



# RI PRESIDENTIAL STATEMENT



## Dear fellow Rotary leaders,

This month's special issue of Rotary magazine is all about happiness, that most elemental of human yearnings. More than a feeling, though, this state of positive well-being, and the conditions necessary to create and sustain it, should be considered a universal right.

December also marks Rotary's Disease Prevention and Treatment Month, when we highlight our members' work to promote health and wellness, including mental wellness. Globally, nearly 1 in 7 people have a mental health disorder, according to a recent World Health Organization report. Yet only 9 percent of people with depression receive adequate treatment.

We are fortunate in Rotary to have a powerful way to support emotional well-being and happiness: friendship. The connections we build in Rotary can be a powerful force for change. I know this from personal experience.

When my fellow members first proposed that I become club president, I demurred. I had a stutter. I was terrified of speaking. But having club members who supported me and surrounded me with affection enabled me to face my fear, and I found a way to stand confidently before a crowd. Today, I regularly address audiences — some numbering in the thousands — in a language that is not native to me. The Rotary members in my life helped me create lasting change within myself.

That fellowship gives us the courage and means to create lasting change in the world as well, and mental health services are in desperate need of

improvement. The WHO reports that governments on average devote only 2 percent of their health budgets to mental health, and only 11 percent of that funding reaches community-based services. In some countries, only one trained mental health professional is available for every 100,000 people. The WHO has called for strategic and urgent action to close the gap.

Rotary can answer that call by championing mental health awareness in our clubs, working with local health systems, funding training for community health workers, and supporting initiatives that bring care to places where none exists. Even small investments in mental health yield enormous returns in productivity, public health, and happiness.

While we are creating lasting change in the world, we cannot forget to take care of each other. Past RI President Gordon McInally wisely reminds us that we must go beyond asking, "How are you?" We owe it to each other to instead ask, "How are you really?"

As we transition to a new year filled with new possibilities, let us Unite for Good — for healing, friendship, and access to happiness.

## “Life Restored Through Sight: Rotary Club of Hetauda Brought Vision Back to an 82-Year-Old Man”

Eighty-two-year-old Sanukanchha Syangtan of Bhalukharka, Indrasarovar Rural Municipality-2, had been unable to walk independently for nearly two years after cataracts covered both of his eyes. Dependent on his 15-year-old granddaughter for daily movement, he had lived with blurred vision for a long time but could not afford eye examinations, relying solely on a senior citizen allowance.



At the initiative of the Rotary Club of Hetauda, Syangtan attended a free eye camp in Indrasarovar with the support of his granddaughter. The examination confirmed cataracts in both eyes. The following day, with assistance from Rotary volunteers and health workers, he was brought from his home to the surgery camp at Shree Panchakanya Secondary School, Khanikhet.

Using modern technology and the expertise of skilled doctors, the surgery was completed successfully, fully restoring his vision. Overjoyed after the operation, Syangtan said it felt as if life had returned to him. He expressed deep happiness at being able to see clearly again after two years and offered heartfelt gratitude to the doctors, health workers, and Rotary team for giving him the gift of sight.



## Mobile App Users Status






The District Learning Facilitator (DLF) "Train the Trainers" program for Rotary International District 3292 (Nepal and Bhutan) concluded successfully with great enthusiasm at the serene Himalaya Deurali Resort, Pokhara. The two-day seminar brought together aspiring and experienced facilitators with the objective of strengthening training capacity across Rotary clubs in the district.





### Day One Highlights:

The program commenced with a warm welcome by DLF Co-Chair Rtn. Pawan Raman Khanal, setting an inspiring tone for the event. District Governor Rtn. Binod Koirala delivered the opening remarks, emphasizing unity and service under the Rotary theme "Unite for Good." District Governor-Elect Rtn. ## Regional Road Safety Art & Essay Competition (Region 1-3)

The Rotary Regional (Region 1-3) Road Safety Art & Essay Competition, organized by Rotary International District 3292, was successfully held at Himalayan Restro & Events, Hattisar, Kathmandu. The program brought together leaders, advocates, and educators dedicated to promoting road safety and raising awareness about traffic rules. It emphasized the importance of early education in shaping responsible citizens who can prevent accidents and contribute to community well-being.

A highlight of the event was the active participation of school students in both art and essay competitions, which provided a platform to express their understanding of road safety creatively. Through drawing, painting, and writing, students internalized key safety messages while learning to communicate them effectively to peers, families, and the wider community. Such initiatives cultivate a generation that is both aware and proactive in preventing road accidents, combining education with creative expression to promote behavioral change and social engagement.

Speakers, including Service Project Chair Dr. Nirmal Rijal, Guest of Honor Muhammad Irfan Saeed Alrai, Chief WASH, UNICEF Nepal, and Chief Guest SSP Navraj Adhikari, Valley Traffic Police Chief, delivered inspiring messages on the importance of road safety and youth engagement. They highlighted how





creative platforms like art and essay competitions raise awareness, shape responsible behavior, and encourage students to become advocates for safer roads. The speakers also emphasized the significance of collaboration between communities, organizations, and authorities in reducing accidents and appreciated the participants for using their creativity to promote public safety.

In the Art Competition, Richelle Alden Shrestha (Little Angel School, RC Kasthamandap) won first place, followed by Itr. Swornima Rachel (Mount Valley School, RC Bhaktapur) in second, and Itr. Sharmila Shahi (Mount Valley School, RC Bhaktapur) in third. Finalists included Deepjale Rimal (Prithvi Narayan Secondary School, RC Patan West) and Simran Khadka (Mangal Secondary School, RC Kathmandu Mid Town).

The Essay Competition, Anuska Bajracharya (Khwopa Secondary School, RC Bhaktapur) secured first place, followed by Ankita Shrestha (Khwopa Secondary School, RC Bhaktapur) in second, and Riddhima Bhujel (Uniglobe Secondary School, IAC Kathmandu) in third. Finalists included Rohit Shrestha (Annapurna Secondary School, RC Thamel) and Srivali Adhikari (Rupy's International School, RC Kathmandu Mid Town).

Overall, the event successfully merged creativity, awareness, and advocacy, fostering a strong culture of road safety consciousness among young participants and inspiring them to actively promote safer communities.





## RC Patan Durbar Advances to Finals in Region 3 Rota Quiz Contest

The Rota Quiz Sub-Committee of Region 3 successfully conducted the Regional Round of the Rota Quiz on December 26, 2025, at Saba Cliff Restro, Lagankhel. Manish Ghiraiya, with judging by Advisor Rtn. Lalita Thapa. Rotaractor Sandip Dangol handled scoring, while Rotaractor Najju Awale oversaw timekeeping.



RC Patan Durbar Square emerged as the winner with 195 points, followed by RC Yala with 100 and RC Patan East with 50, securing their place in the finals. 

## Community Public Toilet Project at Dharmasthali Balaju Police Post

During the Gen-Z Movement on 8-9 September, the Dharmasthali Police Station faced significant disturbances, leading to severe damage to the Balaju Police Post. As a result, the post was temporarily relocated to the Dharmasthali Police Station premises. With nearly 200 police personnel stationed there and only a single pit toilet available, the situation created serious sanitation and hygiene challenges.

Recognizing the urgent need, 13 Rotary Clubs jointly initiated the construction of a community public toilet at the Dharmasthali Balaju Police post. The project site, located in Ward No. 6 of Tarkeshwor Municipality, Kathmandu, is a semi-urban area near Padmasal Chowk that continues to struggle with limited sanitation facilities, especially in government institutions. Rapid population growth, overcrowding, and vulnerability during civil unrest further highlighted the necessity for a durable, community-focused solution.

The presidents led the initiative with participation from the 13 clubs. On the occasion of World Toilet Day, the newly constructed toilet facility at Dharmasthali Police Station was formally handed over in coordination with the district 3292 Basic Education & Literacy Committee. The infrastructure now serves 190 police personnel, ensuring improved hygiene, dignity, and a healthier working environment. The project, completed at a total cost of NPR 722,898, demonstrated the collective commitment of all participating Rotary Clubs to enhancing public sanitation and supporting frontline personnel.



## International Menstrual Dignity Day and Reusable Pad - Making Training Program

## Preventative Health Camp

## Cataract Surgery of 131 Peoples Completed in Two Phases

A free eye screening and cataract surgery program was successfully completed in two phases under the leadership of the Rotary Club of Hetauda, restoring vision to 59 patients and benefiting hundreds in the local community. In the first phase, launched on November 21, 2025, a total of 720 people received free eye screenings in Chitwan, Sarlahi, and Manahari, resulting in 72 cataract surgeries.

The second phase was conducted from December 3 to 7, 2025, as a joint initiative of 15 Rotary clubs of District 3292 (**RC Hetauda, RC Bagmati Kathmandu, RC Balaju, RC Gongabu, RC Kathmandu, RC Kathmandu Circle, RC Kathmandu Downtown, RC Kathmandu Height, RC Kathmandu Metro, RC Madhyapur, RC Matribhumi Baluwater, RC Patan, RC Rajdhani, RC Yala, and RC Tinkune Kathmandu**), in collaboration with Community Eye Hospital Hetauda and Indrasarovar Rural Municipality. During this phase, 350 individuals were screened at five locations in the Indrasarovar area, with 67 diagnosed with cataracts, including three patients suffering from bilateral vision loss.

Free cataract surgeries were performed on 59 patients on December 6 at Khanikhet Health Post, Kulekhani-3, by a medical team led by ophthalmologist Dr. Sunil Thakali. All patients were re-evaluated on December 7 during an "Eye



Opening Day." The project, implemented with a total budget of NPR 421,325, significantly restored sight, mobility, and quality of life, reaffirming Rotary's belief that there is no greater charity than the gift of vision.

The total project cost was NPR 1,155,000. The initiative improved access to clean cooking technology, reduced dependence on firewood, minimized exposure to smoke and dust, and saved time for women traditionally responsible for collecting firewood, thereby contributing to better health, environmental protection, and household efficiency.




## Graphic Design Workshop and Contest

## Disability Camp with Surgery – GG2350574

The Rotary Club of Dhulikhel, in partnership with international Rotary clubs, districts, TRIFC.org, and The Rotary Foundation, successfully conducted a comprehensive disability screening camp under Global Grant GG2350574 across Taplejung, Panchthar, and Dolakha districts. The camp focused on identifying orthopedic, neurological, and physical disabilities in underserved communities where access to medical care remained limited due to geography and poverty. A total of 203 cases were identified, with 42 patients referred to HRDC for admission, corrective surgery, and specialized treatment.

The initiative addressed long-neglected disabilities by bringing medical expertise directly to remote communities. Early identification and referral restored mobility and hope, enabling children to return to school, adults to regain livelihoods, and families to live with dignity. The project demonstrated a sustainable model of inclusion, rehabilitation, and improved quality of life for marginalized populations.



RC Dublin North and RC Dublin Fingal, the project received technical support from Water Center Twenty-One Pahal.



The one-year initiative, with a total budget of USD 40,824, trained 23 teachers in effective teaching methods, critical thinking, and STEM education, and established a computer lab with solar backup and high-speed internet. Benefiting around 400 students and 23 teachers, the project supports a blended learning system using digital technologies. The handover ceremony was attended by Rotarians, school officials, teachers, and students, reflecting Rotary's commitment to quality education, innovation, and sustainable community development.
