. Formal discussions were also conducted with pertinent school officials, specifically Mr. Iman Thapa Magar, Chairperson of the School Management Committee, and Mr. Suresh Sapkota, the Headmaster.

The third school, Amr Jyoti Secondary School in Arjun Chaupari-3, Lamdanda, Syanja district, was assessed by the team last year. The proposed Global Grant for this vital water and sanitation project is being hosted by the Rotary Club of The Himalayan Gurkhas under RI District 3292 Nepal-Bhutan. The designated international partner for this collaborative endeavour is the Rotary Club Angus Glen—District 1010 Scotland.

Maternal and Child Health Program

50 expectant women received a session from gynecologist Rotarian Dr. Priyanka Katwal as part of a collaborative effort between the Rotary Club of Birtamode Mid-Town and the Rotary Club of Birtamode Midtown. Dr. Priyanka Katwal led a session on pregnant women's health, including how to take care of them during pregnancy, and President Pushpanjali Thakuri Sinha led a session on how to take care of the development and well-being of unborn children both during and after pregnancy.

The Service Project Committee organized and carried out the program, and it was expertly handled by committee member Anil Sapkota and chair Ratna Budhathoki. The Ward Chairman, the Rural Municipality Health Officer, the Health Post in-charge, and representatives from Rotaract and Rotary were there to support the program, which was organized by Bahradaishi Rural Municipality.



The entire budget for the program was Rs. 50,000. The majority of the residents of Ward No. 4 of the Bahradaishi Rural Municipality are Muslims living in a somewhat isolated and underdeveloped location. Thus, with the assistance of the Health Post, Rotarian Anil Sapkota, Service Project Chair Ratna Budhathoki, conducted a requirements assessment before selecting the location. With the help of wholesome food, medicines, and information on self-care during and after pregnancy, the project directly helped over fifty expectant mothers. During a one-on-one session following the training, Dr. Priyanka discovered a serious case where a woman needed immediate assistance with her issue.



Stationary Material Distribution Program

A free stall was also provided to the Rotaract Club of Biratnagar Downtown for youth engagement and promotion. Around 3000 visitors participated in the fair.

The tentative cost of organizing the fair was Rs. 500,000, supported through club funds, sponsorships, and community goodwill.



Free General Health Camp

Rotary E-Club of Medico Fusion

The Rotary E-Club of Medico Fusion arranged a free health camp on 12 July 2025. A total of 260 patients were screened for vital parameters (BP, sugar levels, BMI, etc.). Doctors provided consultations for general ailments, chronic diseases, and preventive care. 10 endoscopies were performed for patients with gastrointestinal complaints. Cases of gastritis, ulcers, and infections were identified and referred for further treatment. Talks on hypertension, diabetes, hygiene, and nutrition were conducted. Free medicines and dietary guidelines were distributed.



SkyHydrant Filters Bring Safe Water to Schools

July, 2025

The Rotary Club of Patan South & other Rotary clubs, with generous support from Richard Chan and friends (financial support) and Disaster Aid Malaysia (technical support), have successfully installed and handed over 8 SkyHydrant water filtration systems in schools in Tulsipur, Butwal, Kawasoti, Dhading, Panauti, and Gorkha. Partnering with local Rotary Clubs, including

RC Tulsipur City, RC Butwal Downtown, RC Kawasoti, and RC Panauti, and local government as well as local-based agencies, this initiative has significantly improved Water, Sanitation, and Hygiene (WASH) infrastructure in underserved schools. Each unit installation cost about NRs 450,000, including the cost of the donated SkyHydrant filter.

SkyHydrant filters are a cost-effective and sustainable solution that removes bacteria, viruses, and other contaminants, providing up to 10,000 liters of clean drinking water daily. The systems require no electricity, making them ideal for remote communities. As a result, thousands of students, ranging from 300 to 2700 students in various schools, now have daily access to safe and potable water.

The impact is tangible: improved student health, reduced absenteeism due to waterborne diseases, and heightened awareness of hygiene practices among children and staff. Schools have become safer learning environments, and communities are inspired to prioritize clean water access. This service project exemplifies Rotary's commitment to community health, education, and sustainability, transforming lives and fostering hope through practical, high-impact action.



One-day Career Counselling
